

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: C

"LOVE YOUR ENEMIES"

(1Sam:26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23; 1Cor:15:45-49; Lk: 6: 27-38)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this homily. Today's first reading is from the first book of the Prophet Samuel. This passage tells us about King Saul who was jealous of David and he was seeking to kill David. One night David sneaked into the camp of Saul while everyone was asleep. David had a golden opportunity to kill King Saul. But he did not do it because he realized that it would be a crime in the eyes of the Lord God to kill a person anointed by the Lord God. We see here the forgiving attitude of David in spite of his enmity with Saul.

Second reading is from the first letter of St. Paul to Corinthians. In this passage Paul makes a comparison between Adam and Christ. He explains to us that in Adam we owe our earthly life. He was a man of the dust. In Christ we owe our life in heaven. He was a man from heaven.

"A call to radical discipleship"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Luke. In this passage Jesus makes some radical challenges to His disciples. He makes it very clear that revenge and retaliation have no place in His Kingdom.

Jesus gives the following action plan for His followers:

- 1. Love your enemies and do good to those who hate you.
- 2. Bless those who curse you and pray for those who abuse you.
- 3. Give to everyone who asks from you.
- 4. Do to others as you would wish them do to you.
- 5. Do not judge and you will not be judged.
- 6. Forgive and you will be forgiven.
- 7. The measure you give will be the measure you get back.

A disciple should have this attitude of Jesus in word and deed. If we follow these precepts of Jesus, the world would be a better place to live in. We would truly become sons and daughters of the Heavenly Father.

In this passage we see a reversal of values in Jesus' Kingdom. Instead of an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth as told in the Old Testament, Jesus tells us that when someone strikes you on your cheek you are asked to offer the other also.

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

Good morning! (Good evening, and Good afternoon!) Last week we talked about forgiving everyone—so I know I was perfect and forgave everyone! You believe me...right? OK, let's move along.

And lead us not into temptation,

But deliver us from evil.

The last line of the Lord's Prayer is actually a smidgen confusing, eh? Because this whole time, we have been praising the Lord (hallowed be), requesting our needs (daily bread), and asking for forgiveness from our wrongs (trespasses). But, in this last bit, we ask Our Father to lead us not into temptation of sin... does that make it sound like God will lead us into temptation?

Not so! James (1:13) told us:

No one experiencing temptation should say, "I am being tempted by God"; for God is not subject to temptation to evil, and he himself tempts no one.

So, God tempting us just isn't gonna happen! That's why, in 2019, Pope Francis started to clarify for the English-speaking world what was actually meant by "lead us not into to temptation." Our Pope wanted us to realize that our God is not the bearer of our temptation and sin, but that (if we ask, seek, and follow what He wants) God can lead us away from our temptations. We will always have our own personal downfalls and sins we are drawn toward (that Satan is a persistent one), but with Jesus Christ,


we can avoid falling into our sin.

How lovely! Our Father is simply "never gonna give you up, never gonna let you down!" Because He is holy; He fills all of our needs; He forgives us of our sins every time we ask; and He leads us away from sin and away from evil—we just have to actually let Him do so, God is awesome and won't force you to not sin.






