# TWENTY SEVENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: C: "LORD, INCREASE OUR FAITH!"

(Habak: 1: 2-3 & 2:2-4; 2 Tim: 1:6-8, 13-14; Lk: 17: 5-10)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this homily. First reading is from the book of the Prophet Habakkuk. In this passage Habakkuk pleads with God in desperation. He is faced with political insecurity on the one hand and widespread idolatry on the other hand. God responded to him by promising to save those who trust in Him and give the just man courage and strength to face the coming trials. He promises that the righteous person will live by his faith.

Second reading is from the second letter of St. Paul to Timothy. In this passage Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching and persevere in the faith he received from God. Paul instructs him and us that we should never be afraid or be ashamed of bearing witness to Christ who has strengthened us by His Holy Spirit.

## "Faith as small as a grain of mustard seed"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Luke. The context is the realization of the Apostles of their own lack of faith. Consequently they requested Jesus to increase their faith. He explains to them about faith as small as a mustard seed. "Such a faith, He says is powerful enough to uproot a Sycamore tree and plant it in the sea." Transplanting a tree in the ocean is nothing short of a miracle and in human terms practically impossible.

In the second part of today's Gospel Jesus reminds us that to have faith in God is to carry out our responsibilities in life quietly and with total dedication. In His own life Jesus put His faith to His daily activities. As a result He was able to feed the five thousand with five loaves and two small fish. He was able to heal many who were affected by dreaded diseases. He cured the blind and the deaf and even raised the dead to life. By His own example Jesus made the Apostles realize what faith can accomplish in their lives.

Today the same Jesus is inviting us to have faith in God in all situations in life. Then we too will be able to do many mighty works in our lives and in the lives of others. Like the Apostles we too need to pray for an increase of faith.

"Faith is to believe what you do not see; the reward of this faith is to see what you believe." - St. Augustine.

"To one who has faith, no explanation is necessary. To one without faith, no explanation is possible" - St. Thomas Aquinas.

# NAMES ASSOCIATED WITH THE SACRICICE WE CELEBRATE AND WHAT THEY SIGNIFY

The names associated with the Lords Supper include: The Lord's Supper, the Eucharistic Celebration, the Holy Mass, the Memorial of the Passion, the Breaking of the Bread, the Holy Sacrifice, the Divine Liturgy, the Eucharistic Assembly, Holy Communion, and Most Holy Sacrament of the Alter. There are many names associated with the Holy Eucharist because each name has a distinct meaning in regards to the Holy Eucharist. These names separate themselves from the others, and also bestow specific aspects to the sacrament; *CCC1328*. The inexhaustible riches of this sacrament cannot be expressed in one name. Each name brings out a different richness; and in a particular way reveals God's association with the church. Some names bring to light the meaning of the Holy Eucharist as the consecrated Bread and Wine, while others reveal what is happening at Mass. These names can be grouped into two: names describing consecrated Bread and Wine, and names describing the Liturgy of Mass

#### Names that describe the Consecrate Bread and Wine:

Breaking of the Bread: This was the action of Jesus when He instituted the Sacrament. He performed four actions within this context. He TOOK, BLESSED, BROKE and GAVE: *Matt. 26:26*. This is the true life of Jesus who was broken and killed that we might have healing and life. The early church went house to house breaking Bread; *Acts 2:46* Today the Holy Church continues the action of the Breaking of Bread as communion with the Lord and the whole Church. So, when Bread is broken, as on the way to Emmaus, the Church recognizes Jesus who is hidden under the appearance of Bread and wine.

Holy Communion: The Eucharistic Community gathers to celebrate the oneness of the Church. For all the faithful feed from one dish, and drink from one cup, which shows their unity with each other and with Christ the Lord. The Holy Eucharist signifies Christian unity. It is our koinonia with the Lord and one another. The Church is one in The Holy Communion.

The Holy Sacrifice: The Holy Eucharist is the sacrifice of Our Lord Jesus Christ to the Father for the forgiveness of sins. In this sacrifice, Jesus is the Victim, the Alter and the Priest. It is a sacrifice because Jesus emptied Himself (*Philippians 2:7*) to the Father for the forgiveness of sin, so that, we might be reconciled with the Father and with one another.

The Via T. Cum: "With you on your journey." Indeed, the Lord Jesus, Emmanuel, is with each of us on this journey called life. He is also with His Pilgrim Church as she journeys to the father; *Matt. 28:20*. The Holy Eucharist is also food to those who are sick, so they may recognize that the Lord who hung on the cross, shares in their pain, and brings them healing. The Holy Eucharist is also given to those in periculum murtis (in danger of death) so that they may feel his presence and die in peace.


