

TWELFTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: A: FEARLESS AND COURAGEOUS DISCIPLESHIP

(Jer: 20: 10-13; Rom: 5: 12-15; Mat: 10: 26-33)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the book of the Prophet Jeremiah. In this passage Jeremiah expresses his anguish and pain. Even when surrounded by enemies and faced with terror from every side, Jeremiah places his total trust in the Lord God. He is convinced that the Lord God is on his side.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans. In this passage, Paul explains to the Christians in Rome that sin and death came through Adam, the first man. However freedom and life came through Jesus Christ, the second Adam.

"Fear not, you are of more value than many sparrows"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. In this passage Jesus invites His disciples to be fearless and courageous in the face of rejection and opposition.

The following points are mentioned:

- 1. The message of Jesus is not to be hidden but to be proclaimed openly on the house tops.
- 2. Disciples should not be afraid of those who kill the body. Instead, be afraid of the one who can kill the soul.
- 3. Even a tiny sparrow is taken care of by God. Since we are of more value than many sparrows, we should realize that God is in control of our lives and nothing happens without His knowledge and inspiration.
- 4. Those who acknowledge Jesus and His message openly will be acknowledged by the heavenly Father. Hence, fearless witnessing to Christ will make us worthy to receive eternal reward.

In order to respond wholeheartedly to Jesus' invitation requires great faith, courage and radical commitment. He does not want His disciples to be members of a cowardly Church or a faithless community. He wants us to stand up and be counted for our faith.

have on file in our office before your Baptism can be scheduled.

> These are mandated requirements from the Diocese:

- 1. Birth Certificate (state issued) of the child/ person being baptized.
- 2. At Least one Godparent must be a Confirmed Catholic. They must submit a baptismal certificate with notations from their parish of baptism.
- 3. A letter from the parent explaining why you want your child baptized, how you plan on living the faith, and what you intend to do to help your child receive all the sacraments.
- 4. A letter from the godparent explaining how they will help their godchild with their faith throughout their life.

A class for parents and godparents may also be required.

The Origin of Benediction and Adoration

From the Bible, Benediction means good words or words of blessing. In Genesis 14:19-20 Joseph brought his children to Israel and Israel embraced and *blessed them*. The Lord Jesus place blessing on his future followers saying... "*blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed*." Jn. 2029.

The practice of adoration, which included the people of God formally began in Avignon, France on September 11, 1226. To celebrate and give thanks for the victory over the Albigensians, King Louis VII of France asked the Bishop of Avignon to have the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the Chapel of the Holy Cross. The throng of adorers was so great that the bishop decided to have the adoration continue day and night.

During the Middle Ages, many more of the faithful began to adore the Blessed Sacrament apart from the Mass. At first, the custom was to worship the Holy Eucharist reserved in the tabernacle. Eventually, some came to practice the devotion with the tabernacle doors open. Later still, solemn exposition of the Holy Eucharist, in a monstrance, became the norm. The practice spread through Europe and culminated in the establishment of the *Festum Corporis Chirsti Festus Corpus Domini*—Latin for "the Feast of the Body of Christ"—August 11, 1264. The feast itself, now celebrated each June, helped spread the devotion to the Holy Eucharist. It was not until after the Council of Trent 1545-1563, however, that perpetual adoration began to develop on a worldwide scale. During the Protestant Reformation, church lootings were common, as were desecrations of the Blessed Sacrament. Faithful Catholics made reparation to God by keeping a loving vigil before Him, around the clock. Perpetual adoration became a symbol of constancy in a volatile age.

Throughout Europe and eventually America, new religious orders arose centered on uninterrupted Eucharistic adoration. In the years following the Second Vatican Council, the devotion began to wane, only to rise again in popularity with the encouragement of Pope John Paul II. At 128 years and counting, the Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration have the oldest Adoration program in the United States.




