

THE FEAST OF EPIPHANY: B:

THE VISIT OF THE THREE WISE MEN (Is: 60: 1-6; Eph: 3: 2-3 & 5-6; Mt: 2: 1-12)

Dear friends in Jesus Christ,

I am very happy to see you all after the Holidays Season. Today's first reading is from the book of the Prophet Isaiah. This passage refers to the joyful return of the people in exile to the holy city of Jerusalem. They find their beloved Jerusalem in ruins. Isaiah encourages them and cheers them up with a vision of a future restored city. The second part of the passage is about the final pilgrimage of the people of God to the heavenly Jerusalem. This prophecy of Isaiah has some echoes in today's feast of Epiphany.

The second reading is from the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians. In this passage Paul explains to the Christian community in Ephesus that God invites the Jews and Gentiles to share on an equal footing the salvation brought by Christ. The feast of Epiphany reminds us of God's invitation to all people to be part of the salvific event without any distinction of social standing or place of origin. The Church is complete only when both Jews and gentiles live in harmony as members of the body of Christ.

Epiphany: The manifestation of the Lord.

Today's Gospel reading is from St. Matthew. This passage gives us an account of how the three wise men from the east came to pay homage to infant Jesus at Bethlehem. They paid homage and offered their precious gifts to the divine child. Jewish leaders ignored or rejected the infant in the manger and some of them even plotted to kill him.

These three men left their homeland in search of the child. This story of the three wise men is a story of all genuine faith seekers. They left everything precious to them and were guided by a star. They diligently searched for the child Jesus until they found the child and His mother. When they found Him they worshipped Him. Thus the Gospel story gives us three important messages:

- 1. It speaks of the journey of the three wise men from the east to Jerusalem. This journey of theirs is a symbol of search for truth by genuine seekers of God.
- 2. The meeting between the wise men and King Herod tells us that people in authority and power try to suppress and even destroy God's messengers for their own selfish reasons.
- 3. The wise men paying homage to the child Jesus is a touching story of all moments of grace and their total surrender to the Almighty.

I wish you all to Have a Continued grace filled New Year and Blessed weekend to you all. May God Bless you all. Fr. Selva.

INCENSE

Etymology: Incense is an aromatic biotic substance, which releases fragrant smoke when burnt. The word incense is used to describe the aromatic fragrance or materials used for the ritual. Materials for incense resemble tree resin native to Africa, Asia and India. Since the prehistoric era, people have burned the balsamic tree parts for multiple purposes. To understand the origin of the word incense, a more modern word, perfume, would be helpful. The word perfume is a translation from ancient French word *perfumar*, which means through smoke, and the Latin word *incendere* burning. The first historical documentation of incense was around 6000 BC.

The modern history of incense is also associated with spirituality, rituals and hygienic purposes. Incense was used in Africa, southern Asia, and especially in India, long before being used in other parts of the world. It reached ancient China around 2000 BC for the purpose of prayer and worship. Before the children of Israel were in Egypt, aromatic trees and leaves were burned for religious purposes, on the streets when a dignitary was passing and for respiratory hygienic purposes, particularly in the Middle East, Egypt, Arabia, Syria, & Mesopotamia. It was part of the ingredients used in communicating to deities and for mummification in Egypt. The ancient Egyptians used a variety of aromatic resins and woods, like frankincense and myrrh, in their elaborate religious ceremonies. They believed the smoke carried their prayers and offerings to the gods, while also purifying the air and warding off evil spirits. By 754 AD Tang Chinese and Japanese priests and monks blended incense balls for medical purposes. The use of incense transformed from its use as a fragrance into a medical remedy and introduced a thriving incense culture through China to Japan. Later, around the 8th century, incense went through another need-based transformation of graceful aromatic pleasure. The sanitation of the ancient world was not perfect. Incense was used in everyday life to combat odors. Wealthy nobles employed skillful fragrance extractors for the purpose of making sophisticated fragrances to be used in different seasons and for different occasions as needed. The burning of incense was common and universal To be continued... across history.

The Magi Come to Worship Jesus




Today we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany, which is when the Magi, or wise men, of the East came to find and worship Baby
