TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – YEAR C

‘... A parable about the need to pray continually...’ (Lk 18:1)

(Ex: 17:8-13; 2Tim:14-4:2; Lk 18:1-8)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. At the beginning of my Homily I would like to raise a few questions and arrive at answers from the questions. How would you describe your own prayer life? Is it like calling emergency numbers? Or it is a constant relationship? (A parable about the need to pray constantly).

In the gospel text of today we have a reminder on making frequent calls to God. Jesus is still on his way to Jerusalem – a journey that he began in Chapter 9 of the Gospel of Luke (Lk 9:51), and is nearly reaching his final destination. Meanwhile he begins to tell us two stories about prayer. One is in Lk 18:1-8) about constancy in prayer and another is in Lk 18:9-14 about our attitude in prayer. This Sunday we take up the first story, about the woman who went knocking at the door of the agnostic judge.

Though the woman in the parable of today is seeking the help of the judge because she is in need, we should not lose sight of the context of the story. Luke tells us that Jesus told them a parable, to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart. (Lk 18:1) Besides, this story comes after Jesus has been talking about the coming of the Kingdom of God. And the story ends with the statement from the mouth of Jesus, “When the Son of man comes, will he find faith on earth?” Therefore, the parable is about praying as long as we are on the face of the earth. It is about prayer in our daily life.

In the first reading of today, we have a story of the prolonged hours of prayer by a leader of a nation on behalf of his people. We find Moses with hands lifted up on behalf of the people of Israel (Ex 17:8-13). Even if this story would have had some historical significance for the people of Israel, as a Christian living in the 21st century, I would like to understand it in a symbolic manner. The Amalekites were a nomadic tribe of very fierce people, known in those days for their guerrilla warfare on the neighboring tribes. They attack the people of Israel on their journey towards the Promised Land. The evil Amalekites prevent the people of Israel from realizing the plan of God in their lives. Therefore, Moses decides that Joshua should “march out to engage Amalek” (Ex 17:9). Meanwhile, Moses himself will lead a community (with Aaron and Hur) to the mountain top (Ex 17:10b) to be in union with God. This is not just a political warfare, but a spiritual one. It has to be supported by prayer.

In the second reading St Paul would urge us to pray “always and for everything giving thanks in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father” (Eph 5:20, See also Col 1:3; Phil: 1:4).

THE ROLE OF COMMUNITY PRAYER

So how can I manage to pray constantly? How can I keep my hands lifted up in prayer without getting tired? The remarkable detail in the story of Moses, praying on the mountain top, is that he is supported by two people: Aaron and Hur. Interestingly, Aaron was a Levite – a priest! Perhaps we too need the help of the believing community to support us in our continued prayer life.

These days we come across so many groups of people who come together for spiritual exercises recommended in either in our Parish or in our Diocese. Often these groups are led by lay people, and mostly just supported by priests. There are so many of them to list! Some are creatively using the modern media: websites, text messages or using the Skype to come together to pray. Even as a priest, I feel overwhelmed these days by the fact that God is working so powerfully in the lives of so many lay people who, as individuals and as groups, hold up their hands in prayer. They create the sacred space in the city. And with this hotline to God, they sustain the world. It may be helpful for us to be part of a group like that. Whatever the method, pray continually! We need to! God needs to be the most frequently and continually dialed number in our daily lives. Amen. I wish you all a Lovely weekend and Blessed Sunday to you all. Fr. Selva.

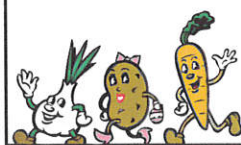

Why Do We Attend the Eucharistic Celebration

The first Catholic's attended the Eucharistic celebration to participate in the Sacrifice of the lamb. The sacrifice of the Last Supper, which was consummated on the Holy Cross, opened the door to the Father when the protective veil was torn from top to bottom. At Mass the door to the Father is always kept open through the reenactment of the same sacrifice of Christ. We go to mass not because it is an obligation but because we have come to realize the benefit of a real relationship with God in the real presence of Christ. Therefore, Mass attendance is primarily an act of loving respect to our God, who first loves us in creation and then in Christ Jesus the Lord. In our time, attending Mass is not necessarily considered an obligation rather an act of the will, offering God, a little of our time, talent, and treasure in thanks giving to his graces through the week and for the gift of Jesus Christ.

