

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: A:

JESUS THE GOOD SHEPHERD

(Acts 2: 14 and 36-41; 1 Pet: 2: 20-25; Jn:10: 1-10)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles. This passage is a part of the testimony of St. Peter on the day of Pentecost. Peter spoke very boldly and courageously about the crucified and the risen Christ who has brought salvation for humankind. He urged everyone to repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus to receive forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. After listening to the exhortation of Peter, a large group of people - about three thousand - received Baptism on that day and accepted Jesus as their saviour and Lord.

The second reading is from the first letter of St. Peter. In this passage Peter exhorts all Christians to be ready to suffer patiently for righteousness. He also tells us that Jesus, our good shepherd, has given us an example by bearing unjust sufferings with patience for the love of us.

"I am the door of the sheepfold"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. John. In this passage Jesus compares His love for His followers to the love of a shepherd for his sheep. He gives us the example of two types of people who enter the sheepfold. The first type is a person who does not enter through the gate of the sheepfold. He is not a shepherd but a thief who comes to steal and to destroy. The second type is a person who enters the through the gate of the sheepfold. He is the shepherd of the sheep. He is the one who knows the sheep by name and takes care of them day and night. He is the good shepherd.

Jesus further adds that He is the door of the sheepfold. Jesus by being the door of the sheepfold gives four kinds of safety and security for His sheep.

- 1. Jesus gives safety to His flock by guarding the sheep from harmful influences from outside.
- 2. Jesus protects the sheep from evil and destructive powers which could harm the flock.
- 3. Jesus protects the sheep from undue worries and anxieties so that His sheep are at peace. Anyone who enters through the door of the sheepfold will have the safety that only Jesus can give.
- 4. Jesus is the door of the sheepfold that leads to the salvation and life eternal. Hence anyone who wants to be saved must pass through the door that is Jesus.

So, Let us too listen to the good shepherd and follow Him so that we too may be found worthy of the salvation promised by the Lord.

"The Good Shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" - John 10:11

Relationship Between the Holy Eucharist and the Sacrament of the Sick and the benefits of their Union

Continued from last week...

The Sacrament of Anointing was formerly called Extreme Unction. "Extreme" refers to those who have an extreme disability or are likely to die: "unction" means oil. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us, "Over the centuries, the Anointing of the Sick was conferred more and more exclusively on those at the point of death. Because of this, it received the name 'Extreme Unction'" (n. 1512). Now, however, those at the point of death are certainly candidates for receiving this Sacrament in a wider sense, such as when someone is very old or seriously ill.

What is the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick? When people are very sick, their spirits sometimes fall under the weight of their illness and they lose hope. It is a time when all they may think about is their pain. They can become exhausted and may be more vulnerable to attacks by the devil. The purpose of the Sacrament is to revive the sick person into awareness that he is not alone, God is with him. The Sacrament gives him hope and strength to carry on. Sometimes the person is healed of his sickness and his health is restored.

Because of the sin of Adam, we all suffer and die. In God's glorious plan, however, suffering and death are to be patiently endured and even embraced. Suffering is a very important means to become holy. Nothing impure can enter Heaven (Rev 21:27). Suffering with resignation purifies the soul and makes it holy and more pleasing to God. The Sacrament enables the sick person to accept God's healing grace and not rebel against his pain and suffering.

The blessed oil used for the anointing of the sick has been blessed by the bishop on Holy Thursday. As the priest anoints the sick person with the blessed oil, he prays: "Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in His love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." The sick person responds, "Amen." The priest says: "May the Lord, Who frees you from sin, save you and raise you up." The sick person responds, "Amen."

If we are in danger of death we should prepare to receive this Sacrament as we prepare for all the Sacraments. When the priest comes, we should make a good Confession by preparing properly for the Sacrament of Penance. We should also say the <u>Acts of Faith, Hope, and Charity</u>, as well as other prayers, such as the Our Father and the Hail Mary. **To be continued next week...**




