

7th Week of Easter Yr. B

CALLED TO BEAR WITNESS IN A TROUBLED WORLD

As the season of Easter is gradually coming to an end after the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord, the readings of today redirect us to the call of witnessing and continuing the work of evangelization (Matt.28:18-20). Evangelization is all about bearing witness to the love of God made visible in the life, ministry, death and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, and sharing this love with others. The Gospel pericope of today is the concluding part of the farewell speech of our Lord Jesus Christ to His disciples in the Upper Room on the night that preceded His death (Jn. 13-17). After explaining to His disciples of their own mission, i.e. to bear witness and make disciples of their own (us) who will in turn continue the witnessing. The Lord explained to them that for their ministry to be fruitful, they must abide in Him and remain in communion with Him and one another because he is the Vine and they are the branches (Jn. 15). Again, they were reminded of the challenges associated with their mission of bearing witness to the Gospel. They would face persecution, rejection, hatred to the point of even losing their lives. This is because their mission would be contradicting the world's vies. They, though in the world but not of the world. It was in full realization of magnitude and difficulty of this mission that the Lord Jesus on that fateful night commended them into the loving and protective hands of His Eternal Father to keep them one and united on this mission. Discipleship will be possible and productive if we love God and recognize His image in others. The first reading from the Acts of the Apostles presents to us the account of the election of Matthias to fill the vacant apostolic seat abandoned by Judas. The replacement of Judas was important to the apostolic mission of bearing witness to the love of God in the world which places emphasis on the urgency and importance of the great mandate of making the love of God known to all the ends of the earth.

Beloved friends, just like the apostles we are all called to the same ministry by our Lord Jesus to witness to God's love and mercy. We are also called to continue the sacred ministry of sharing God's love with one another and so fulfill our Baptismal vows. We all have a share in this sacred apostolic mission. We are to witness to the postmodern world; a world marked by insatiable greed and inordinate ambitions. A world of injustice and fear. A world divided by dissention and discord build around a new form of economic and political enslavement. truth, justice and love have been averted. This world is anti-God and the things of God. All these are challenges to the faith and to the sacred ministry of witnessing. The Lord Jesus foresaw this danger, hence, He prayed for His disciples and their successors, all of us, His Church so that we would not be deterred by the hatred of the world. The more the world hates us, the more urgent and compelling this sacred mission becomes.

People of God, as we prepare to celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit (Pentecost) next Sunday, let us pray for the renewal of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the life-wire and soul of the Church and her mission of evangelization. May we remain faithful to Our Lord and the mission He entrusted to us. This will enable us to abide in God's love and share His love with one another despite the difficulties and challenges of this mission.

So we pray: COME O HOLY SPIRIT AND FILL THE HEARTS OF THE FAITHFUL AND ENKINDLE IN US THE FIRE OF YOUR LOVE.

Father, may all who serve in your Church, especially Pope Francis and Bishop Berg, be animated in faith and charity in the mission of Christ so that His church may rise every day to where our nature is united with His.

Father you glorified your Son through his Resurrection and ascension into Heaven, raise our world from fear and division so that in common we may worship you with joyful hearts.

As our parish community grows in faith, hope and love in anticipation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, may all in need find us supportive and testifying on our behalf when we see you face to face.

Father May the gifts of your spirit descend richly upon us so that the weak and the sick may be healed and so witness to God's glory.

May the ascending Lord take with him all the departed faithful, so that the good shepherd may always be accompanied by the faithful flock.



Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

Use this same format for the "Blessed are you" over the wine. CALL BACK!

At this point, some parishes will continue the preparatory hymn during this prayer, and some will conclude the hymn *before* the prayer. It all depends on the priest, parish, musicians, and traditions of each. However it's done, the prayer remains the same. Fr. Priest takes the paten with the bread and says:

"Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, For through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you:

> Fruit of the earth and work of human hands, It will become for us the bread of life."

Welp, there are a lot of details in that. Let's talk.

First, we praise God (blessed are you).

Second, we talk about Who and What God is (Lord of everything [creation]).

Third, we say what He has given us (we have received the bread...and then we offer it back.

Fourth, we describe said bread physically (fruit of the earth...[wait what?...Oh! WHEAT from the earth!] and work of human hands [from God, of God, but through humans).

Fifth, we describe that same bread as food (it will [in the near future] become the Bread of Life [like we have to eat it to live?]). I refer you to the Bible. "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man...you have no life in you." (John 6:53). Hmmm...we have to have the Bread of Life to live. Otherwise we have no life? That seems like a huge deal—I think we'll have to talk more about that later in the Mass. All in due time!

ANYWAY, at this point, Fr. Priest lays the paten with the bread back onto the corporal. The congregation continues to praise, "Blessed be God for ever!" and we move into the next prayer next week! SM Minister Schedule for May 22/23, 2021


