

#### "IMMINENT COMING OF THE LORD"

Is: 35: 1-6a and 10; Jam: 5: 7-10; Mat: 11: 1-11)

Dear Friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. In this passage Isaiah foretells the return of the people of Israel from the Babylonian captivity as the Lord God will come to their rescue. Isaiah tells us that we too should look beyond our sorrows and disappointments of the present with great hope in God's love and His saving actions in our lives. The Prophet encourages cheering up and not being afraid because the Lord God will save us.

The second reading is from the letter of St. James. In this passage the Apostle stresses the quality of patience, never easy for any of us. He urges us to be loving and patient with one another and be patient regarding the Lord's final coming. He gives us the example of prophets who underwent sufferings but went about patiently.

#### "Are you the one who is to come?"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. This passage describes the predicament of John the Baptist regarding Jesus. Just as we have questions about who Jesus is, John, too, had a problem with the identity of Jesus. "Are you the one or shall we look for another?" was the question put by John. Hope of John the Baptist regarding Jesus as the promised Messiah was not entirely fulfilled. John was imprisoned by Herod. In the prison he was confused about Jesus. The question put by John is raised by many even today. Jesus' answer to messengers of John was to observe what was happening around them and tell John concerning their experience of Jesus: sight for the blind, lame walking, dead are raised to life and the good news being preached to the poor. Is there any such experiences in our lives that would make us say, "Yes" to Jesus?

Today Jesus gives us the same message - to look around and see the presence of God and His benevolent power around us. Look around and see God's mighty manifestations of love and power around us. When our hopes are broken and our dreams are shattered let us not get disappointed and disheartened but rather place our trust in the Lord.

"A prison cell in which one waits, hopes - and is completely dependent on the fact that the door to freedom has to be opened from outside, is not a bad picture of advent", - Dietrich Bonhoeffer.

"Want to keep Christ in Christmas? Feed the hungry; clothe the naked; forgive the guilty; welcome the unwanted; care for the ill; love your enemies and do unto others as you would have done unto you" - S. Maraboli.

#### HOW CAN I PROPERLY PREPARE FOR THE MASS

#### CONTINUED... Part 4

#### **GREETINGS OF PEACE:**

The Priest or presider is giving you the peace of the Lord who is already in the assembly, so that you may receive the peace, grace and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit to gain enough strength for your mission. Note that at the beginning of the Mass, you have already called on the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; by this invocation, you have made God present to you and you are present to God. Your priest just vested you with the peace, which comes from this Triune God whom you have already invoked.

Peace is not the absence of strife; it is the presence of completeness. Peace brings God's supernatural calm and tranquility. Peace is the presence of a clear conscience in our relationship with God, others, and nature. "Shlama allawkhom" in Arabic, or "Shalom Aleichem" in Hebrew, both mean "peace be with you". When God's peace is with you, you are better disposed to worship God, and offer your sacrifice to him.

How desperately the world needs God's peace! Humanity yearns for peace — in our heart, in our family, and in the world. Christ offers us his peace at each and every Mass, and all we have to do is accept his offer.

Through his passion, death and resurrection, our Lord Jesus Christ has brought peace to the fallen world: "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities, the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and with his stripes we were healed." Isaiah 53:5

I Peter 2:21 is the companion verse to Isaiah 53:5 above, confirming the great gift of Christ to the world: "He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed!" I Peter 2:24

#### The Father created all things out of love:

"The Lord is good to all, and his tender mercies are over all his works." (Psalm 145:9) And in his abundant love he created humanity in his own image and likeness.

"And God saw everything that he had made, and, behold, it was very good. And the evening and the morning were the sixth day." (Genesis 1:31)

#### It is the Holy Spirit who binds us in the Father's love and in fellowship with one another.

That is why Paul insists that we should "preserve the unity of the Spirit" (Ephesians 4:3)

During Mass the Priest or presider wants to vest you not only with the presence of the Holy Trinity, but also with the functionality of the Holy Spirit, so that you may know truly, that you belong to the Trinity.

Jesus prayed: "...that they all may be one, as you Father, are in me, and I in you; that they also may be one in us; that the world may believe that you have sent me." John 17:21

Peace will be your blessing if you accept it as yours: "And also with your Spirit."

Liturgical movements: Standing, Sitting and Kneeling

#### Standing to welcome Christ the High Priest:

According to the Church's tradition, the assembly stands during the entrance procession. This is to welcome Christ the High Priest, who is imaged in the priest, the crucifix, the Book of the Gospel and the light borne by the acolytes.

#### Standing to hear the voice of the Lord and speaking to the Lord in prayer:

Within the context of the Mass, the Church rises to hear the voice of the Lord, such as when the Gospel is proclaimed.

The Church stands to offer prayers to the Lord, such as in the Collect, Prayers of the Faithful, Prayer over the Gift, the Preface, the Lord's Prayer and Prayers after Communion.

#### Sitting to Listen:

The Church sits to listen to anyone, other than the Lord, who speaks to the Assembly. These include the readings from the Patriarchs, the Prophets, in the Hebrew Bible, and all the writings of the Christian Bible (with the exception of the Gospels).

The Assembly sits for the homily.

The Church sits for meditative prayers.

#### Kneeling during the Consecration:

At Mass, the People of God kneel during consecration, unless prevented by lack of space or some other good reason. In the case of the last two, they are required to adopt a reverent posture.

#### These postures are proper for the moments being observed, and they provide orderliness.

These postures also provide uniformity to all who are taking part in the Mass, and act as a show of communality, because the Church gathers in unity.

These postures foster the spiritual attitude of those taking part in the Eucharistic celebration.




