

The Transfiguration of the Lord

THIS IS MY BELOVED SON ... LISTEN TO HIM

My brothers and sisters, today, we have been given the apocalyptic writings of Daniel written from the Babylonian exile about the year 165BC. It coincided with the persecution of the remnant of Israel during the Maccabean revolt. Daniel spent most of his life in the Babylonian exile. His writings as were, as most Jewish apocalyptic scriptures were, meant to bring hope to the suffering people of God. His message to his contemporary Jews and to us is that God has not yet abandoned us. God is aware of our sufferings and will send to us a Messiah "whose dominion is an everlasting dominion … a kingdom that shall not be destroyed.

Saint Peter in today's reading bears witness to the transfiguration: God declares, "This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am pleased." Peter claims that the transfiguration is one of the beacons which strengthens his faith and hope in the moments of tribulation. Each of us should equally have a beacon which strengthens our faith.

But why did Jesus take his most trusted disciples to the mountain? Remember that they were on their way to Jerusalem for his crucifixion. At this time, the concern of Jesus was the lives of his disciples and the survival of his church after the crucifixion. First, he took them to the mountain to teach them that getting to heaven is a challenging task. Through the Transfiguration Jesus prepared the disciples against the scandal of the cross. Jesus knew that his disciples would be shocked by his death on the cross and therefore wished to show them an inkling of his glory; this will help them to know that though his cross would be shameful and painful, it would lead to his glory and their reunion with the Father.

He already announced his death, and his disciples were distraught with untold disappointment. Through his transfiguration, Jesus helped them to know that his death would not be in vain.

The appearance of Moses and Elijah, two main pillars of the Old Testament, symbolized that Jesus is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets; only he can open the seal of the law and the prophets, only he can interpret them with their rightful meaning and application (Revelation 5:1-7). The cloud is not necessarily hiding God from us but an assurance that God who led Israel through the desert is still using his glory to shade his people (Exodus 13:17). And the voice which was heard said of Jesus, "This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favor. Listen to him." This voice reminds us of the same voice during his baptism at the Jordan (Matthew 3:13-17) which also commanded us to listen to Jesus. Jesus is here reconfirmed for his mission.


On our part, in our sufferings, our crosses, we should not give up because Jesus is in charge, he knows our problems. If we lean on him, he will take us to the Father. Second, the transfiguration event is both comforting and challenging to us. It is comforting because we know that our Lord and Savior, Jesus, is truly the Son of God and beloved of the heavenly Father. His relationship with the father will bring us abundant grace. It is a challenge because the Father invites us to listen to His Son and follow His teachings and be intentional witnessing disciples. If we faithfully follow Him, we too will one day experience this heavenly glory in all its beauty for all eternity.



The Saints and Us in the Spirit of the Holy Eucharist

Continued from last week...

Jesus invites us into His own life so that we might be free of whatever burdens weigh us down and keep us from being the person we were created to be. Coming to Jesus is the condition for finding relief. All we need to do is choose to enter into his presence and the pressures that weigh us down begin to dissipate. We know that it is Jesus who bears our crosses, we just follow behind him.

For the early saints, they found personal friendship, intimacy, compassion and God's love in their weakness, unhappiness, and failures and whatever they could call success. We can be the same way too if we allow the divine wind to flow into us. In this self-surrender into God we will find peace and rest. The rest and comfort he wants to give us is not just the end of our earthly struggles or difficulties, but it is a new life in his company, his being, his kingdom: in himself. If we are willing to take upon ourselves the yoke of Jesus we will never be alone, for his yoke is what sets us free. It gives us the strength to face daily chores.

How did the saints do what they did? How did they manage not to be overcome by the anxieties and the weight of the world? How did they keep their heads high even when they truly failed? How did Peter handle his denial of Jesus? (Lk. 22:54-62; Matt. 26:69-75) The woman caught in adultery who later became the disciple of Jesus (Jn. 8:1-11). Paul after killing Christians, (Acts 9:1-19) How were they able to face the critics? (LK 7:38) They allowed themselves to be like a child before God, entrusting themselves to their heavenly Father and accepted His perfect lovely understanding. (Jn. 21:15-17) They came to Jesus as they were to be with him and they found freedom in his yoke. (Jn. 21:15-17) Each of us in our own lives and unique situations, are called to do the very same! Relax, be still and let God reveal himself to you and you will find the greatest love, hope and peace you could ever imagine. He says to us: "be still and know that I am God" (Ps. 46:1). God is in control, he is in-charge my dear. Let go of self and external distractions and make a dwelling in Him who has already possessed you in the Holy Eucharist.




