# TWENTY SIXTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: C: "PERILS OF NEGLECTING THE POOR"

(Amos: 6: 1, 4-7; 1 Tim: 6: 11-16; Lk: 16: 19-21)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. The holy mother church invites you and me to reflect on the theme of "**PERILS OF NEGLECTING THE POOR**". That is what we are going to see in all three reading of today's word of God.

Today's first reading is from the book of the Prophet Amos. In this passage Amos speaks to the wealthy people both from Judah and from Israel. He severely warns the complacent who live luxuriously and neglect the poor and the needy. They do not care for the plight of the poor. Besides their conduct will bring ruin to the whole nation.

The second reading is from the first letter of St. Paul to Timothy. In this passage Paul encourages Timothy and mentions the example of Jesus who was always faithful to His call in the face of hostility and even death. So also he says, Christians should lead a life of righteousness, love and kindness and should be faithful to God's call.

#### "The parable of the rich man and Lazarus"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Luke. This passage narrates the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The rich man (who is not named in the parable) lived a lavish life - expensive clothing, sumptuous meals and palatial houses were at his disposal. Whereas Lazarus- sick, sores all over the body and starving was lying at the gate of the rich man. During his life time on this earth the rich man enjoyed life to the brim whereas Lazarus suffered and finally died.

The sin of the rich man consisted not in what he did but rather what he did not do for this poor man who was in dire need. Finally the rich man too died. Death is a leveler of all inequalities. The reversal of fortunes is the central theme of the parable. With death the roles of the rich man and Lazarus are dramatically and irrevocably reversed. It was the turn of the rich man to get some attention from Abraham and the pity of Lazarus who was enjoying the comfort in the next life. But it was too late. An abyss separated them and it was an abyss for which the rich man himself was responsible. The parable shows what happens when we enjoy our wealth selfishly showing little or no concern for the poor and downtrodden in the society.

This parable invites us to live more simply to share more readily and to live more fully so that we can be followers of the Lord. It is said, "A person's wealth consists not in what he keeps but in what he gives away".

"The parable declares that they, who abound in earthly riches, unless they will relieve the necessities of the poor, shall meet with a heavy condemnation." -

St. Cyril of Jerusalem.

## WHAT IS THE EUCHARIST

The Sacrifice of the Mass is a worship in which the people of God reenact and make present the birth, ministry, passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Christ in anticipation of His second coming. In the Mass, the people of God proclaim Christ's death, profess His resurrection and await His coming again. In the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, Christ is not re-crucified again, and again and again, each time the Mass is celebrated. This sacrifice is officiated once and for all, by Christ Jesus the Lord; the Church reenacts it in memory of Christ in obedience to His command

The Mass is the sacrifice of the body and Blood of Christ under the appearance of bread and wine. That is why Paul wrote: "For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes again" 1 Corinthians 11:26

By Whose Authority: By the authority of Christ Himself who commanded His Church to offer this Sacrifice "IN MEMORY OF ME." The church can do this because she bears the authority of Christ and He is united with His church in the Spirit till the end of time, Matt. 28:20.

For What Reason: In the sacrifice of the Mass, the people of God partake in the passion, death and resurrection of the Lord. Most importantly, the people of God offer the sacrifice in obedience to the Lord who commanded His Church to "DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME." During the sacrifice of the Mass, the Church offers her worship to the Father in the Son through the Spirit; the living, the dead and the unborn are united. In the sacrifice of the Mass, God, human and creation are perfectly united. Jesus, through the office of the priest, does once more, what he did at the Last Supper.

How: From the Last Supper, He continued on the altar of the Cross. Jesus the Lord instituted the sacrifice of Thanksgiving (Holy Eucharist) of His Body and Blood as a perpetual sacrifice to the father for the expiation of sins. In the Holy Mass, the Lord Jesus unites with the priest ontologically, acting in his person. So, the priest, in the person of Christ, acting in the name and on behalf of the universal church and in a sacramental manner, reenacts the same sacrifice - for the people of God to partake. That is why the most important action of the Mass for the people of God is active participation.


**Why:** The Holy Eucharist unites the faithful with the Lord Jesus who said, "Whoever eats my Flesh and drinks my Blood dwells in me and I in them." Jn. 6:51-53. Again, "Whoever eats my Body and drinks my Blood will live forever and I will raise them up on the last day." Jn. 6:56.

In the Holy Eucharistic celebration, creation brings all its beauty together in Thanksgiving to the Father John 17:21-23, first, for the gift of Christ Jesus through whom our salvation and unity with the father is reassured. For He channeled the heart of the father to His children and the heart of us children to the Father. Malachi 4:5-6. That is why they called him Elijah.

The Eucharist is a Sacrifice, for through it the Lord Jesus expiates all our sins, softens God's heart and gains us access to the Father. It is a thanksgiving, because through it, the Church offers bountiful gratitude to the Father for accepting her children. It is a mission (Mass), for within this sacrifice we are assigned a mission through which we serve God, humanity and creation.




