



THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF BLESSED MARY

(Rev: 11:19, 12:1-6, 10; I Cori: 15:20-26. Lk: 1:39-56)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

Today the Holy Mother Church celebrates the Feast of the Assumption of our Blessed Virgin Mary. Most cultures, even today, are elusive with regard to women. In Greek mythology, woman was 'Penia', or 'Want'. Man was 'Poros', or 'Fulness' and 'Wealth'. Plato and Aristotle never included woman into their scheme of human society. Woman lacked volition and intelligence. They were certainly not capable of achieving any equilibrium and good.

Indian society has had some shining examples of women all through its history right down to our present days. But in daily life and in the average family, women are kept as handmaids of their husbands. The practice of 'Sati', illegal though it is, was based on the idea that a woman formed part of her husband's self. She had no right to exist apart from her husband. Why, the number of female feticides performed even today in India is shocking!

Even Hebrew society, though it had some very astounding women on the national scene, never actually treated women with the respect that is their due. Today's readings speak of great signs and symbols that fill the sky, our horizon. Signs and symbols are truths about an unseen reality. Something is being thrown together before our eyes, but unfortunately, because of our defective vision, we only see it dimly and in part.

There are many things that strike me in these readings.

- First and foremost is the fact that God works through woman for the good of human kind and His universe. In God's eyes, woman is no less a partner of His than man. Does this not really puncture our male ego of its sense of greatness and importance?
- A second fact is that woman is equally important to man in the fulfillment of Creation, Redemption and Sanctification. All the readings are about women and God's creative, redemptive and salvific action through them.
- A third fact is that woman is pregnant and laboring. She is crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Even today, the vast majority of them are pregnant and laboring, crying aloud in the pangs and hope of human dignity.
- A fourth fact is that although she is considered lowly in our society, God exalts her. God does great and wondrous things through woman.
- A fifth fact is that in God's eyes, man and woman are not competitors. In God's eyes, both Man and Woman are His partners. Consequently, man and woman are also partners of each other.
- The gospel is all about Christ and what he did and taught? The gospel is about Christ in the same way that the story of the Fall is about Adam. "For as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:22). That is why we call Christ the new Adam. Jesus is the new Adam, who then is the new Eve? Mary is the new Eve. Just as the full story of our Fall cannot be told without Eve, so also the full story of our Redemption cannot be told without Mary. There are many revealing parallels between the old Adam and Eve on the one hand and the new Adam and Eve, Jesus and Mary, on the other. Here are some of them.
- In the old order, the woman (Eve) came from the body of the man (Adam), but in the new order the man (Jesus) comes from the body of the woman (Mary).
- In the old order, the woman (Eve) first disobeyed God and led the man (Adam) to do the same, in the new order the woman (Mary) first said "Yes" to God (Luke 1:38) and raised her son Jesus to do likewise.
- Adam and Eve had a good time together disobeying God, Jesus and Mary suffered together doing God's will. The sword of sorrow pierced their hearts equally (John 19:34; Luke 2:35b).
- In the old order Adam and Eve shared immediately in the resulting consequences and punishments of the Fall. In the new order, similarly, both Jesus and Mary share immediately in the resulting consequences and blessings of the Redemption, the fullness of life with God; Jesus through the Ascension and Mary through the Assumption.

The doctrine of the Assumption teaches that at the end of her earthly existence, the Blessed Virgin Mary was taken up (assumed), body and soul, into heaven. That means then there are two human bodies we know to be in heaven with God at this time: the human body of Jesus and that of Mary.

The Assumption is the ultimate proof of the equality of man and woman before God. This is the full story, the full gospel that we are all equally children of God, man and woman, young and old, rich and poor, Black and White, Jew and Gentile, etc.

Marian doctrine and devotion, properly understood and practiced, does not lead believers away from, but rather more deeply into, the mystery of Christ. The woman in prayer who thinks that Jesus should keep still because she is talking with his mother has lost sight of the perfect harmony of wills and hearts between Mary and Jesus which we see most clearly in the Wedding Feast at Cana where Mary commands us:

"Do whatever he (Jesus) tells you" (John 2:5).

The greatest challenge of the Feast of the Assumption is this: woman has her task and fruit to bear forth in human society. She has her future that is as heavenly as that of every man. We the Christians, at least, realize and foster the dignity of woman as God is showing us through these great signs and symbols.

Today, we get to find out why and how. Read on, fellow travelers! The Preface is another interesting piece of Mass, because it is ever-changing yet ever-the-same in its purpose. (Say what?). During this prayer, Fr. Priest speaks on behalf of all of us (living, dead, all holy people, etc.) to glorify God the Father. Specifically giving thanks for that whole salvation thing. (that's the ever-the-same purpose part). When it comes to the ever-changing part, the specifics can change depending on the season (church season, not weather). There are a ton of different Prefaces that our ever-present guide book (Roman Missal) includes. It's not quite a new one every week, but we have: eight different Ordinary Time versions, two Advent, three Christmas, four Lent, five Easter...and many more written for various occasions such as: Ascension, Funerals, Mary, the Saints, the dead and Holy Week. And no, that was not and comprehensive list! Pay attention in Mass, listen to the preface this week (and next week, and the week after, and the week after, and...) because it is constantly shifting, and you don't want to miss

something important. And remember...everything is important in the Mass! SM




