

## SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: B: PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

(Is: 40: 1-5 & 9-11; 2 Pet: 3: 8-14; Mk: 1: 1-8)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all through this homily. Today's first reading is from the book of Prophet Isaiah. Isaiah speaks about the great blessings the Lord God is going to bring in the lives of His chosen people when they return from Babylonian captivity. They are urged to prepare the way of the Lord and make straight a highway for the Lord by leveling the mountains and hills and all uneven grounds. This theme of how to prepare the way of the Lord is explained and expanded in today's Gospel reading.

The second reading is from the second letter of St. Peter. Peter speaks about the second coming of the Lord Jesus. At His coming, Christ will establish a new heaven and a new earth. For that we should prepare ourselves by living our lives in holiness and godliness. The Apostle warns us that if the Lord appears to be slow in coming, it is only for all people to have a chance to repent and be ready to meet Him when He comes.

#### John the Baptist: The voice of the one crying in the desert.

Today's Gospel reading is from the first chapter of St. Mark. It introduces and elaborates the mission and life of John the Baptist. John announces the imminent coming of the Saviour and all people are invited to prepare for His coming. Later he introduces Jesus to the people. John worked no miracles and held no office of repute. He did not belong to any influential group of that time. Yet his importance to Jesus was very unique. He is the only religious leader whom Jesus sought and spoke to with affection and admiration. He is described as a voice crying in the wilderness. John introduces Jesus as someone who is more powerful than he. John understands that his own importance is directly related to the greatness of Jesus.

John is challenging all of us during this advent to prepare the way of the Lord and to foster greatness in others without feeling threatened about our own importance. John was a voice crying in the wilderness, a lonely voice that many choose to ignore. Today also there are many lonely voices in this world that go unheeded.

### Stewardship in the Eucharistic Covenant

Continued from last week...

Many people through history have been used as God's conduit in service of God and humanity: Hugo Junkers created the first passenger aircraft which made traveling around the world more possible. Marie Curie showed the world how to treat tumors with radiation and helped to create the x-ray machine, which has positively changed the world of medicine. God gave us Michelangelo to beautify our world, culture, and faith. Mother Theresa was a gift to the world for healing, hope, compassion and to match the faces of those suffering to that of Jesus when he hung on the cross. Garrett Morgan gave the world the three way traffic signal which helps traffic flow. Sister Elizabeth Seton, was a model of Catholic education. Pope Benedict, Joseph Ratzinger's theological insight changed the science of theology, Fulton J. Sheen was a teaching Bishop; finally each of us does our part to participate as instruments of God. Paul speaks of himself as a "steward" of the Gospel. He has received the "good news" from the Lord, and it has been given to him so that he can share it with others. All of us are God's stewards, because everything that exists was created by God and belongs to Him. It is God who continually keeps it in existence. "In God we live, we move and we have our being." God has empowered us to use all the resources he has given us in the service of his creation, the world, and his mission the Church. In establishing his church, the Lord Jesus first gathered those he called apostles whom he groomed for three years. They were ordinary fishermen, tax collectors and from other walks of life. They possessed no special talents nor were they wealthy in the eyes of the world. When Jesus called them, He said "Come, follow me." They left everything and followed him It was a personal invitation to each of them.

The life and role of those early stewards help us regroup ourselves and be better girded for the tasks ahead. The primary mission of Jesus, the Lord, is to bring all humanity into the house of God. It was his intention to build a united world, carrying out his mission. First, he lavishes His grace on humanity, so that humanity can be better fortified to transform creation into the blessedness of God. Second, the stewardship of the apostolic ministry was to redirect the Jews into an inclusive worship, to bring the entire world into the worship of one God, thereby transforming their understanding of God and to advance His kingdom to include all people. To do this, they first and radically inspired the new Jewish church to embrace an innovative mindset of oneness in God the father of all people. The apostles transformed the Jewish culture and incorporating the Gentiles into the faith without shoving the Decalogue down their throats, (Acts 15.) They further transformed things, which already existed in the Jewish culture such as the Pascal feast into Easter and Pentecost into the birthday of the Church.

Therefore, three models of apostolic stewardship contributed to the survival and growth of the Church namely: pioneering something new, such as Paul in the subject of circumcision (Acts 15:1-35.), reforming things already existing, and maintaining and preserving the mission of Christ. (Acts, 1:21-26; Acts 6:1-15). Hence, Paul became the pioneer steward of apostolic mission outside Judea, starting new Churches and new ways of life and became the apostle to the gentiles. Peter reformed Judaism by helping Jewish converts to move from circumcision and Levitical laws to accept the law of love in Jesus: "a new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (Jn. 12:23f).

in the second reading, tells us to conduct ourselves in holiness and devotion, waiting for the day of the Lord.


In the Gospel reading we hear about Saint John the Baptist preparing the people for the coming of Christ.






