



"Just one thing: forgetting what lies behind but straining forward to what lies ahead, I continue my pursuit toward the goal, the prize of God's upward calling, in Christ Jesus."

Do you know anyone who loves to dwell in the past thinking things will be like they used to be in "the good old days." It's nice to reminisce and share how those memories made us feel but those memories prevent us from living in the "here-and-now" and trying to grow with God now. I know people who love to dig up the past, especially when they can remind me of my mistakes and failures. Sometimes I feel as though they hope to prevent me from moving forward so they are not left in the past alone. When we allow ourselves to get caught up in this kind of behavior, it can become very easy to lose sight of what God has planned for our future. When God is working in our lives, things change. Some things die and other things come to life or begin to grow. The readings today speak as a reminder that Jesus came to free us from our past mistakes and lead us to a future with him. Jesus was an encourager and he teaches us to be the same in whatever circumstance we find ourselves. True encouragers help us to forgive others and ourselves, appreciate the blessings in our lives, and motivate us to move forward beyond the past and live in the here-and-now with hope for the future. A true encourager will inspire us to make changes in our lives, our families, our places of work and our parish so that we can unleash the hidden potential God has planned for us. Jesus was very present to the sinful woman in the gospel today. He did not focus on her past as the Pharisees did. He forgave her where she presently was and encouraged her not to sin again. His actions gave her hope for the future. Together we can come to know God's love and mercy where we are now and his plans for us, but only if we are willing to "Let Go and Let God" and we encourage others to do the same.

This past Tuesday I met with the Pastoral and Finance Councils to discuss the parish raffle and the proceeds when it is completed. After an informative discussion about the parish finances and the current state of the parish resulting from the love and generosity of our parishioners, it was decided and a consensus reached, that giving 100% of the raffle profits to the relief efforts in Ukraine was a wonderful opportunity for our parish to live the Lenten Gospel message by continuing to pray for the victims of the war in Ukraine as we do at Mass, fast from spending money on unnecessary parish expenses this Lent and give alms in the form of donating our raffle proceeds to help ease some of the suffering for the victims of the war. All of this is made possible because of your continued love and generosity to the parish and to those in need. Our parish is centered on the Gospel pointing us to what God has done through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection for us, what we are preparing to celebrate this Lent and Easter. His Love and mercy changes our lives causing us to want to love and serve him by loving and serving others. Being gospel-centered means recognizing that everything flows out from and points back to what God has done for us in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. I am blessed to be part of a parish family that recognizes His Love and mercy and responds to It by extending It to others. Together, we can do great things by "Letting Go and Letting God!"

Jesus teaches us through dilemmas. The Scribes and Pharisees frequently tried to trap Jesus by presenting Him with impossible problems.



In the story of the woman

captured after committing adultery they try to put Him in an impossible situation. Should He uphold the traditional demand of the Mosaic law He would condemn her to death by stoning. This practice was forbidden by the Romans who claimed the sole right to impose capital punishment. If Jesus simply forgave her sin He would violate the Mosaic law. The Scribes and Pharisees thought they had Jesus trapped until Jesus turned the tables and said, "let the one among you without sin be the first to cast a stone at her." The trappers were trapped since, as Jesus reminded them, no one is without sin.

Jesus warns us of judging others and teaches us to forgive as we want and need to be forgiven. When confronted with their own sins and weaknesses the crowd leaves one by one beginning with the eldest. When no one is left except Jesus and the Woman He asks, "has no one condemned you" and then tells her "I do not condemn you, go and avoid this sin in the future."

What began as a trap for Jesus can be a trap for all of us who, when we learn of some one's weakness or sin, leads us to sit in judgement or condemnation and forget to escape the dilemma by imitating Jesus. When we are presented with an impossible choice what are we to do? Only God knows all the circumstances and can justly judge. The crowd gave no thought about bringing shame or even death on the woman but soon discover their own weaknesses and sin. Jesus gift of forgiveness means all things are made new.

One afternoon the priest was getting ready to hear confessions. As he was entering the confessional room, which had a divider in it, he found a man already sitting in the room waiting for him. The man told the parish priest, "It's been 45 years since I've been to

confession. I am impressed how things have changed. The room is well lit, it has a nice easy chair to sit in, a bottle of scotch, and some nice cigars. It wasn't that way the last time I went." The parish priest said, "yes, it is rather comfortable, but where you are sitting is my side of the confessional room."

Now I mention the confessional because today's reading reflects on the woman caught in adultery and about to be stoned. As you know Jesus knelt and wrote in the sand on the floor. What he wrote is a mystery. Many have tried to figure it out. Was it the sins of her accusers? Was it a scripture? We will never know, I'm sure, until we are able to ask Jesus when we get to heaven.

For me this is an example of the confessional. Jesus knew the sin. He was able to achieve forgiveness from all her accusers by what ever was written in the dust of the floor. He was able to offer His forgiveness for the hurt of the world for her sin.

If Jesus ever said to us, "let the one among you who is without sin cast the first stone," we would all have to walk away. We are all sinners. We are all in need of God's mercy and love. That is why Christ came to us, as he came to the woman in the Gospel. So next Sunday, as we begin to recall Jesus' entry into Jerusalem and his Passion, give him all praise and thanksgiving for all he has done to reclaim our redemption, our salvation.

From the Music and Worship Department...

Ask the Liturgist



Question: Why is it that the date for Christmas never changes and yet the date for Easter always does?

We have to go back to the reign of Constantine, who was the first emperor of Rome to convert to Christianity. The Church in Rome began formally celebrating Christmas on

December 25 in 336 AD, during the reign of Constantine. Constantine made Christianity the effective religion of the empire. Some historians speculate that by choosing this date Constantine wanted to offset or weaken established pagan celebrations held around the same time.

Now to the subject of Easter, which is a movable date. Constantine also convened the First Council of Nicaea. It was a council of Christian bishops who met in the Bithynian city of Nicaea (in Turkey) in 325 AD. This ecumenical council was the first effort to attain consensus in the Church through an assembly representing all Christendom. The decision by the council was that Easter be

observed on the Sunday following the **first full moon after the spring equinox**.

The spring equinox marks the start of the spring season in the northern half of the globe. In modern terms, after this date, the Northern Hemisphere begins to be tilted more toward the Sun, resulting in increasing daylight hours and warming temperatures.

Easter this year happens just one day after April's full Moon (Saturday, April 16), which is the first full Moon to occur after the spring equinox (March 20, 2022). This is known in the Christian calendar as the "Paschal Full Moon." To make a long story short, Easter always occurs on the first Sunday after the Paschal Full Moon, and that date changes every year. Easter Sunday this year falls on April 17, in 2023 on April 9, in 2024 on March 31, and in 2025 on April 20.

A little Easter trivia: The earliest Easter date in the 21st century came in the year 2008 (March 23, 2008). Another March 23 Easter won't come again until the year 2160!




