

I have been to Medjugorje 3 times and with each trip, we were told not to expect too much or to think something miraculous would happen to you. Not until my third time in did I have a miracle. My prayer at Adoration was to experience the ability to be still and know that He is God. Each moment I spent in front of our Lord, (which was daily) it got longer and longer until it was time for the Blessed Sacrament to be reposed. Sadly I had to leave. I have our Lord to thank for the gift of being able to sit still, to be at peace, and to prayerfully concentrate on spending time with Him and know that He is God. No longer did I have extraneous thoughts fill my head nor did I sit in the pew as though I was on thumb tacks squirming like a little child. That was my miracle.

When I go to Adoration now, I relive the peace and calm that I had in Medjugorje. Experiencing Medjugorje was my most memorable Adoration and one I will never forget. It brought me closer to Him.

As we were told before we arrived in Medjugorje, do not expect too much or expect a miracle to happen - just go and be in His presence. Our Lord will take care of the rest. 


