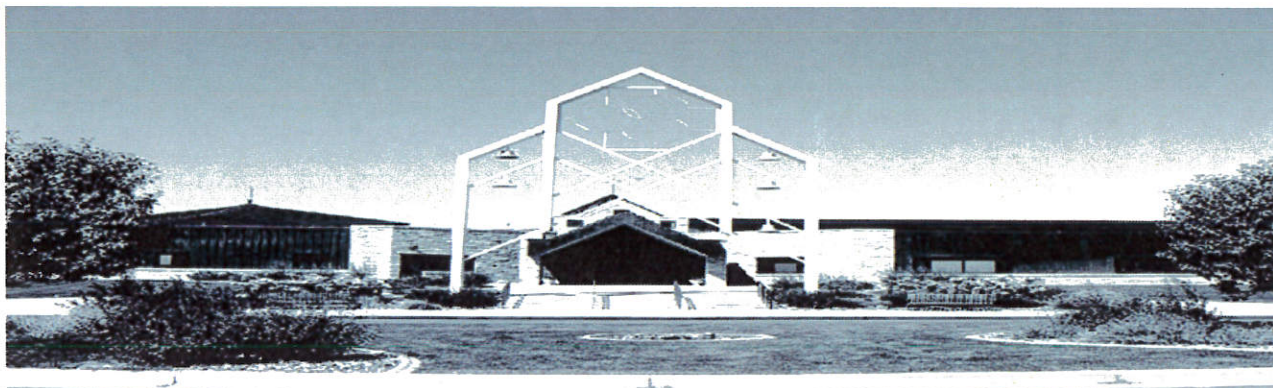

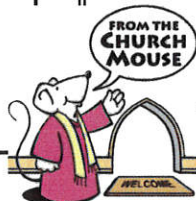

THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

(Dan: 22:1-3; Heb: 10:11-14; Mk: 13:24-32)

"END TIMES: BEGINNING OF A NEW WORLD ORDER"

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading, describes in detail the revelations of Daniel regarding the end of time. It foretells great upheavals and disasters which will happen in the world. But these signs will be followed by a new and everlasting existence. Hence the passage points to a belief in the resurrection of the dead.

Second reading explains to us that priests of the Old Testament offered sacrifices which could not take away sins. Where as the supreme sacrifice offered by Christ is superior to all the other sacrifices performed in the Old Testament. Because Christ, through his single sacrifice has taken away all our sins.

"Final days to come"

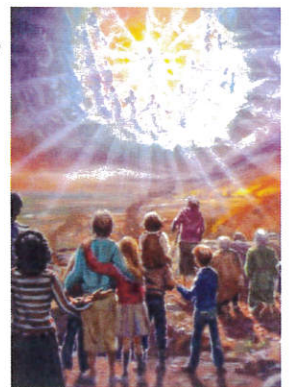
Today's Gospel gives us some indications of the end of the present world. Jesus speaks of a time of destruction, terror, troubles and persecutions. People will be betrayed and handed over to the authorities. There will be wars and earthquakes and famines. Then there will be cosmic upheavals. The Sun, the Moon and the stars will lose their normal courses and appearances. After these series of disasters finally there will be good news. Jesus looks beyond the time of distresses to a final time when the Son of man will gather the elect. He sees beyond the sufferings and persecutions to a future of peace with God.

To explain His future vision, Jesus uses the imagery of the fig tree which sheds its leaves annually. At that time its stark spiky twigs make it look quite dead until new life comes in autumn. Jesus used this imagery to explain the new life that will be manifested when He comes in glory.

We need to have deep faith and courage to face times of distress, sufferings and pain and to look forward to a new life in the Lord.

Six signs are given by Jesus to indicate the end of the age as in Matthew's Gospel.

