

March 6, 2022 First Sunday of Lent



FIRST SUNDAY OF THE LENT: YEAR: C

TEMPTATIONS OF JESUS"

(Deut: 26: 4-10; Rom: 10:8-13; Lk: 4:1-13)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the book of Deuteronomy. In this passage, Moses instructs how the Priest has to offer to God the first of the produce of the land as a thanksgiving. This was spoken in the context of God's liberating the people from the slavery of Egypt and leading them to the Promised Land: a land flowing with milk and honey. People of Israel are to be grateful for the marvelous things God has done in their lives.

Second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to Romans. In this passage, Paul instructs the Christians in Rome that salvation is for all. Everyone who believe in the Lord and calls upon the name of Lord will be saved. In the sight of God, there is no distinction between different races and people- Greeks and Jews. God's blessings are open to everyone provided they call upon the name of the Lord.

"YOU SHALL NOT TEMPT THE LORD YOUR GOD"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Luke. In this passage, we have the details of temptations of Jesus at the beginning of His ministry. Jesus was in the wilderness for 40 days fasting and praying. He was tempted by the devil. The temptations of Jesus took place in three different ways.

First temptation was to change stones into bread - so that he could eat as well as give food to the hungry people. This temptation in a subtle way asked Jesus to be a Messiah who will remove hunger, who will be a wonder worker. But Jesus rejected this temptation, too, by telling the devil, "Man does not live by bread alone."

The second temptation took place on a high mountain. The devil told Jesus that he will give him all the glory and power in the world, if only Jesus would worship the devil. Jesus rejected this temptation too by telling the devil, "You shall worship the Lord your God." Hence worship is only for God and not to worldly possessions, power or position.

The final temptation of the devil was asking Jesus to throw Himself down from the pinnacle of the temple. Jesus was assured that Angels would protect Him. This temptation of the devil was to test the power of God. We have no reason to put God to test. God is not the cause of manmade disasters and calamities.

So, Lent is a time to overcome our weaknesses through fasting and prayer like Jesus did in the desert.

I wish you all a fruitful and self-reflective Lenten season. God bless you all, Fr. Selva.

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a Global Pandemic!

We are finally finishing the Lord's Prayer! It took only five parts, and for something so important, I'm sure I didn't cover everything—but hopefully you learned something new! Anywhooo...the last thing we're gonna hit on is the doxology of the Lord's Prayer. We use this word a TON during the Mass, so I'm certain you remember what it means:

dox·ol·o·gy

/däk'säləjē/

noun

a liturgical formula of praise to God.

At the end of the Our Father, we have another shout about the glory of God. And it goes like so:

For the Kingdom, The power, and the glory are yours Now and forever

A reminder to us as a people, and shouts of praise to the Lord, that all things in all time are His.

Instead of this doxology being offered by
Fr. Priest (like, it was with the Eucharistic Prayer), this time, it is the congregation as a whole. That's pretty cool!

While this doxology is now an integral part of our recitation of the Lord's Prayer, it isn't actually part of the Lord's Prayer. A lot of Christians add the doxology whenever they recite it though, and it's been around for A VERY LONG TIME, dating back to the Greek textus receptus (uhhh... what?), which is simply the original New Testament that was written in Greek (one of the scribes scribbled the short prayer in the corner next to the Lord's Prayer and it ended up sticking!). It wasn't even part of the Mass until Blessed Pope Paul VI added it into our guide book Roman Missal in 1970.

There you have it folks! The Lord's Prayer has concluded. Do you remember what happens next in the tour...I mean in Mass? Pay attention and check in next week to find out all the details!




