Genuine Peace of Mind Comes from Knowing Four Things

Peace of mind is something we all long for. In a world that often feels chaotic and uncertain, we yearn for something steady, something that keeps us grounded when life doesn't go according to plan. As people of faith, we learn that peace doesn't come from perfect circumstances, but from trusting in the deeper truths God reveals to us along the way.

One of those truths is that we cannot always get what we want and/or when we want it. No matter how hard we work, how much we pray, or how strong our desire, life has its own rhythm. Sometimes doors don't open when we expect them to. Sometimes answers don't come right away. This can be frustrating, even painful, but it's also where we learn patience and trust. God's timing is not always our timing, but it is always purposeful. Delays are not denials. They are often divine pauses, allowing something better to unfold. Another truth we must accept is that we cannot always win in life!! We must experience defeat or failure at certain times, no matter how good we are. No one is exempt from setbacks. Even the most faithful, talented, and well-intentioned people face moments of loss and disappointment. But failure is not the end, it is a teacher. It humbles us, refines us, and invites us to lean more fully on God. In our weakness, we discover His strength. And in our defeats, we often grow in ways that comfort and success could never accomplish.

Then there is the reality that everything in life is about interest, and with interest comes purpose! What stirs your heart? What captures your attention and draws your passion? Those things aren't random. They are often gentle nudges from the Holy Spirit, pointing you toward your calling. When we invest ourselves in what we genuinely care about, in service, in learning, in relationships, we find meaning.

We begin to live with a sense of direction, not just for ourselves, but for how we can impact others. Purpose fuels peace because it helps us live intentionally, knowing our lives matter.

And finally, God is always in control even when it doesn't appear so!! Just do your best and allow the rest for God!! This truth anchors everything. There will be moments when life feels out of control, when nothing makes sense, and when our efforts seem small. But even then, God is working behind the scenes. He sees what we don't. He knows what we need. Our job isn't to have all the answers, it's to be faithful. To do what we can with love and integrity, and to release the rest into His hands. That kind of surrender brings peace, not the peace the world gives, but the peace that only comes from walking with God .

So when life feels overwhelming, uncertain, or unfair, remember these four truths. Let them steady your heart. Genuine peace of mind isn't found in controlling every outcome, it's found in trusting the One who holds it all.

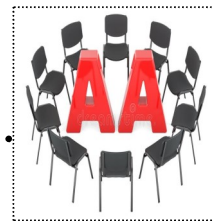

Director of Engagement / Family Ministry Primary Function

Professional who assists parishioners by equipping them for the service of the Gospel of Jesus Christ; oversees programs that evangelize the evangelizers using the process of encounter, grow, and witness; helps parishioners to discern their charisms for ministry; focuses parish and Family efforts to reach out to unchurched Christians and people of other faiths; ensures effective and responsive communications to all those engaged with or seeking engagement with the Church; oversees the radical hospitality for all parish events and programs; develops evangelization initiatives and collaborates with the team so evangelization is integrated throughout the other areas; works closely with the Director of Discipleship Formation and Director of Family Ministries, helping to move individuals and families from the “attract” and “encounter” stages of evangelization into the “grow” and “witness” phases of discipleship formation. Professional who assists families living as domestic church; focuses on ministries that assist struggling families; assures the connection between family life and evangelization and Christian service; facilitates the use of existing parish programs and events as opportunities for families to encounter Jesus anew, grow daily as his disciples, and give witness to the power of His mercy; promotes and supports vocations in the Family of Parishes and the Catholic Schools within its boundaries; works closely with the Director of Engagement and Director of Discipleship Formation, helping to move individuals and families from the “encounter” stages of evangelization into the “grow” and “witness” phases of discipleship formation. Understands the significance of cultural diversity in evangelization and ministry.

Director of Discipleship Formation Primary Function

Professional who oversees all aspects of discipleship formation in the Family, with emphasis on encounter, grow, and witness; gives direction and vision for catechesis in the parish within the age groups (children, youth, young adult, and adult faith formation), engages parents as the primary educators of their children; coordinates sacramental preparation programs; where applicable works collaboratively with Catholic school principal and staff regarding catechetical programs in the Catholic schools; acts as a resource for parish programs in the area of catechesis. Works closely with the Director of Engagement, Director of Sacred Worship, and Director of Family Ministries, helping to move individuals and families from the “encounter” stages of evangelization into the “grow” and “witness” phases of discipleship formation. Attention should be given to sensitivity to cultural diversity.

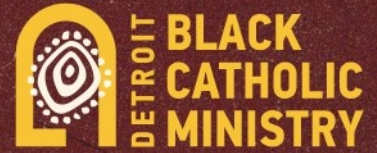
