

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: YEAR: C: "THE CALL TO REPENTANCE"

(Ex; 3:1-8, 13-15; 1Cori:10:1-6, 10-12; Lk: 13:1-9)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this homily. Today's first reading is from the book of Exodus. This passage describes the call of Moses when he was taking care of the sheep on Mount Horeb. The Lord God called him. The Lord God told him that the cry of His chosen people who were suffering under the task masters of Egypt had reached Him. He instructed Moses to bring them out of their misery to a land flowing with milk and honey. Moses told the people that the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob has sent him to liberate them.

The second reading is from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians. Paul warns the Christian community at Corinth that those who are unfaithful to God and grumble against Him will perish - like the Israelites who grumbled against God in the wilderness. The passage further tells us that all that happened in the past is written down so that we may take heed to God's messages.

"Unless you repent, you will all likewise perish"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Luke. In this passage Jesus emphasizes the need for repentance. He recalls two recent incidents of that time:

- 1. Pilate killing the Galileans
- 2. Eighteen people who got killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them.

Jesus warns the disciples and us that those people were not killed because they were worse sinners than others. Rather, these are warnings for us to take note so that we may not face such disasters in our lives.

In the second part of today's Gospel Jesus explains this warning through the parable of the unproductive fig tree. This particular fig tree did not produce fruits for a long period of time. The master decided to cut it down. But the gardener requested the master to allow him to water and manure the tree for another year. The master agreed to this request. The tree was given another chance to produce or perish.

The message of the parable is explicit. Unless we take God's warnings and use the given opportunities for turning away from our sinful ways and turn to God, we too may face unpleasant consequences in our lives.

Lent is the appropriate time to repent and turn away from our sins.

"We will have to repent in this generation not merely for the vitriolic words and actions of the bad people but for the appalling silence of the good people" -Martin Luther King Jr.

I wish you all a very wonderful weekend and lovely day. God bless you all. Amen. Fr. Selva

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens
During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a
Global Pandemic!

Amen! Remember, there's always an Amen, because so it is (that is what Amen means). Last week (or 10 seconds ago in Mass), Fr. Priest asked for peace, unity, and mercy from Jesus. Today, we offer peace to each other:

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

This is what Fr. Priest says to us, and we take that and turn it back around and offer the same to him:

And with your spirit.

If you're old (like I am!) you might remember when we said "and also with you." This was from the original translation in the 1970s (updated again in 1985). WELL, we updated it *again* in 2011. There are a lot of parts that were re-translated, but this one might be one of the most ingrained, because we say it multiple times every Mass. Look at the Latin: *et cum spiritu tuo. Time for some Math (...um...what?).*

Et (pronounced Eht) = And Cum (Koom) = With Spiritu (speer-ree-too) = Spirit Tuo (too-oh) = Your

So, the 2011 translation of the Latin holds truer to the original meaning! What we used to say "and also with you" meant the same thing at the heart of it, but maybe made it more confusing to understand that meaning. Let's keep going!

Mr. Deacon gets to say this next part if he's around:

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

Because, now, we don't just offer it to Fr. Priest, and him to us. We offer it to everyone. We offer it to those in attendance with us, but we are also called to take that same peace of Christ out into the world—peace and unity, it's God's Will!

In fact, here's something in our guide book (Roman Missal) that's never said out loud, and you've probably never heard before. We're given some instructions:

"And all offer...a sign...that expresses peace, communion, and charity."

Just like I said from before! Peace and Unity, that's what Fr. Priest asks for us, and what Christ grants us. This instruction adds the need for charity, that is, love. Because, as you might know, we'll never have peace and unity without love. SM






