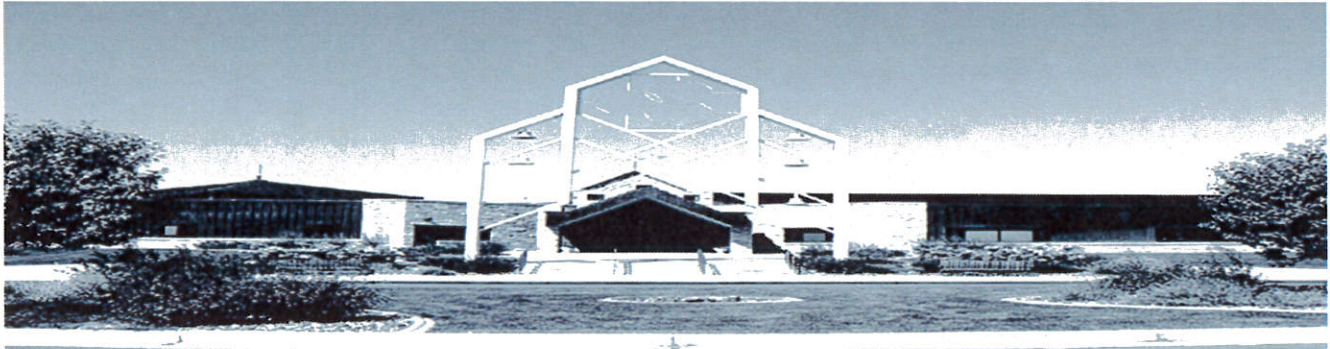

PALM SUNDAY: YEAR: C:

"HOSANNA TO THE SON OF DAVID"

**Gospel Reading (Procession): Lk: 19:28-40
(Is; 50:4-7; Phil: 2:6-11; Lk: 22:14 to 23:56)**

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all though this Homily. Today's Gospel according to St. Luke (for procession) gives an account of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem - like a King, Messiah and Prophet. When He entered the city, the people of Jerusalem welcomed Him by singing hosanna and praising God. He came on a colt, symbolizing peace. As we are going to acclaim Him as our King let us make a firm promise to serve Him alone. Jesus' entry as messianic King is a sign that the peace and salvation decreed by God is at hand.

The first reading is from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. This passage describes the sufferings of Isaiah in carrying out his God-given mission. But he is convinced that God will eventually save him and he will not be put to shame.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians. In this passage Paul explains to the Christian community the fact that because Jesus took upon Himself our human conditions and accepted death on a cross, the Father has made him Lord of heaven and earth. Humiliations, sufferings and death are necessary to enter into glory.

"Passion of the Lord Jesus"

In today's Gospel we have the passion narrative by St. Luke. The evangelist gives a vivid account of the Passover meal with the institution of the Eucharist at the last supper. Even when death is approaching for the master, disciples are disputing among themselves who is the greatest among them. Jesus made it very clear to them that to be His disciples they are to be at the service of one another. Jesus warned Peter of his impending denial. Judas under the cover of darkness betrayed Him with a kiss and Jesus was arrested by the soldiers.

When taken to the authorities Jesus was accused of calling Himself a king. Finally under severe pressure from Jewish authorities Pilate condemned Him to death on a cross. Even on His final journey to Calvary Jesus showed mercy and compassion and kindness to the women of Jerusalem. On the cross He prayed for His executioners and pardoned the thief on the right side of the cross. After His death Joseph of Arimathea who was a secret disciple of Jesus took His body and buried Him in a tomb. We too are invited to be participants in the Passion story especially during the Holy week.

Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) is not the last word of the Jesus story. Rather it is only a prelude to Holy week that will reach its climax on Easter Sunday. Let the celebrations of Palm Sunday bring us hope and encouragement in times of pain and sufferings.

Divine Mercy Sunday

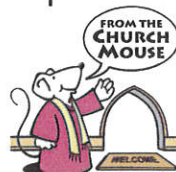
Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday,

Tour Guide of the Mass

Your Guide for Remembering What in the World Happens
During Mass After Being Unable to Attend Because of a
Global Pandemic!

We're back! Now, this is a bit of a weird tour, because
in order for you to get the *full experience*, we have to take
the off-ramp, back track, merge back on, and get back
around to that which we've already seen. The Fracture
Rite! Last week we learned all about breaking a piece of
the Body and placing it into the Blood. Well, during that
moment is when the congregation says their own prayer:

**Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
Have mercy on us.**

**Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,

**Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world,
Grant us peace.**

This invocation can be repeated more than the standard
three times, if Fr. Priest takes longer than normal. But
"grant us peace" is always the final invocation.

That's all well and good, but do you know where we got
this prayer? The Bible! Specifically, John the Baptist,
who got excited when he saw Jesus coming up to him and
proclaimed "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away
the sins of the world." So...like...we in the congregation
repeat that every Mass. John the Baptist didn't say a lot of
frivolous things in the Bible (did he say any?), which
means that his words are pretty important. This is a
reminder to us that God is merciful, that God *wants* to take
away our sins. And we use these words constantly,
because humans are really good at forgetting what is really
important.

John the Baptist also chose the words he used very
carefully. Notice he said "...takes away the sins of the
world." That word choice is pretty important considering
the Israelites were the chosen people, but John didn't
narrowcast down to just "...takes away the sins of
'Israel'" or some such version. Nope! John said "the
world." Do you know what that means? It's just one more
confirmation that Jesus Christ wants to save all of us, you,
me, your eccentric Aunt Petunia. Jesus would have gone
through every ounce of suffering for just a single person—
you are that important to Him. He didn't suffer because
there have been billions of people, making it worth His
effort. He suffered because he loves each of us wholly—
even if there was ever only one million souls born. Or five
hundred. Or fifty...Or just one. You.

You are worth His effort.

On Good Friday morning, JESUS, who had been arrested the night before, was judged by Pontius Pilate, the ROMAN governor. Pilate had him WHIPPED. Then to make fun of Him the SOLDIERS made a CROWN of THORNS and put it on His head. They threw a purple cloth on Him and beat Him with RODS, saying, "Hail, KING of the JEWS!" Then Pilate had Jesus brought out in front of the people and asked them what they wanted to do with Him. The people, who had welcomed Him into JERUSALEM a few days before with their HOSANNAS, now shouted that He should be crucified.

So Jesus was made to CARRY a heavy CROSS out of the city and up a big HILL. Because He was so weak from being beaten, a man named SIMON of Cyrene was forced to help Him. The soldiers tore off Jesus' CLOTHES and attached Him to the cross with NAILS through His hands and feet.

Jesus offered His life for our SINS. He hung on the cross for three HOURS until He DIED. Nearby were His mother MARY, JOHN the Apostle, and Mary MAGDALEN. After he died a soldier stuck a SPEAR into His side to be sure He was dead. Did you know that at every MASS we re-offer Jesus' sacrifice on the cross in an unbloody way on the altar?

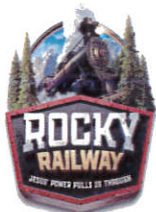

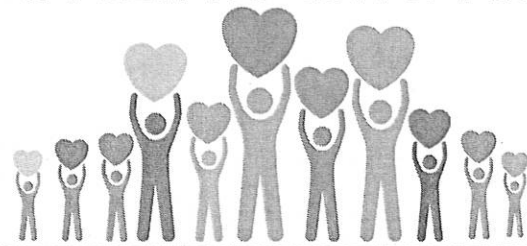


