



THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

(Deut: 6: 2-6; Heb: 7:23-28; Mk: 12:28-34)
"THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT OF GOD"

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through the Homily. Today's first reading, Moses asks the people of Israel to love the Lord their God and to obey His commandments. He tells them that God wants their wholehearted obedience of His commandments and not mere lips service. If they do, he promised them, God will bless them abundantly and will give them a land flowing with milk and honey.

The second reading explains to us that Jesus is the perfect High priest holy and blameless, who offered himself once and for all for sinners and continues to intercede for them. It was not necessary for Him to offer sacrifices daily like other high priests who are appointed by law and are weak in nature.

"Love of God and love of neighbour"

Today's Gospel, St. Mark puts in front of us a very important question, the question is put to Jesus by a scribe. The question was "which is the greatest commandment?" The answer to the question could be innumerable. In His answer Jesus gave not one commandment but two. He told him first of all 'love your God with all your heart, with your entire mind and with all your soul'- which is a quote from the book of Deuteronomy. Then Jesus added a verse from the book of Leviticus' and you shall love your neighbour as yourself'.

Jesus' simple statements embraced everything we need to do to serve God. Every action of our lives is included in these two laws and demands a radical change in our lives. When we love other people we are loving people in the image and likeness of God. We cannot love God and hate others.

First of all the love of God demands a wholehearted commitment from us. It does not begin and end with Sunday services but rather, God becomes the centre and source of our very being.

Secondly love of neighbour means good will, which is boundless and extended to those who may have no personal likeness for us and may not belong to our family, clan or nationality. The perfect example of the love of neighbour is narrated in the parable of the Good Samaritan. Hence for Jesus, love of neighbour has no boundaries or barriers.

In other words love of God and love of neighbour are two sides of the same coin. Love of God cannot exist without love of neighbour and vice versa. God has bestowed on us with the great power to love where mere matter - our mind, our intellect, our will and our whole self is spontaneously converted to the love of God and the love of neighbor. Jesus is asking us to follow this instinct to love.

"How can I love God and not care for His image" - St. Mother Theresa of Calcutta.

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

We are now on the third option for the Memorial Acclamation. And here is how we acclaim (welcome enthusiastically) the mysterious story:

> Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free.

This is the most varied from the other two. This one is unique, because it actually has a question, request, maybe a plea? Let us delve!

Memorial Acclamation A and B both are statements of the great Mystery: proclaiming (announcing) the death and resurrection until Christ's return. But Memorial Acclamation C begins with a request—and doesn't say anything about Christ's return.

"Save us" a plea, a request. Not a story (like B) and not a proclamation (like A). A plea that Jesus, Saviour of the world, will save us. "For by your Cross" a poetic description of His death instead of a blatant statement of his death. "and Resurrection" without which the last part of the acclamation couldn't have happened: "You have set us free." The entire mystery! He had to die to save us from our sins. He had to resurrect to destroy the chains of death (yep, that's pretty cool, Jesus broke death). This prayer reminds us that Jesus died for us, that He came back from the dead for us, and that this act of love has set us free! Yep. Awesome.

We are officially through with the mystery within the Memorial Acclamation, and we are almost done with the Eucharistic Prayer (phew!). Pay attention in Mass to see what happens next!


