### Led to be Ambassadors of Mercy and Peace.



Today is the second Sunday of Easter also called the Divine Mercy Sunday. On this day the Holy Mother Church invites all of us her sons and daughters, to meditate very deeply on the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, which is summarily described as the Divine Mercy of the Sinful Humanity. This is because we, the children of God abused the privilege God bestowed on us as His children through our sinful disobedience and rejection of Him. However, rather than receiving eternal condemnation, we received mercy, forgiveness and

restoration through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. He says to us everyday "I did not come to condemn the world but to save it so that you may have life." I came that they may have life and have it more abundantly (John 10:10). The mercy of God can never be fathomed by an intellect, human or angelic. It is immeasurable. It is for this reason the Psalmist today re-echos the same song of Thanksgiving of Easter: Give thanks to the Lord for He is good, for His love is everlasting. Let those who fear the Lord, the Lord says His mercy endures forever. Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ has therefore inaugurated the new Life of Glory that we have a share through our baptism. This new life of glory is characterized by a life of communion, mercy, love, unity and peace.

### The resurrection and the gift of the Holy Spirit and peace.

The Gospel pericope today narrates the first post resurrection appearance of our Lord Jesus Christ to the Apostles, where they locked themselves up in the upper room for fear of the Jews. Living in utter disappointment and fear as a result of the seemingly unfortunate death of Jesus Christ in whom they had hoped to restore the political fortunes of Israel and positions of authority for them. Recall that they showed this sense of disappointment and hopelessness during the trial, passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. When they deserted Him, Peter denied Him and they stood at a safe distance watching the sad events of good Friday, with the exception of John who stood at the foot of the cross with our Blessed Mother Mary. As He appeared to them on the evening of the great day of Resurrection, he gave them the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Peace. The Spirit renews His relationship with them and the Father in anticipation for their mission. His gift of peace was a visible show of his forgiveness for his friends who abandoned Him when he needed their companionship, solidarity and encouragement. The gift of peace was a sign of reconciliation with them, the restoration of His union with them and to deepen His relationship with them. Here, our Lord Jesus Christ did not question them about their denial and desertion. He did not take offense at them for their lack of faith, rather, He gave them the gifts of the Holy Spirit, peace and reconciliation. Not only were they forgiven, they are to be ambassadors of peace and reconciliation and to announce merciful forgiveness to the whole world. On this day one of the Apostles, Thomas, was absent and when he came back they told him about the joyful experience with the Risen Lord, but he doubted. Once again, our Lord Jesus Christ showed His patient tolerance for the faithlessness of the Apostles and eight days later, He reappeared to them in the company of Thomas. Here, Thomas saw and believed and made a great confession of recognizing Christ as both Lord and God, human and divine.

### The resurrection and the New Life of the Church:

The resurrection and the Pentecost inaugurated the new life of the church, the Body of Christ Jesus, the Eucharistic family and the Easter people. The first reading presents to us the authentic and true life of the early church that truly understood the new life that has been established by the resurrection: A life of communion, charity, mercy and love. The gifts of mercy, peace and love they received of one mind and heart, a community of unity and love. To this the Psalmist says: Behold how good and pleasant it is when brothers and sisters live in unity (Psalm 133:1) St. John in the second reading speaks about the life of love of the children of God. Brothers and sisters, on this Divine Mercy Sunday and in the spirit of Easter, we are all reminded of the new life in Christ Jesus, the life we have all been called to live as the Easter people. Through the waters of baptism, we have been immersed in the ocean of Divine Mercy. We are therefore called to be instruments and ambassadors of God's love, mercy and reconciliation in our world that is broken, divided, ridden with conflict, discrimination, hatred, tension and confusion. As the Easter people, this mission of peace, mercy and reconciliation must start from our families, communities, places of work and in the church in order to deepen our relationship with God and one another so that the world may truly testify that we are indeed brothers and sisters of the Risen Lord.

### Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

Check list time! We are listening to the wonderful hymn during the Preparation of the gifts. Now we need to figure out what all goes into said preparation (*What are the gifts???*). First thing's first (I suppose that saying does make sense...):

1. First, the ministers (who are the Altar Servers, or Mr. Deacon, or Fr. Priest...just depends on who there is!) place the *corporal* on the altar. What is the corporal you ask? Dictionary Time! (yay...my favorite).

### cor·po·ral

/ˈkôrp(ə)rəl/ Relating to the human body.

- As in, Christ's Body. So, this square piece of white cloth is used to contain any fragments that may go astray during the Communion Rite—which are then folded into the corporal so that they aren't lost. (We treat any fragment of Christ's Body with as much respect as we would if He were standing in front of us with His whole Body!)
  - 2. Next we have the <u>purificator</u>. One purificator, two purificator, three purificator, four...one for every chalice used in a Mass! Just like it sounds, the purificator is used to...well...purify. To make clean, as it were. Basically, the Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers use these white cloths to wipe clean the chalices after each person receives Christ's Blood. And Fr. Priest uses them after he receives the Blood and after full distribution. They purify the Chalices, and also the ciborium (the pretty bowls that hold the Body of Christ).

#### 3. Ummm...

OK wellIll, it seems we are running a little low on space (or possibly time), so we'll come back to the REST (are you sure?) of the preparation next week. See you then! SM

### Updated Information of Coronavirus at IHM

Have you heard of St. Maria Faustina Kowalska? Sister Faustina was born on August 25,1905 in Glogowiec, Poland of a

poor, religious family of peasants, the third of 10 children. From a very young age she showed love of prayer, obedience and compassion to the poor. At the age of seven she had already felt the desire of a religious vocation. At age nine she received her first Holy Communion, and she experienced then her awareness of the presence of the Divine Guest within her soul. She attended school only 3 years after which she wanted to enter a Convent, her parents would not give her permission. At the age of 16 she left home to work as a housekeeper in order to find the means of supporting herself and her parents. After being called during a vision of the Suffering Christ, she entered the Sister of our Lady of Mercy on August 1, 1925. She performed her tasks and faithfully observed the rule of religious life. The Lord Jesus chose Sr. Maria Faustina as the Apostle and "Secretary" of His Mercy, so she could tell the world about His great message, which Sr. Faustina recorded in a diary she titled "Divine Mercy in My Soul". In an extraordinary way Sr. Faustina;s work sheds light on the mystery of the Divine Mercy. It delights everyone from the uneducated people to scholars who look upon it as a source of theological research. Her diary has been translated into more than 20 languages. Sister Faustina endured tuberculosis and innumerable sufferings and past away on Oct. 5,1938 at the age of 33. The reputation of her holy life grew as did the cult to the Divine Mercy. She was canonized on April 30, 2000.

of Your


