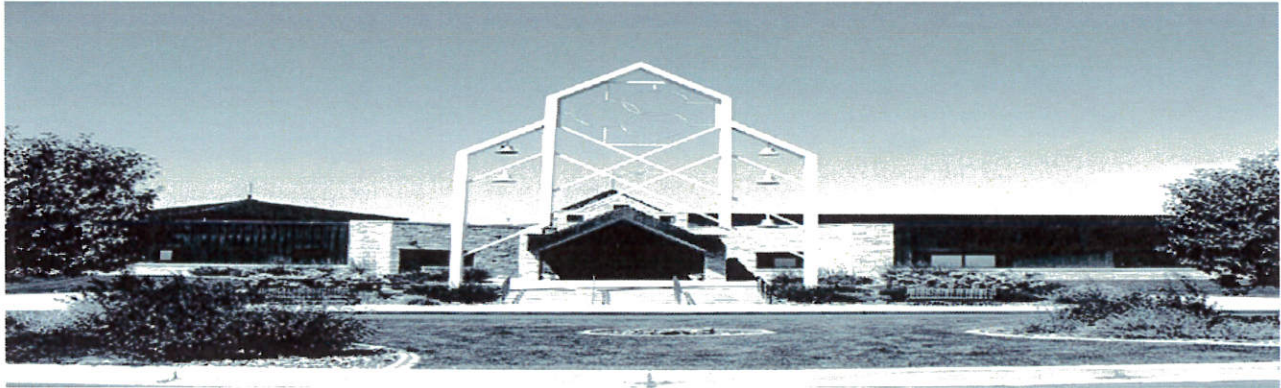

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

(Eze: 2:2-5; 2Cor:12:7-10; Mk: 6:1-6)

"REJECTION OF PROPHETS OF GOD"

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

Today's first reading gives us the message that the Lord God is sending prophets to the people of Israel who rebelled against Him. The Lord God specifically gave this mission to Ezekiel to speak to the people in the name of the Lord God whether they listen to him or not. The Prophet had to face rejection and scorn from the chosen people of God.

In the second reading, St. Paul admits that he too has weaknesses in spite of receiving many revelations and blessings from God. However, Paul is not discouraged or disillusioned because the Lord assured him that "My grace is sufficient for you." This message of assurance is for all of us who are troubled by our weaknesses and problems that disturb us and hurt us. Paul assures us that when we trust in the grace of God, our weaknesses become source of strength because we are no more trusting in ourselves but in God's grace.

"Rejection of Jesus at Nazareth"

In today's Gospel, Jesus had been preaching, teaching and healing in Judea, Sumeria and many other towns and villages of Galilee. Finally he came to Nazareth where he was brought up. Although he had a great reputation as a prophet all over Palestine, His own people failed to recognize Him and acclaim Him. Instead of admiration He faced scorn. Their attitude was, after all He is a carpenter's son. We know his family background. They could not just accept the fact that God is in their midst and communicates with them through Jesus the carpenter's son.

Jesus was totally disappointed by their scornful attitude. Hence he said, "No prophet is acceptable in his own country, in his own relations and in his own house." There are several occasions we have rejected God's chosen messengers. It may also happen that we may have faced rejection from our own family or community. Jesus has shown us the way. He did not stop His ministry because the people of Nazareth rejected Him. He did not blame others or God for His failures and lack of acceptance. Nazareth was certainly a learning experience for Jesus.

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

This week we get to talk about prayers that change every week! There's this really cool part of our ever-present Roman Missal—the fact that it can be consistent throughout the ages and uniformed throughout the world and *still* change every week! God's Church is awesome in its irony. Anyway... our guidebook begins with the "First Sunday of Advent" (Fun Fact! Our year begins with Advent, not New Years), continues through Christmas, Lent, Easter, and then...Ordinary Time! Basically, there are 52 (plus) weeks' of prayers that are specific to each day on the liturgical calendar. Whoa, that sounds like a lot. It's even more when you realize it also covers a ton of the weekdays! But it's important because the Church makes sure we cover all the relevant topics we should be bringing to God on a regular basis (you know...like...all the topics).

There are a several prayer elements in this section of our guidebook which are present throughout the entire mass (is it checklist time??? I LOVE CHECKLISTS):

The Entrance Antiphon (This piece tells us what all of our music that day should be based upon). ✓

The Collect (We talked about this one a few months ago, way back in part 12...perspective? Today we have part 48!). ✓

Prayer Over the Offerings (What's that? Ummmm...yeah we don't know yet...just hold on)

Communion Antiphon (just like the entrance antiphon, this one tells us what our music should be representing). ✓

Prayer After Communion (...well...that's pretty self-explanatory. We'll go into more detail on this one later). ✓

That's the end of our checklist (how sad...). And because checklists take up so much space, we have to wait until next month...I mean week...to go into detail on point number 3, the Prayer over the Offerings, so that we can get it checked off the list as well. Listen carefully to the prayer over the offerings this week, because next week it will be totally different.

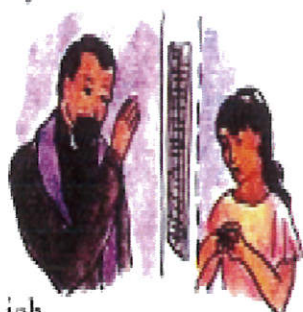
Priests

Do you know the priest at your church? He takes the place of Jesus at every Mass and when you go to Confession. God gave him a very special job.



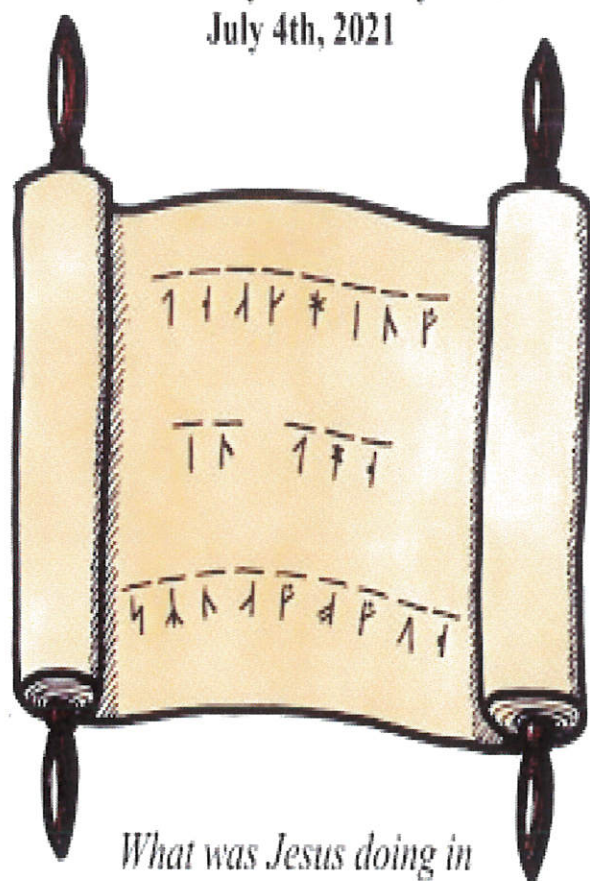
However, even though priests have a very special job, they are still people like you. They need lots of help from God to do their job well. We should pray for our priests every day!


