REFLECTIONS WITH FATHER MICHAEL: WHAT I SAW FROM MY RECENT TRIP TO AFRICA! Part 3

Before we delve into the final segment of what I saw during my recent trip to Africa, let us first wish ourselves, HAPPY EASTER! May God's abiding and transforming grace be with us all as we swim in God's unfailing guide and protection during this rich Easter season! May the daily challenges of life never push any of us to despair or to a negative mindset! May we never forget that the good Shepherd will never abandon us, no matter the situation we find ourselves! Without a doubt, Easter proves that God's love is amazing and beyond description. Hallelujah! Therefore, let nothing force a follower of Christ to lose hope or become bitter. Our God never fails.

Now, back to the final segment of our series of reflections on my recent African trip in December 2023. We may recall that our March reflections ended with a mention of the wedding of my nephew, Christopher. It was a wedding that I won't easily forget for a long time. Why? Because of what happened on the eve of the wedding, as well as on the wedding day itself, on December 28.

On December 27, at about 4pm, I accompanied a pastor at one of the nearby parishes to go to settle a serious family problem involving a very devout man and his wife. It is a long and complicated story to narrate in detail here, but the summary is, the man's wife was ganging up with two of their adult children to literally "wage war" against the man and the only daughter. Why? Because the man refused his wife's plan to persuade the daughter to follow other girls into prostitution in order to provide financial help to the struggling family. On account of the refusal, both the wife and her two adult children became very angry with him and began to ostracize him, calling him, "holier than Jesus." It even reached a point that he wasn't eating food in the house. He and the daughter were purchasing meals outside most of the time. The situation was ugly, all because the man bluntly refused to follow the suggestion of the wife to persuade the daughter to follow others to travel to Europe to engage in prostitution to make quick money to support the family. The wife was said to be constantly comparing the family with other families where their daughters were making quick money while her own family continued to suffer much hardship.

Family hardship can be a terrible thing, because it can easily bring disaster to some members of the family whose faith isn't firmly anchored in the Lord. Hence, I wasn't unduly shocked when that innocent man opened up and narrated in detail how financial struggles have led his wife and their two sons to conceive corrupt and unchristian thoughts as they tried to force their innocent daughter into bad practices. Fortunately, the brave girl sided with her dad and would have nothing to do with the ugly plots from her mother and brothers. For that reason, she and her dad were singled out for "persecution" as "losers" and as people who wanted to be "holier than Jesus"! How sad indeed! But thank God that we still have people with Christian conscience, folks who value their allegiance to Christ more than their need for money. The man and his young daughter were a great inspiration to me and my fellow priest. To me, they symbolized what it's meant to be "prophets and martyrs." They were poor, but rich in God's sight. What a blessing!

As one would expect, the man's wife tried to deny the serious allegations in our presence. According to her, the main problem in the family was because of husband's "utter failure" to live up to his duty as head of the family and a reliable breadwinner. For that reason, he has needlessly plunged the family into avoidable hardships. Can both be telling the truth? I have my doubts, especially when the husband advised us to try to find out the truth from the daughter, which we later did. Truth always prevails in the end! May Christ Jesus have mercy on us, Christians for some of the things we do that put him to shame!

The good news is, although we did not completely settle the conflicts that day, it was agreed that the couple would meet with the pastor regularly on every first Friday of the month, after Mass, to continue the discussions until the issues are fully dealt with. The willingness of all the parties to embark on this journey was at least half the solution of the family problem. Also, the pastor promised to offer holy Mass for the family every first Friday and every last Sunday of the month until peace returned to the family.

For my part, I advised the brave daughter to make sure to be listed among the Mary League girls for constant support and strength in her courageous Christian struggle. In addition, I promised that I would help in any way I could to secure some financial assistance whenever she got admission to a college to study Law which she said was one of her main dreams in life. According to her dad, she has been an honor student since she started her high school two years ago.

Overall, my priest colleague and I were glad that our visit to that family wasn't a waste of time. We sowed the seed, but the Lord would give the increase through his grace. But, come to think about it, isn't it amazing what is going on in our world these days, even among some Catholic families? Who would think that a Catholic family such as that would be going through those nasty conflicts? Indeed, not everything that glitters is gold! That incident on December 27, 2023, opened my eyes to realize that an innocent person could be suffering silent "persecution" in his or family regularly simply because of the refusal to toe the path of the world. May God save his people!

As if that incident on the eve of the wedding wasn't enough, at the wedding Mass itself, during the homily, one of the bridesmaids was doing something completely out of line in a church service. What was she doing? She was busy looking at her small mirror and rubbing her make-ups as if she was in her private bedroom! One of her colleagues on the same pew gently tapped her on the shoulder to make her stop what she was doing, but she became angry and said to her, "leave me alone, you holy angel!" That attracted the attention of one of the ushers who promptly and politely intervened and saved everybody any further disorderly behavior. What a crazy world we live in these days! It is a world where values seem to be upside-down. Is our world rapidly coming to an end? Not necessarily. But the truth of the matter is, we children of God must "shine their eyes" as some African youths advise nowadays. In other words, we must be more alert and vigilant these days than in the past, and guard ourselves from wrong and evil influences that are now very prevalent in our world. Unless we are careful, we might be carried away by the many bad influences in our world today. As we all know, bad influences have no boundaries because they can hide in palaces, homes of ordinary people, kitchens, and even inside our churches! So, in the words of some modern African youths in southern Nigeria, it is important to, "Shine your eyes!" Simply put, don't be deceived.

Thank God, the rest of the marriage ceremony went very well. Christopher, my nephew, and his smiling wife conducted themselves very well both at the Mass and at the reception afterwards. The meal at the party was delicious and classy. I sat at the same table with the four priests that concelebrated at the Mass. We all had a good time, eating assorted dishes, and drinking choice wine. Without a doubt, I was glad I was able to preside at that beautiful wedding despite the lingering pain in my dislocated right hand during that period. To God be the glory that by his grace I made it to the end!

It turned out that the wedding was one of my major final acts before I flew back to Michigan in January where I was quickly welcomed by the snowstorm. Thanks be to God, however, that my return journey did not witness any usual rough air, like the one that occurred on my way home in mid -December. What a difference a month could make!

In conclusion, a number of things stood out during my recent trip, namely, the air turbulence on my way home, the many changes that I noticed at the airports, especially in my homeland, the lack of internet access during most of my stay in the village, the amazing friendliness and love of my village people flocking to greet and welcome me home, the official blessing of our newly completed village hall, the heroic act of the devout Catholic father and the young daughter, and of course, the climatic wedding events of my nephew. These memories will linger in my mind for a long time. Wishing everyone once more a Happy Easter. May the Lord be praised both now and always. Amen!




