



SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

(2Kings:4:42-44; Eph: 4:1-6; Jn: 6:1-15)
"JESUS FEEDS THE FIVE THOUSAND"

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

Today's first reading tells us that Prophet Elisha asked his servant to feed 100 men with 20 barley loaves. The servant was reluctant and doubtful of feeding them. But then Elisha insisted that the Lord God had assured him that even after feeding all of them, there would be food left over. And so, it happened as the Prophet told. The Hand of God was instrumental in this miracle.

In the second reading, St. Paul pleads with the Ephesian community to lead a life worthy of their call. They have to remain in unity and peace. Paul explains to them that they are called to be part of one body (of Christ) and sharing in one Spirit (Holy Spirit) and one God (the Father of all) who is the ultimate source of everything. This Trinitarian unity of purpose should be seen in the life of every Christian.

"Jesus took the Loaves gave thanks and distributed them"

Today's Gospel focuses our attention on the day Jesus worked a great miracle by feeding five thousand people with five loaves and two fish. That day a large crowd followed Jesus and listened to His life-giving words to the extent that they forgot their own hunger. Jesus was concerned about them and when He asked the disciples to find food for them, Philip told Jesus that it would require a large sum of money to feed them even if food could be bought. Jesus was not discouraged by this reply. He immediately made use of the available resources: five loaves and two fish which a little boy had brought along. He instructed the disciples to make the crowd sit on the grass. Then He gave thanks to God the Father and blessed the food then gave it to the disciples to distribute it to the hungry people. To everyone's amazement all of them ate their fill - more than 5000 of them. Later on they even collected twelve baskets full of left over pieces.

This miracle is a pre-figuration of the Eucharistic meal - the heavenly banquet where Jesus feeds not just 5000 people but everyone who believes in Him.

The miracle of multiplication of loaves is possible even today.

- 1. When we are ready to share the little we have with others.
- 2. When we humbly realize our limitations and ask God's grace and blessings.

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

Last week I told y'all a smidge about the Eucharistic prayer, namely the first element thereof: Thanksgiving. Today I want to give you a heads up on ALL elements of the Eucharistic prayer. That way, as we continue through this totally cool, awesome, important, center and summit of our celebration, you will already know all the main points that we'll cover. Remember, the Church has a habit of complicating things... but it's always for a reason! And it always connects back to itself! To be fair, humans totally can't be that complicated without making a mess or a contradiction somewhere, so if we can have 365/6 days of Masses that all change but stay the same...God must be doing something. Moving On!

Bullet points! Element number

- 1. Thanksgiving. Even more than the prayer that we talked about last week, the Preface expresses mucho gratitude. We'll get into more detail later.
- Acclamation. Odd description, but basically we are cheering and singing (acclaiming!) the glory of God with all the heavenly powers.
- 3. Epiclesis. Well that's a million dollar word. Dictionary:

ep·i·cle·sis

variants: or epiklesis \ epə'klēsəs \

plural epicleses or epikleses\ -ē sēz \

A liturgical invocation of the Holy Spirit for the purpose of consecrating the Eucharistic elements Wow...that's...really big. I can't even begin to cover that in one bullet point. I'm not even going to try, let's keep going.

4.Institution narrative and consecration. This is as big as the last one, and they go very hand-in-hand. This is where the Sacrifice is carried out, THIS IS WHERE IT HAPPENS. The bread and wine become the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ. Again, way too much to cover in a bullet.

And...unfortunately, even my bullet points of the Eucharistic Prayer take up too much space to cover in one bus ride. So, we'll finish up these next week, and then we'll delve into the preface. See y'all then! SM

Knights of Columbus Breakfast third Sunday


It's a great place to meet new friends and have a great breakfast before returning home. Children under 7 eat free!
