



THIRTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: A: GOD REWARDS A GRACEFUL GIVER

(2 Kings: 4: 8-11 and 14-16; Rom: 6: 3-4 and 8-11; Mat: 10: 37-42)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the second book of Kings. This passage describes the hospitality of a woman of Shunem. When Prophet Elisha passed through Shunem this woman recognized him as a man of God and showed hospitality by giving him food and drink. Further, she made arrangements for his comfortable stay in her home during his visits. God was pleased by her actions and rewarded her generosity with the promise of a son for whom she was waiting.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans. In this passage Paul explains to the Christian community in Rome about the meaning of baptism in the name of Lord Jesus. To be baptized means that through the grace and power of the risen Lord, we are dead to sin and live in holiness.

"He who receives you receives me"

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. The first part of the Gospel passage speaks about the necessity of following Jesus even to the point of death. And the second part of the Gospel speaks about the virtue of hospitality in the life of a follower of the Lord.

Jesus demands from his followers. A threefold renunciation from his followers.

- 1. He who loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me.
- 2. He who loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me.
- 3. He who does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.

Certainly we need to love our parents, children and near and dear ones. But Jesus makes it absolutely clear that this love of others and of oneself should not be at the cost of loving God. Love of God should take precedence over all our other priorities. Jesus also promises His disciples that hospitality shown to them by anyone will be suitably rewarded - even if that be a glass of cold water.

Sing in the Mass

As Christians, especially, Catholics, we are called to bear witness to Christ, to participate in the Mass, which helps us to be in communion with one another. The purpose of the Mass is to worship, give honor and praise to God, our Father, and Creator, and ask forgiveness for our daily faults and sins. During the celebration of the Mass, we join the heavenly host of Angels and Saints. Look through the walls and the ceiling of The Church and see that at Mass all are joining the Heavenly host of Angels and Saints; this is the closest one will ever come to Heaven while living on this earth.

Singing in one voice with our community fosters unity and brings us closer to God. Music and singing at Mass is a form of prayer that often emerged from the words of scripture. The Mass is a song. We sing to lift up our voices in melody, honor and praise to God the Father. We sing out of pure joy, respect, and confirmation of our belief. "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than that of any other art. The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as a combination of sacred music and words, it forms a necessary or integral part of solemn liturgy." (SC, no. 112).

We do not hesitate to sing, loudly, in fact, and shout with raucous crowds of thousands at sporting events. We let our voices and spirit be heard! Music has a way of piercing deep within our soul. However, when it comes to Catholic Mass, it can be difficult to hear any voices other than the choir members or cantor. Recently, many are joining to sing at Mass, not only through choir but also from the pew, such is commendable. We are to sing to Him and with Him. In this age of distraction, singing has a unique way of bringing your heart, soul, mind, and strength together to focus entirely and completely on God. Singing allows one to become a conduit for spiritual power: a messenger, a vessel, an intermediary. Singing is a talent given by God, for us to use to glorify Him and draw others toward Him. We are to use our talents to offer honor and praise to our Creator. How will you return the gift of your voice to Him: by proclaiming in a loud voice rejoicing.

There maybe several cantors or lead singers near the sanctuary, they are merely the leaders. The parishioners are the choir - each one of us! No one can sing for you. God listens for the sound of your voice for the sound of each of our voices. Just as a parent recognizes the sound of their child's voice in a crowd long before they see them, God also recognizes your voice and takes great joy in hearing it. Will you allow Him to hear your voice in a full participation at Mass?

"He who sings prays twice." St Augustine

Ephesians 5:19 "Be filled with the Spirit addressing one another in psalms and hymns ad spiritual songs, singing and playing to the Lord in your hearts, give thanks always and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to go the Father."

Acts 16: 25 And at midnight **Paul** and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. 26 And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.

Colossians 3:16 "Let the word of Christ control your hearts the peace into which you are called in one body. And be thankful! Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as in all wisdom you teach and admonish one another, singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God."

Revelations 5: 9-14 "They sang a new hymn; "Worthy are you to receive the scroll and to break open its seals, for you were slain and with your blood you purchased for God those from every tribe and tongue, people and nation..."

Zephaniah 3:17 "The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a mighty Savior, Who will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in his love, Who will sing joyfully because of you, as on festival days."


