

PALM SUNDAY: A: ENTRY INTO JERUSALEM

(Is: 50: 4-7; Phil: 2: 6-11; Mat26: 14 to 27: 66)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this homily. Today we commemorate the Lord's triumphant entry into the city of Jerusalem. Jesus entered the city to fulfill God's plan of salvation culminating in His suffering and death on the cross.

Gospel for procession: This passage gives a detailed narration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem for the last time. Jesus goes to the city not as a conquering King but as a gentle and humble bearer of good news, travelling on a donkey. People in the city enthusiastically welcome Him with much gladness and gaiety. They sing , "Hosanna to the Son of God!"

The first reading is from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. In this passage Isaiah speaks of his own sufferings in order to carry out his mission. In spite of his sufferings, Isaiah was sustained by the firm belief that God would not abandon him. Sufferings of Isaiah are a pre-figuration of the sufferings of Jesus, the Messiah.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians. In this passage Paul tells us that although Jesus was God, He took on Himself human condition and accepted death on the cross. So God the father has raised Him up and made Him the Lord of heaven and earth.

The passion and sufferings of Jesus

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. This passage gives us a detailed account of the passion and sufferings of the Lord Jesus and how the prophecies of the scriptures are fulfilled. It is amazing to observe that perfectly religious and sane people are capable of siding with evil or doing evil in certain situations. This is very much evident from the happenings on Good Friday when the people who are apparently righteous put Jesus to death or collude with the people who do the crime.

We meet the following people in the Gospel today:

- 1. The Pharisees: These are austere and religious men who devoted all their energy for religion and have a good knowledge of the law. They are very sure of their righteousness which led them to evil.
- 2. Caiaphas: A man who upholds religious orthodoxy and does not want anyone to oppose it.
- 3. Pilate: A man who only thinks about his own chair. He knows Jesus is innocent yet he condemns Him because he is afraid of the Jewish authorities.
- 4. Judas: A disappointed and disillusioned man who thinks it is not wrong to betray his master.
- 5. Peter: A weak and cowardly man. To protect his skin he is ready to disown his master.

Holy week is the time to look at ourselves and find out where we stand in this drama of the Passion of the Lord. It is always easy to condemn others and throw stones at Judas, Peter, Caiaphas, Pilate and the Pharisees.

"Palm Sunday tells us that it is the Cross that is the true tree of life". Pope Benedict XVI.

Baptism at IHM



If you are looking to have your child baptized here at IHM these are the documents we have to have

on file in our office before your Baptism can be scheduled. These are mandated requirements from the Diocese:

- 1. Birth Certificate (state issued) of the child/person being baptized.
- 2. At Least one Godparent must be a Confirmed Catholic. They must submit a baptismal certificate with notations from their parish of baptism.
- 3. A letter from the parent explaining why they want their child baptized, how you plan on living the faith, and what you intend to do to help your child receive all the sacraments.
- 4. A letter from the godparent explaining how they will help their godchild with their faith throughout their life.

A class for parents and godparents may also be required.

The Kiss Of Peace: The Holy Kiss

RECENT RESTORATION

It is only recently that the holy kiss has been restored to the Roman Missal (in 1970) as part of the reforms initiated by Vatican II. In the United States the kiss of Peace is rarely a real kiss. Rather, the congregation is asked to exchange a "sign of peace", which for most people is a handshake or smile and nod. Family members, lovers or close friends might kiss, embrace or touch cheeks in the continental fashion, but the vast majority of people in the U.S. are more reserved, and not as comfortable with it as are Europeans.

When the kiss of Peace was restored to the liturgy in 1970, many people initially found it disconcerting. From their earliest years at Mass they had been trained not to talk in church. Suddenly, in the middle of the most sacred part of the Mass, they were being told to kiss people around them, which immediately got translated into a handshake or making the peace sign. Modern day Catholics slowly accepted the practice, and for some it is one of the high points of the liturgy.

But some complain that exchanging the sign of Peace seems distracting and irreverent, and a few of the more conservative bishops appear to share this view. They argue that before communion, the congregation should be preparing to receive the body and blood of Christ, and not be greeting one another. The worshipers should be facing toward Jesus, not toward one another. This argument against the kiss of peace might imply an individualistic piety that sees the Eucharist as something "between me and Jesus", with the rest of the congregation not relevant to the moment.

Those defending the kiss of Peace respond that there is no better preparation for communion than expressing our love for our neighbor. The kiss of Peace is seen by these people as a gesture of unity and communion that will be sacramentalized when they take communion. You are giving your fellow Parishioners a blessing, wishing Christ's Peace upon them, and also expressing a willingness to share with them the Body and Blood of Christ that you are about to receive.

It is not our own peace that we share, but the peace of Christ, which we just received through the Priest. This peace of Christ is what we share between one another. The Rite of Peace is what our Lord Jesus Christ said to the apostles at the Last Supper:

"My Peace I leave you, my Peace I give you not as the world gives it, but as God gives it."

John 14:27

The Peace of Jesus Christ is the reward of a strong relationship with him and can sustain the faithful even when external circumstances of life are not good. The peace we offer acknowledges that Christ is present in our life and in our neighbor, and it expresses a desire to forgive all hurts and to be at peace with all people.

VARIATIONS

Over time, changes have been allowed, such as the place in the liturgy at which the sign of peace is given. As late as 1995 discussion was still going on about the best place for the kiss of peace in the Mass, and the kiss has a history of being moved around in the order of the liturgy. A quote from Saint Augustine in the fourth century reveals that both the holy kiss and the pater noster came after the sacrifice of the Eucharist:

"When the sacrifice is finished we say the Lord's prayer, which you have received and recited. After this, the "Peace be with you" is said and the Christians embrace one another with the holy kiss. This is a sign of peace, as the lips indicate, let peace be made in your conscience, that is, when your lips draw near to those of your brother, do not let your heart withdraw from his. Hence, these are great and powerful sacraments."




