Meditation

Listening To the Readings

A very interesting study is to see how often the Old Testament predicts what will happen during the life of Christ, especially the events of His passion. There are many comparisons in the 22nd chapter of Genesis (the story of Abraham's test to sacrifice his son) that mirror Christ's sacrifice.

For example, in verse 2, God says to Abraham, "Take your son...whom you love...offer him up as a burnt sacrifice." Is God not also offering His Son as a sacrifice to save us all? Then in verse 5, Abraham says to his men, "stay here...while the boy and I go over there." In Matthew 26:36, Jesus tells His disciples, "Sit here while I go over there to pray." A comparison of Genesis 22 and several passages from the Gospels offer many more examples.

In our Mass, the first reading from the Old Testament and the Gospel from the New Testament complement each other. We need to pay attention to the first reading to anticipate what is coming in the Gospel. We can understand then why the Jewish followers of Jesus saw Him as the fulfillment of everything that had been written in the Law and by the prophets.

Dearest Lord, help us to focus on your readings that we may see and understand your promises to us.
