## Meditation Oh, You of Little Faith

Today we hear the story of Jesus walking on the water and Peter's lack of faith. Bishop Robert Baron points out that the Gospel writers report historic moments in the lives of Jesus in a way that brings out the full theological significance.

In this particular Gospel, Matthew talks about Jesus going up a mountain by himself to pray. This is interpreted as Jesus going to the right hand of God to intercede for his church below. As he is praying, the apostles set out in a boat with Peter as the leader to cross to the other side of the Sea of Galilee. This gathering of the disciples in the boat represents the Church. Their journey symbolizes the passage of the followers of Jesus through time. As the church travels through time, it encounters many rough times, and this is represented by the storm that arises.

Jesus, however, comes to save his disciples (the church) by walking on the waters towards them. Our Lord calls out to Peter to join him. When Peter, representing the Church, trusts in Jesus, he finds stability. When we take our eyes off Jesus, we begin to be lost. We must focus on the Lord and not the storm around us.

When Jesus enters the boat, the winds calm. Likewise, when we are past the storms of life in heaven, we can give ourselves entirely to the praise of God.
