

THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: JESUS CHRIST, THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Today, within the context of Easter Joy this fourth Sunday, we recall that Jesus is the model shepherd of all humanity. The life, sufferings, death and resurrection reveal him as the GOOD SHEPHERD. Jesus said of Himself, "I am the good shepherd" (Jn. 10:11-18) Christ's acts of the good shepherd can be found in ministry: he went about doing good, He healed the sick. He forgave sinners and restored them to life. He liberated the possessed.

He gave sight to the blind and voice to the mute. He restored the dying and raised the dead. Lastly, He died for us. His leadership was based on love, mercy, giving & forgiving. Contrary to the world's leadership, which is motivated by and built on greed, selfishness, personal gains, extortion. In divergence to the leaders of the world, Lord Jesus came to serve and to give His life as a ransom (Mark 10:45). Lord Jesus chose the imagery of the Good Shepherd because it resonates His mission and ministry to His flock; like a good shepherd, He leads them to life. He, provides, feeds, protects, cares, guides, guards, supports and watches over them. He was ready and at last laid His life for us His unworthy flock. The Psalmist (23) succinctly voiced the security, which the flock enjoys in the hand of the good shepherd: THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD, THERE IS NOTHING I SHALL WANT. HE LEADS ME TO GREEN PASTURES AND EVEN THOUGH I WALK THROUGH DARK VALLEYS, HE IS THERE TO PROTECT ME WITH HIS STAFF.... Lord Jesus continues to shepherd His flock even when they stray, wander away, act foolishly and disobediently. He goes in search of them at all cost to bring them back to the fold. This He does through His Word and sacraments. Especially the sacrament of reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist. The GOOD SHEPHERD even today, continues to exercise this loving, caring and compassionate service to His flock through His Church who acts only in His name for there is no salvation through anyone else but Christ Jesus the Lord. Hence, today His Church sings out: GIVE THANKS TO THE LORD, FOR HE IS GOOD, FOR HIS MERCIES ENDURE FOREVER... This sacrificial shepherding of the Risen Lord is still alive and active in our Church today.

WE ARE THE SHEEP OF HIS FLOCK

There is a binding code between the shepherd and the flock namely; that the shepherd leads with his life placed between the flock and danger and that the FLOCK LISTENS and FOLLOWS him without questioning. The Lord himself said: "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me". (Jn. 10:27) Celebrating the gift of the GOOD SHEPHERD, we call to mind our responsibilities as the flocks of the Lord. Do we listen to His voice? As it is in the desert, there were many shepherds calling on their sheep. Today, there are also many enticing voices competing for our souls. Are we able to decipher the voice of our Lord Jesus from commercial, political and self-centered voices of this world? Secondly, each sheep is responsible for the flock just as the whole flock

is responsible for the safety of each sheep. Beloved brothers and sisters, there are many false, fake shepherds today, with different voices parading themselves to be HE. Let us therefore ask the Holy Spirit to guide and direct us to the GOOD SHEPHERD. May we listen to Him and learn how to care for one another so that through His protective care, we the flock may reach where the brave Shepherd has gone before; through the same Christ our Lord. Global Pandemic!

Alrighty everyone! Bring your eyes forward to the altar! Next up you will see...

3. The <u>Pall</u>...well...sometimes. Dictionary:

A **pall** is a cloth that covers a casket or coffin at funerals.

So, basically...a pall covers a body. Or in this case *the* Body! We place it over the chalice to protect it. Like I said though... "sometimes"...we don't always use the pall, usually only on special occasions—often we simply use a purificator (you know what that is!), in place of a specially decorated pall.

4. This is interesting, but the <u>Roman Missal</u> also goes on the Altar at this time.

Now, what is the Roman Missal? I've been talking about it a lot I think, and I don't think I've actually told you what it is! Shame on me! The USCCB says (wait! The what now??) oops! Sorry! The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB...better?) says pretty succinctly what the Roman Missal is. Check it:

The Roman Missal is the book containing the prescribed prayers, chants, and instructions for the celebration of Mass in the Roman Catholic Church.

Or, to put it even easier, it's the book that tells Priests what to say in Mass. It's got the *entire* Mass in it for the *entire* year! And there are different prayers for every single day... so that's kind of a big deal. Here's a little "behind the scenes" of your weekly tour: The first thing I always look at is the Roman Missal, because then I don't have to do everything from memory...even our priests can't do it ALL from memory.

OK so did we get through the entire preparation yet? Uh... no...not even close. Let's try again next week. And to find out a little more about the Roman Missal, go this way à https://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/the-mass/general -instruction-of-the-roman-missal/roman-missal.

Updated Information of Coronavirus at IHM