Catholics go to Mass to renew their knowledge of the word of God (Prov. 7: 1-3, Deut. 6: 6-7) every time the Mass is celebrated we hear the word of God from the Hebrew Bible, Psalms, the Gospel, and the Epistles. The homily itself is a prayer, a study which opens our minds to know God and one-another. You will read the whole bible if you go to Mass every day and if you go only on Sundays it will take you three years to cover the whole Bible.

In the Mass more than anywhere, the Prayer, "Our Father" has its full meaning for we all pray with one voice to the One Father of us all. In this prayer at Mass, we affirm our unity in the Father and the communion with one another.

We go to Mass to celebrate our oneness with God and with one another. We are all one in the Body of Christ. We gather in obedient to the command of the Lord to offer the Sacrifice of Mass in memory of Him. We gather to experience Jesus who promised "that where two or three have gathered together in my name, I am there in their midst." Matt. 18:20. At Mass, we are not just friends we are brothers and sisters. At Mass we gather from different cultures, races, economic, education and political back grounds, No one struggles alone and no one celebrates alone. Mass is the mystery which connects us to God, Mass connects the living to those in Heaven and in Purgatory. The celebration of the Mass is a glimpse of the communion of Saints in Heaven. After the celebration of Mass, we have koinonia, which helps heal the pain of loneliness. We come to Mass to celebrate our community in a joyful worship, which knows no exclusion because "all are welcome."

We go to Mass to pray for Souls in Purgatory. The Bible says that nothing unclean may enter heaven, these our brothers and sisters in Purgatory, since they were not wicked as to be condemned, and not pure to transcend into Heaven, they have to undergo purification, Lk. 12:47 within the Eucharistic celebration we appeal God's mercy on their behalf.

The Holy Eucharist is the highest form of Prayer in the Church. Prayer is one of the ways we make time for God. Jesus Emmanuel went to spend time with his people, so we gather in his name to worship the Father. Hence, it is wrong to just pray the Rosary, read the bulletin, or be distracted from active participation in the Mass. The time at Mass is totally dedicated to God the Father.

At the end of the Mass, we sent to mission to break our bread with the hungry and share water with the thirsty, clothe the naked and visit the sick person and the prisoner (cf. Mt 25:34-36). to see in every individual that same Lord who did not hesitate to give the whole of himself for us and for our salvation, Hence the Eucharistic celebration is called Mass (mission).

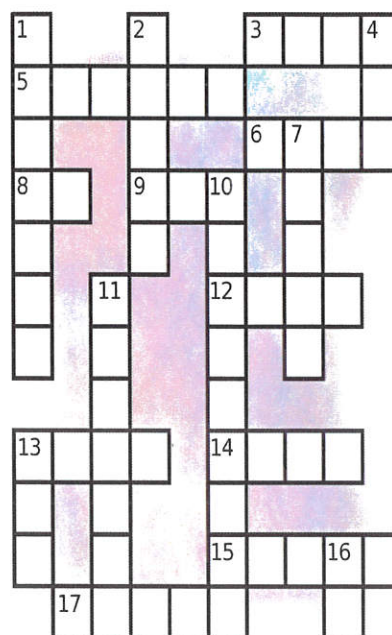

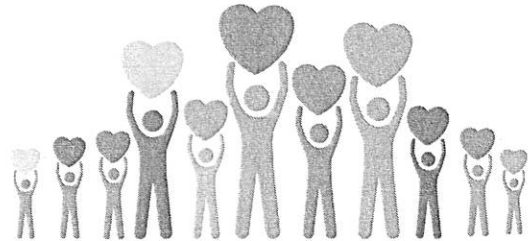

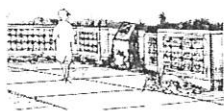
