THE HOPE WHICH DOES NOT FAIL

According to an ancient tradition, the Pope proclaims a Jubilee every twenty-five years. The present Jubilee Year began on the 24th of December 2024, when Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica, Rome, and it will conclude on January 6th, 2026, the Feast of the Epiphany, with the closing of the Holy Door.

For this Holy Year, the late pontiff directed that we reflect on the theme of "Hope." One of the primary scriptural texts to be used during this Holy Year is St. Paul's letter to the Romans, particularly where he stated, "Hope does not disappoint..." (Rom. 5:5).

In Christian tradition, there are three theological virtues, namely: Faith, Hope, and Charity. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (CCC 1817). Hope entails an act of the will and, by its very nature, speaks of future things. Hope has its origin, motive, and object in God. Hope does not come as the product of repeated actions or the outcome of our own industry; rather, hope is an infused virtue. As such, the virtue of hope is bestowed on us through the grace of the Holy Spirit, received at baptism.

Pope Francis notes, "By his perennial presence in the life of the pilgrim Church, the Holy Spirit illumines all believers with the light of hope. He keeps that light burning, like an ever-burning lamp, to sustain and invigorate our lives. Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love: 'Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril or the sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord'" (Rom. 8:35, 37–39).

Here we see the reason why this hope perseveres in the midst of trials: founded on faith and nurtured by charity, it enables us to press forward in life. As Saint Augustine observes: "Whatever our state of life, we cannot live without these three dispositions of the soul, namely, to believe, to hope and to love" (Spes Non Confundit, no. 3).

Therefore, when faced with the challenges of faith, trials of everyday life, or difficulties that are overwhelming, let us remember to bank on that "Hope" which never fails. This hope is ever reliable because it is a product of love, founded on faith, and opposed to despair and presumption. As "Pilgrims of Hope," let us go forth courageously, preaching and living out the virtue of hope in our world.
