

FIFTEENTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR: A: FRUITFULNESS OF THE WORD OF GOD (Is: 55: 10-11; Rom: 8: 18-23; Mat: 13: 1-23)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this Homily. Today's first reading is from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. In this passage Isaiah tells us that God cares for the earth by sending rains to make it fruitful. In the same way He sends His Word so that it may bring forth fruit in our lives. Isaiah assures us that the Word of God will not be empty but will surely accomplish its purpose.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Romans. In this passage Paul instructs the Christian community in Rome and all of us that the glory which awaits us in the next life far outweighs all the sufferings and pains of our present times. He further assures us that the whole of creation is eagerly waiting for the liberation and glory which will be accomplished through Christ. In Christ all of us have become adopted sons and daughters and hence we will receive redemption of our mortal bodies.

The parable of the sower

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. In this passage we have the parable of the sower. Jesus compares the Word of God to the seeds that are sown in a field. In the first instance some seeds fell into the pathways. In the second instance some seeds fell on rocky ground and in the third instance some seeds fell on thorny bushes. In all the above three situations the seeds failed to produce the desired results due to various reasons. But in the final instance some seeds fell on good soil and they produced fruits- some thirty, some sixty and some hundred fold.

Jesus told this parable to His listeners to explain to them how the Word of God affects different types of people in the world.

In the later part of the Gospel Jesus explains this parable to His disciples. He highlights four different responses to the Word. As for those who hear the Word of God and do not understand it and the evil one comes and destroys it - they are like those seeds that fell on the road side. Then there are people who hear the Word of God and receive it with joy but when trials and difficulties come their way they give up following the Word- they are like those seeds that fell on rocky ground and failed to produce the desired results. Then there are people who listen to the Word of God but cares of the world choke them and they too fail to produce the desired results- they are like the seeds that fell among thorny bushes.

Finally there are people who hear the Word of God, they accept it and gladly put into practice in their daily lives - they are like seeds that fell on good soil, eventually producing the desired results. The theme of the parable has its echoes in the first reading from Prophet Isaiah that the Word of God is fruitful and will accomplish its purpose. In this context it is worth mentioning that many great works had very humble beginnings like the tiny seeds that fell on the ground.

"It is not always granted to the sower to live to see the harvest. All work that is worth anything is done in faith." - Albert Schweitzer.



THE HOLY EUCHARIST IS THE LOVE OF GOD; BY NADINE DRAKE

Continued from last week...

In the gospel of John, Jesus says "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." (John 6:51) Before Jesus gave us His Body and Blood at the Last Supper He talked about giving it to us out of love; when he said, "whoever eats my Body and drinks my Blood dwells in me and I in him." (Jn. 6:53-58) This union is the highest act of love.

In the Old Testament, God told Moses to have a Passover meal in which a paschal lamb had to be sacrificed and eaten. After the paschal lamb was prepared in hast, the blood of the lamb was to be put on the doorpost and lintel to have the angel of death pass over those houses. The Israelites' firstborns were spared due to the blood of the lamb on their doorposts, Exodus 12:13. The Passover is spoken about in the book of Exodus where it says "they shall eat the flesh that night, roasted; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it." (Exodus 12:8). When they were told about the Passover they were told about it with special instructions of how to prepare the sacrifice and meal. Henceforth the Mass is also laid out in a special way according to the way in which Jesus said.

Out of love for us, God the Father gave us His only Son, Jesus Christ, to be like us in all things, but sin. While on earth Jesus instituted all of the sacraments, but the highest was the Instituting of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper on the day before he was to die. The Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith as Catholics. The Holy Eucharist is the highest of all because it not only gives grace to one who receives Him worthy but also holds the "the Author and Source of all grace, Jesus Christ Himself". The "Holy Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ under the appearances of bread and wine." (Means of Grace). The Holy Eucharist is not only a Sacrament but also a perfect sacrifice that is lasting as long as the appearances are not changed.

The perfect Sacrifice of love is Jesus Christ. On coming to the earth Jesus knew that He was going to suffer, but he accepted it out of love for the Father and us. At the start of Holy Week, Jesus had a lovely welcoming into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. People laid down palms and their clothing for Him to walk on because they knew He was Holy. During that week, however, things changed in people's hearts. Due to the devil, Judas betrayed Jesus for the earthly short-term pleasure of money, just as still do today. From then on Jesus knew that His death was underway, but was not yet ready to undergo the brutal torture, just as we are not ready to die for our faith.

On the night of before he died, Jesus gathered His disciples at a table, then began to wash each of their feet in turn. He washed their feet out of love to show them the way in which to be servant leaders to others. He washed their feet to get them ready for the Sacrifice of the Holy Eucharist. He also washed their feet in order to make them part of Him. He said "If I do not wash you, you have no part in me." (John 13:8). Jesus also shared and created Holy Priesthood by teaching the apostles and feeding them His Body and Blood; and by the mandate: "do this in memory of ME." Again, that night at the table Jesus "took bread, blessed it, and broke it and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Take this and eat: this is My Body." After "He took the chalice with wine in it, blessed and gave it to His disciples, saying, "Drink this all of you: this is My Blood." Then He charged them to "Do this for a commemoration of Me" (Means of Grace). Jesus loved us so much that He gave us His Body and Blood before He was put to death. To this day, we still celebrate this perfect Gift, Sacrament, and Sacrifice that Jesus gave to us: his love for and for the whole world.