1. False prophets, Mt. 24:5
2. Wars, Mt. 24:6-7
3. Famines, Mt. 24:7
4. Earthquakes, Mt.24: 7
5. Tribulations, Mt. 24:8-9
6. Gospel being preached throughout the world Mt. 24:14

Tour Guide of the Mass

We are right in the middle of the snowy desert! (What?) Oh... um...I'm a poet? ...I don't know, but what I *do* know is that we are right in the middle of giving thanks that we can minister to the Lord!

Humbly we pray

**that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ,
we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.**

Hmm...OK, what's that supposed to mean? "Humbly we pray"? Do I have to be humble? ...Yes? ...OK fine, I'll be humble before Christ. Humbly we pray, and look at that we're saying "we" again. Do you remember what it means when *we* say *we*? It means that **WE** are joining with one another and with Christ in *unity*. That **WE** are calling ourselves *one* people, *one* church, *together*. United. One. The USCCB says it better than your tour guide, check your brochures everyone:

"This "we" signifies that all the baptized present at the Eucharistic celebration make the sacrificial offering in union with Christ...we do not offer Christ alone; we are called to *offer ourselves*, our lives, our individual efforts...to the Father in union with Christ through the hands of the priest."

You know what? It's pretty weird (cool, strange, interesting, awesome) how that one word "we" holds so much meaning.

Like, seriously? It meant all of *that*? I guess so!

Looking at the rest of the quote from our tour book, we (all) must partake of the Body and Blood. Partake, consume, participate in, live, eat, the Body and Blood of Christ.

Remember (call back!) "unless you [we] eat the flesh of the son of Man and drink his blood you have no life in you." I personally want life in me...and since the Eucharist, that bread and wine that are seemingly just bread and wine?

Those are the Flesh and Blood that Jesus was talking about.

His *own* Body!

The last line from our Tour Book up there, we've accidentally already covered: we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit. You know what that means! One, together, individuals united—by the Holy Spirit. That third Person of the Trinity is pretty powerful, He's often overlooked, but He does a LOT.

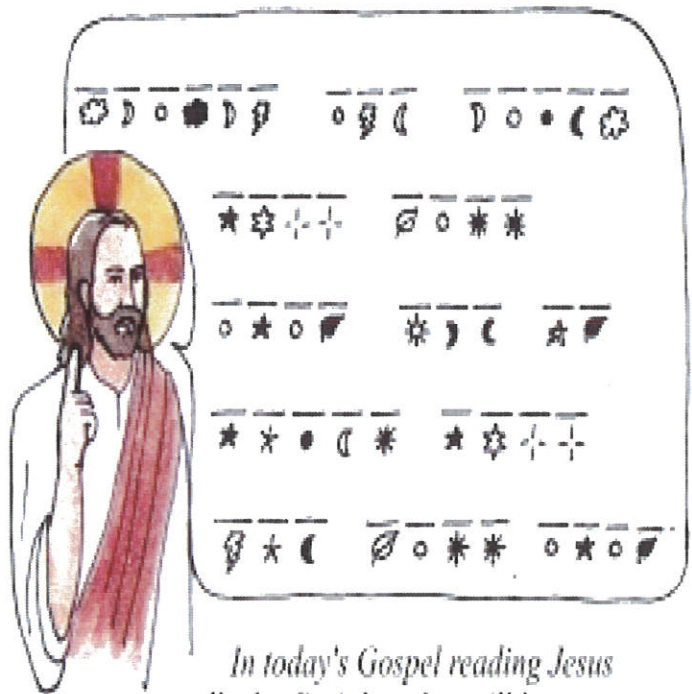

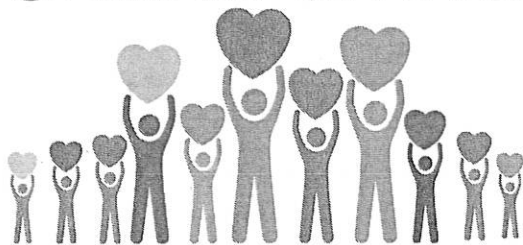
