

### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: A:

JESUS THE GIVER OF LIFE-GIVING WATER (Ex: 17: 3-7; Rom: 5: 1-2, 5-8; Jn: 4: 5-42)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am pleased to see you all though this Homily. Today's first reading is from the book of Exodus. This passage describes the journey of the people of Israel from Egypt to the Promised Land. On their way the people became agitated and angry because they had no water to drink. They revolted and spoke against Moses and the Lord God who brought them out of slavery. The Lord God then commanded Moses to strike a rock and Moses did what was told and immediately water gushed out of the rock and they had plenty of water to drink. The Lord God showed his care and concern for His chosen people in spite of their ungratefulness and lack of trust in Him.

The second reading is from St. Paul's letter to the Romans. In this passage Paul explains to the Christian community in Rome and us that God has proved His extraordinary love for us by the fact that Christ died for us while we are still sinners. God's love is poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit. So God's grace as flowing water is poured down upon each of us.

#### Jesus and the woman at the well

Today's Gospel reading is from St. John. This passage narrates the meeting of Jesus with a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. In a most dramatic move Jesus asks this woman for some water to drink. Samaritans and Jews had a rather hostile relationship at that time.

Jesus, a Jew, asking for water from a Samaritan woman is unusual in that context. Yet the woman after some initial hesitation gives water to Him. Jesus' encounter with the woman gradually changes her attitude to life situations. She shares with Him her sad story - her confused and sinful life. Gradually and gently Jesus makes her realize what she had been running away from. Until now, she was thirsting for transitory and worldly pleasures. Jesus tells her about another kind of water that becomes a fountain from within, leading to eternal life. Similarly, Jesus comes into our lives like a weary, thirsty traveler asking for some water.


Jesus makes inroads into our lives as the one who is helpless and who stands in need of us. What He wants from us is more than water. He thirsts for our hearts. Like the Samaritan woman who brought many people to Jesus let us too go out to surroundings and bring many to the presence of the Lord.

The account of Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well proves unexpected daily occurrences bring about lasting changes in life when Christ is the centre of the experience" -St. Gregory Palamas.

"She (Samaritan woman) exhibited the actions of an Apostle, preaching the Gospel to all and calling them to Jesus and drawing a whole city forth to Him." - St. John Chrysostom.

### Mingling of Water and Wine

#### THE SYMBOLISM OF THE FERMENTUM:

During the Eucharistic Prayer, by the power of the Holy Spirit through the Priest, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ (Transubstantiation). As we partake of his body and blood, we share in Christ's divinity who has already shared in our humanity. This is in fulfillment of Jesus' words:

"He that eats my flesh and drinks my blood dwells in me, and I in him. As the living Father has sent me, and I live by the Father, so he who eats me, even he shall live by me."

- John 6:56-57

The breaking of bread and the commingling of the Body and Blood in the chalice reminds us that the bread of life we receive is a bread that is broken. Just as the bread is broken, Our Lord's Body is broken on the cross, and mingled with his Blood. We are not just eating spiritual food; we are partaking of a sacrifice, a sacrifice voluntarily given so that we might have eternal life. The consecrated wine is not only the Blood; it is Blood that has been spilled for us.

While the priest is breaking the bread to be placed into the chalice of wine, the **Agnus Dei** (Lamb of God) is usually sung by the congregation. This is a highly charged symbol of Christ as our Passover Lamb that is followed by the deeply moving action of everyone present falling to their knees.

#### Christ's power to change physical reality:

Early in Christ's ministry he used the symbol of breaking bread by performing the miracle of feeding the five thousand, and the four thousand. This is of huge significance for Catholics because he thus showed us his power to change physical reality. At the Last Supper he literally was able to change the bread to his body and the wine to his blood. And when he revealed himself after the resurrection through the breaking of bread, he fulfilled his promise of salvation and redemption for all who partake.

"The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the Body of Christ? Because there is one bread we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread". - (I Corinthians 10:16)


