

# **EASTER SUNDAY: A:**

## "CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUIA"

(Acts: 10: 34 and 37-43; Colo: 3: 1-4; Jn: 20: 1-9)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am well pleased to see you though this Homily. Today's first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles. This passage gives us the powerful and convincing testimony of St. Peter regarding the resurrection of Jesus. He tells us how he was a witness to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. He affirms that the Risen Lord is the saviour of all those who believe in Him as well as the judge of the living and the dead. Everyone who believes in Him will receive forgiveness of sin.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Colossians. In this passage Paul tells us that through our baptism we share in the risen life of Christ through a hidden and mysterious way. As members of the body of Christ we share in the victory of Christ and become a new creation in Him.

# The empty tomb: the sign of the Resurrection of Jesus

Today's Gospel reading is from St. John. The circumstance of the resurrection experiences of the disciples of Jesus are described by St. John in this passage. Gradually the disciples realize that Jesus is indeed risen from the dead.

Early on Sunday morning -after the tragic events on Friday- Mary Magdalene went to the tomb of Jesus to anoint the body of Jesus. It was still dark and she was surprised and shocked to see that the stone which had covered the tomb was rolled away and the body of Jesus was nowhere to be found. She was totally disturbed and she ran to St. Peter and other disciples to tell them about the strange happenings.

Hearing her story Peter and John ran to the tomb to see what happened to the body of Jesus. To their amazement they, too, found that the tomb was indeed empty and the body of Jesus could not be located anywhere. Thus the finding of the empty tomb was the first sign that Jesus was Risen from the dead.

At first the disciples and others could not really believe that Jesus was indeed risen from the dead as he had told them he would be. But gradually they experienced the presence of the risen Lord and came to the firm conviction that Jesus was indeed risen from the dead. After that the risen Lord appeared to several disciples innumerable times and strengthened them in His risen form.

To experience the presence of the risen Lord we too need to go through the empty tomb experience. We need to empty ourselves of our pre-conceived ideas and thoughts - all that hold us away from the Lord. Then we too can experience the risen Lord.

# The Kiss Of Peace: The Holy Kiss

#### VARIATIONS

Over time, changes have been allowed, such as the place in the liturgy at which the sign of peace is given. As late as 1995 discussion was still going on about the best place for the kiss of peace in the Mass, and the kiss has a history of being moved around in the order of the liturgy. A quote from Saint Augustine in the fourth century reveals that both the holy kiss and the pater noster came after the sacrifice of the Eucharist:

"When the sacrifice is finished we say the Lord's prayer, which you have received and recited. After this, the "Peace be with you" is said and the Christians embrace one another with the holy kiss. This is a sign of peace, as the lips indicate, let peace be made in your conscience, that is, when your lips draw near to those of your brother, do not let your heart withdraw from his. Hence, these are great and powerful sacraments."

Saint Augustine's sermon #227

The holy kiss has also inspired other variations during Mass.

- The kiss solemnly exchanged between newlyweds upon completing their vows had its origin with the holy kiss.
- After a baptism the priest will kiss the baby and then allow the family to do the same.
- It is customary at the ordination of a bishop to exchange a kiss, and for a priest to kiss a bishop who is in attendance at a local Mass.
- Kissing of the feet has also always been practiced, but only in special circumstances.
- Throughout history kings would kiss the foot of the Pope, based on the scriptural account of the sinful woman who kissed the feet of Jesus.
- The emotional custom of bestowing a last kiss upon the dying or the dead stems from the kiss of peace. However, in the Council of Auxerre (AD 578) kissing the dead was prohibited.
- When making the sign of the cross, people in Latino communities often kiss a cross formed by placing the thumb and index finger at right angles.
- Kissing the cross (as we do on Good Friday) is an ancient gesture of devotion which implies a humble acceptance of one's own cross in imitation of Jesus.
- Presiders at Mass will kiss the altar, and after the reading of the gospels, the gospel book is kissed.
- I know of Catholic families that have the tradition of giving the kiss of peace to spouse and children before they leave the house for work or school, and at the beginning and end of each day. It extends further to other family members (adult children and their families), friends and others as they enter and leave their home.
- In some families, parents kiss children good night as they put them to bed and siblings do the same to each other.
- In some Parishes, the sign of Peace has been a celebration. Father extended peace to servers and deacons at the altar, then he and deacons would proceed into the congregation to greet as many as possible with the sign of peace, a hug, a kiss on the cheek, a pat on the back or a handshake. In turn those in the front row or end of the pews receiving a sign of peace from Father passed the sign on to those near them. It was quite a long process. Not all parishioners or new-comers approved of it.
- With COVID around, those who never approved of the kiss of Peace find a solid excuse to condemn and root
  it out of the liturgy.
- It is known that many are lax, and respond inadequately, probably because they do not understand the intent of the kiss of Peace. Some are not ready to go beyond a handshake or distant wave.

It is good to re-introduce the sign of Peace, with true sincerity and intent, and without the fear and estrangement which the recent pandemic infused in all.

Thinking of heaven, trust that there will be a lot of Holy Hugging and Holy Kisses once we meet our Heavenly Father, the Saints and our own relatives. It might be a good idea to get used to it now.




