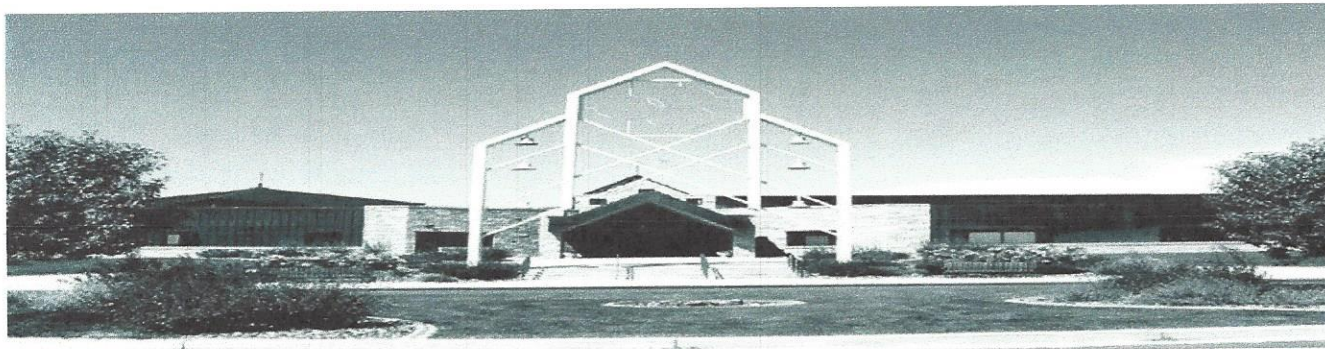

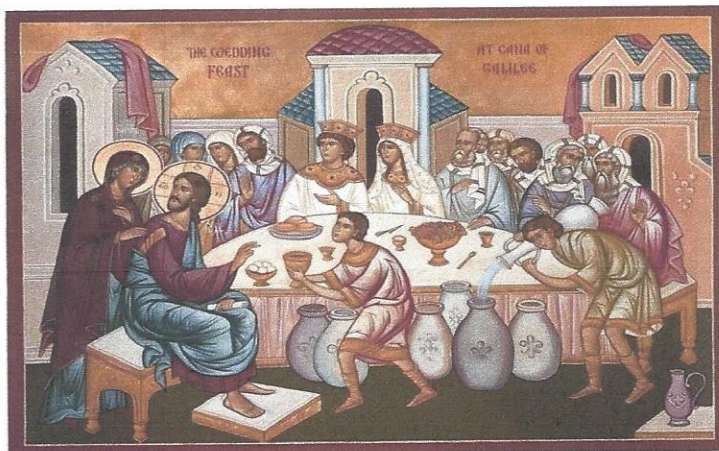

## THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY SEASON

(Is: 62:1-5; 1Cor: 12:4-11; Jn: 2:1-12)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am happy to see you all through this Homily. All the readings of today, tell us about the identity of Jesus, who he is and what his mission is. We need to know who Jesus is and understand his mission if we want to be his true disciples. We respond to God's love through lives that encourage forgiveness and reconciliation.

The 1<sup>st</sup> reading of today reveals to us that the Lord God rejoices in the Church that has been instituted by Jesus in the Father through the Holy Spirit. God is generous to his children and he rejoices in them. Paul in the second reading tells us that all gifts come from God but with a purpose so that we may proclaim his glory in his kingdom. These gifts may be varied but they all proclaim God's own glory.

The Gospel presents to us the first miracle performed by Jesus at a wedding. A wedding is a time of abundance and celebration. The Wedding at Cana speaks about love, compassion and unity. The Wedding Feast at Cana is a sign of God's love and compassion. Here Jesus takes care of the family who is about to be pushed into a state of humiliation. At the same time he accepts the word of Mary to do a good act and present the family things in abundance. The abundance of the wedding is a taste of what God provides for us at the Eucharistic table.

So dear friends, the miracle at Cana affirms that in times of great distress and difficulties, we should not lose heart but turn to Mother Mary to intercede for us and she will definitely help us.

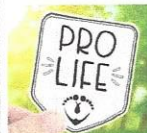

### Pro Life Rally and Walk for Life

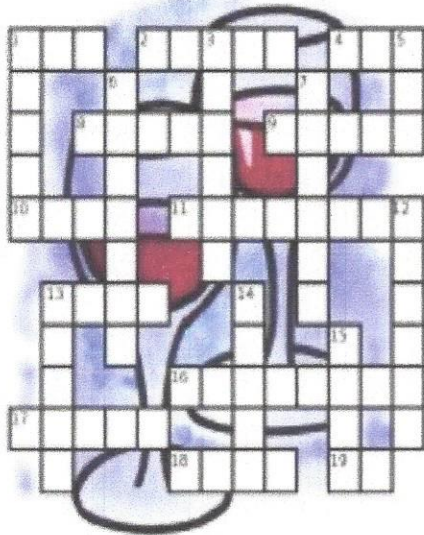

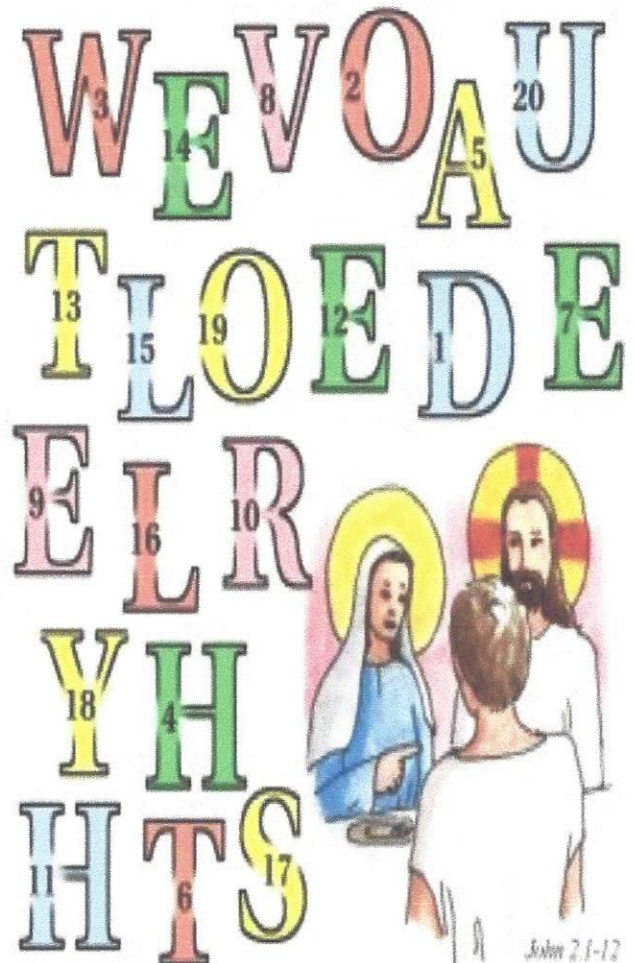
