FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT: A:
A TIME FOR DESERT EXPERIENCE"
(Gen:2: 7-9 and 3: 2-7; Romans: 5: 12, 17-19 ;Mat: 4: 1-11)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the book of Genesis. This passage tells us that God created humans out of great love. The first parents, Adam and Eve, were given every facility in the Garden of Eden. But they succumbed to the temptations of the devil and disobeyed God. As a result sin and death came into the world and a rift between humankind and God came to be.

Second reading is from St. Paul's letter to the Romans. In this passage Paul explains to Christians in Rome and us how sin and death came into the world through the disobedience of one person. But Jesus Christ through His obedience, freed humankind from sin and death. We receive the abundance of grace and free gift of righteousness through Jesus.

"Temptations of Jesus"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. In this passage Jesus' desert experience is narrated in the first part. In the second part temptations faced by Jesus from the devil are described in detail.

The devil tempts Jesus in three different ways. The first temptation is to turn stones into bread. It is the temptation to be popular among the hungry masses and get instant fame. Jesus when tempted answers the devil, "Man does not live by bread alone but by the word of God."

The second temptation is to perform a spectacular feat so that He will be acclaimed by the people around Him. The devil tells Jesus "Throw yourself from the pinnacle of the temple because God will send His angels to protect you". Jesus firmly tells the devil, "You shall not tempt the Lord your God".

In the third and final temptation the devil tells Jesus to worship (subject Himself to) the devil. Jesus firmly rejects this temptation too by telling the devil, "You shall worship the Lord your God".

Jesus overcame the temptations and the powers of evil by fasting and prayer. Lent is a grace filled time when all followers of Jesus are invited to renew their lives. We too go to the desert with Jesus to overcome the powers of evil and inclinations to sin.

Mingling of Water and Wine (continued from last week)

Mingling the water and wine symbolizes the Incarnation of Christ:

The incarnation of Christ is the greatest miracle there ever was. Nothing exceeds the miracle of
"The Word" becoming flesh.

Cardinal John Henry Newman says:

"Catholics hold the mystery of the Incarnation as the most stupendous event which ever can take place on earth. And after it happened, and henceforth forever, I do not see how we can scruple at any miracle on the mere ground of its being unlikely to happen. No miracle can be so great as that which took place in the Holy House at Nazareth. It is definitely more difficult to believe than all the miracles ...put together. And there is the grossest inconsistency on the very face of the matter, for anyone so to strain out the gnat and to swallow the camel, as to profess what is inconceivable {the Incarnation}, and yet to protest against what is surely within the limits of intelligent hypothesis {lesser miracles}. If, through divine grace, we once are able to accept the solemn truth that the Supreme Being was born of a mortal woman, what is there to be imagined which can offend us on the ground of its marvelousness?"

When Jesus took on human flesh he humbled himself, so that we could be built up and share completely and inseparably in his divine life. Christ's human will does not resent or oppose, but rather submits to his divine will.

Once water is poured into the wine it is impossible to take it out again. Likewise, Christ is perfect in divinity and perfect in humanity, and his two natures cannot be separated or divided. It is equally true that the Church can never be separated from Jesus, nor Jesus from the Church. This mystical union between Christ and his Church is gained because of the divinity of Christ, who himself is not bound by time nor space. The union between Christ and the faithful is complete at the celebration of the Holy Eucharist.

Mingling the water and wine symbolizes Baptism:

During the Eucharistic celebration, the mixture of water and wine represents the inclusion of us, the faithful, into the mystical body of Christ through our baptism. Again, the water symbolizes our weak humanity and the wine symbolizes the divinity of Christ.

As the presider pours a little water into the chalice he silently prays a prayer that goes all the way back to the fourth century:

"By the mystery of this water and wine, may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity."
 (Saint Athanasius (296-373AD))

Mingling the water and wine symbolizes the water and blood that flowed from the side of Christ on the cross:

Pope Alexander (1107-1155) taught the priests:

"In the Lord's chalice neither wine only nor water only ought to be offered, but both mixed, because we read that both flowed from Christ's side in the Passion."

At the very beginning of time God created Adam. God then caused a deep sleep to fall upon Adam, and God brought forth Eve from Adam's side.

*"Therefore a man leaves his father and mother and cleaves to his wife,
 and they become one flesh." (Genesis 2:24).*

The union of Adam and Eve was the foundation for all marriages, as the two were inseparably united. Likewise, when Christ was "sleeping" on the cross, a Roman soldier pierced Christ's side causing blood and water to flow out, and this became the foundation of the marriage between Christ and his bride, the Church who are also inseparable.

Eve was given life by the miracle of the gift of the flesh of Adam. And the Church received a two-fold gift from the side of Christ (two sacraments) the living water of the Holy Spirit that is given at baptism and the blood of the Eucharist. To be continued... By Fr. 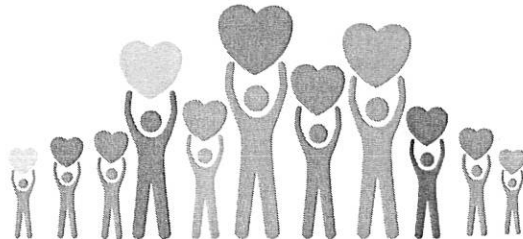

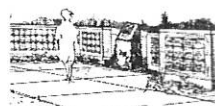
