THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: C:

"UNIVERSAL SALVATION"

(Wis: 11: 22 to 12:2; 2 Thess: 1: 11-22; Lk: 19: 1-10)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this homily. The Holy mother Church invites you and me to reflect on **"UNIVERSAL SALVATION"**. Today's first reading is from the book of Wisdom. This passage expresses the greatness and love of the Lord God towards the whole creation. It was out of love that the Lord God created the world and everything in it. Therefore He does not desire the destruction or the death of the humankind. The Lord God is always ready to pardon the sins of those who repent and return to Him.

The second reading is from the second letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians. In this passage Paul urges the Thessalonian Christians to be worthy of their call and assures them that God will help them to be true to it. Paul explains to them that their salvation would be glory both for them and for Jesus Christ. At the same time he asks them not to be too anxious about the second coming of Christ. He urges them to continue to live a good Christian life everyday, allowing God to work in their lives.

Jesus meets Zacchaeus the tax collector

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Luke. In this passage we have a graphic description of Jesus' meeting with Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector of Jericho. After meeting Jesus, Zacchaeus responded to the invitation of Jesus in a wholehearted way. That day in Jericho there were large crowds. On inquiry Zacchaeus came to know that Jesus the miracle worker was passing by. He desired to see Jesus just once. Since he was short in stature he climbed a sycamore tree on the road side and sat on one of the branches. Jesus along with His disciples came that way.

Then the most unexpected and amazing thing happened in the life of this little rich man. Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down, for I must stay at your house today." Zacchaeus was very thrilled but was also confused. So he came down from the tree and took Jesus to his house. Till he met Jesus, Zacchaeus wanted only money and more of it. But that chance encounter with the Lord changed everything in his life. He knew very well that the riches he amassed were accumulated dishonestly. So he gave half of what he owned to the poor and declared that he would repay in fourfold anyone he cheated. Jesus' presence totally and irrevocably changed this man. No wonder Jesus said, "Today salvation has come to this house."

Today Jesus is passing by and inviting each one of us to come down from the tree where we are sitting. Let nothing stand between us and Jesus.

Called To Worship As One

I have heard it said that whoever leaves the Catholic Church for another denomination was not a Catholic in the first place. This statement is not born of arrogance nor based on lack of compassion for those who exited Church but based on the aim, nature and mission of the Church. You will agree with me that if a Catholic understands the nature, aim and mission of the Church, he will not leave the church for any reason. Like Peter, (Jn. 6:60-71) every catholic will work hard to amend the human face of the church while nurturing the divine face therein. The Church is an organization **of the worshippers of God** who use the sacraments to grow in their salvific journey. The Church is the people of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit established by Christ to announce the kingdom of God.

Christ the Lord has charged all his disciples (i.e. you and me) to “go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age;” Matt, 28:20. Make disciples for what? St. Ignatius of Loyola and the Baltimore Catechism provide a clue why Christ sent us on mission. It is found on God’s reason for creation; namely: **“God freely created us so that we might know, love, and serve him in this life and be happy with him forever. God’s purpose in creating us is to draw forth from us a response of love and service here on earth, so that we may attain our goal of everlasting happiness with him in heaven.”** However, there is a greater question: while we are on the earth, how can we express our love and service to God? by being dedication God, Duet. 6:5 and express such dedication to God in our care for one another Lev. 19:18.

How can we be dedicated to God? The Bible from Patriarchs to John’s revelation tells what the Lord wants from us: to worship HIM. The first time God called his people as a community to worship was in Egypt when he told Pharaoh, “*Let my people go, that they may worship me in the wilderness*” Ex. 5:1. They traveled for three months in the wilderness from Goshen to Sanai, Ex. 19:1. then God said “*I shall come to you in a dense cloud ... warn the people so they do not force their way through to see the LORD and many of them perish.*” So the Lord appeared in thunder and lightning, with a thick cloud over the mountain, and a very loud trumpet blast. Everyone in the camp trembled. Ex, 19:16-21. So they made a promise in fear: “*all that the Lord has said we shall do.*”

Granted that the Lord wants to be worshiped; in the Old Testament, we were to worship him from a distance. This distance was created when Adam was expelled from Eden, Gen. 3:24. From then onwards, the people of God were to pray and offer their various prescribed offerings. But the center of the Old Testament liturgy was to “worship God from **a distance**.” Ex. 19 14-21; 24:1. “The message of all of this is clear: God is holy and can in no way have fellowship with our wretched sinful race unless the sin is atoned for, effectively covered in some way.” The worship God sought from the human being was to be celebrated only from a distance. Then came Jesus. In Christ Jesus, worship became complete and fulfilling “when he offered himself once for all to God in the true heavenly temple, and opened for us an eternal passageway into the very presence of God by His body and His blood (Heb. 10:19-22). With that New Covenant comes a command from God “Let us draw near to God!!!” With the new Eucharistia and new koinonia comes the new prayer for perfect unity with God as Jesus prayed to the Father: “*I in them and you in me - so that they may be brought to **perfect unity**. Then the world will know that you sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me*” Jn. 17:23. The Holy Eucharist is the celebration of this Perfect Unity with God and human and everything that is. With Christ the veil of division has been torn from top to bottom, Matt. 27:51

Brothers and sisters, it is into this new perfect unity with God that you have been called not as an observer but as true participant. In the Eucharist, we are called to be one with God in the one unity of fellowship. Here there is no Jew nor Gentile. No slave nor free. No man nor woman. But all is one in Christ Jesus the Lord. Gal. 3:24. The Eucharist is the source and summit of God’s grace and this grace flows from the Church. The aim and mission of the Church is that she should draw us in and we are reborn as God’s children to take the Eucharist as a mission to the ends of the earth. It is the Eucharist that holds the Church together as inclusive and Catholic. Peace.




