




The Social Pastor!

“Fr. You seem to spend a lot of energy over fish fry’s, festivals and picnics more than other issues of the parish.” I’ve hear it said in the past at a former parish as well. Some people have told me personally that they felt I was too much of a social priest. When I ask what that meant, the response was that I spent too much time worrying about social events for the parish instead of worrying about other, more important things. I admit that I do like to socialize and enjoy parish celebrations a lot but it is because those celebrations and events are where we are able to get to know other members of our parish and their families. As a pastor, I am fully aware of the many “other things” that are important, things like prayer groups, bible studies, men’s fellowship, etc.

As a pastor who is a communications major I also know the importance of getting to know others from the parish and feeling connected to one another outside of the celebration of Mass so that we feel **even more connected to one another during Mass**. This is especially true for us as a fairly new and large parish. We may seem to be having a lot of social events and we may seem to celebrate more than other parishes but it is for a good reason. When we celebrate fellowship we become friends, some new friends and some old friends but either way, we become **church friends**. We recognize our church friends at places like the local grocery store and other places outside of the parish, it gives us a sense of being connected to “*something greater*.” That “*something greater*” is the **Body of Christ**, our parish! I believe there is nothing like church friends, people who are there with you to celebrate the good times and walk with you during the tough times of life. I share with you, an article I once read in a 2012 issue of Our Sunday Visitor Newsweekly titled, “**Are you lonely in your parish? A new study offers cautions**” by John Norton.

Tell me if this matches your experience: On the weekend, you head to one of your parish’s Masses you might have as many as half a dozen to pick from and you make your way to your usual pew. You participate in the liturgy, and with the last notes of the recessional hymn still echoing through the church, you step out of your pew, genuflect and turn to go. You might nod and smile to a familiar face or two, or briefly clasp hands with

better acquaintances you bump into in the parking lot, but otherwise, that’ll be the last communal act of Catholicism you participate in (at least outside your family) for the next six days. So here’s the question: Are you as happy as you can be? What’s the connection? Well, that’s drawn by a provocative new study of the correlation between religiosity and happiness. “In short,” wrote the researchers, “sitting alone in the pew does not enhance one’s life satisfaction. Only when one forms social networks in a congregation does religious service attendance lead to a higher level of life satisfaction.” “Church friends are super-charged friends, but we have no idea why,” Harvard public policy professor Robert D. Putnam, a co-author, told a summit on religion, well-being and health at Gallup world headquarters last month in Washington, D.C. But on the whole, Catholic Americans don’t seem to do “church friends” very well, at least if a vast mountain of anecdotal evidence is to be believed. From what I’ve ascertained and experienced myself, a lot of Catholic parishes find it really difficult to develop any connection with parishioners outside of Sunday Mass. Take as an example one local parish I know with about 2,300 registered families. It is known throughout the diocese as having particularly active parishioners in a variety of different apostolates, liturgical service, faith formation, community service and other programs. Yet those who participate count for only about 30 percent and that’s considered a success! Some might not find such numbers all that shocking, pointing out that after all, the primary focus of liturgy (as has been the direction, too, of Pope Benedict XVI’s gentle reforms) is on worship and transcendence not on socializing. That’s true, of course, but I think it is a big mistake to discount the importance of Christian fellowship. Not only does it have unimpeachable roots in Scripture and the early Church, it was also a matter of course for many Catholic parishes until the middle of the last century. In some places, the sense of cohesion might have been driven partly by common ethnic heritage, and in many places, it may have remained at a superficial level. When we have “super-charged” church friends, we find it easier to grow in our faith and in our Catholic identity. And we’re happier, apparently. Don’t miss an opportunity to attend a parish celebration or event. Who knows! It could change your life!


From the Music and Worship Department

Ask the Liturgist....

Question: I noticed that the Easter candle in our church is newly decorated with flowers, and has been moved next to the pulpit. There are special markings on it also. Can you tell me what they mean, and when did the Easter candle originate in the Roman Catholic Church? The best way to answer your question is to show you an illustration of the Easter candle and its markings. Below is a good guide to that.

The origin of the Paschal candle can be traced to an ancient practice called the *lucernarium*, (a special lamp or candle was lighted for an evening service.) Mention of this type of service traces back to the fourth century. Later, in the fifth century Catholics in Rome chose a candle representing Christ as light in the darkness. Nowadays we refer to the Paschal candle as the Easter candle. This beautiful candle, the largest candle in our church, remains in place next to the ambo (pulpit) throughout the fifty days of Easter. It is proper to light it before each Mass. After Pentecost, June 5th this year, it will be moved closer to the baptismal font, its normal place, from which baptismal candles are lit and given to the parents and godparents at Baptisms. When a funeral Mass is celebrated after the Easter sea-

son, it will again be moved from the baptismal font toward the center aisle of the sanctuary, shining brightly over the casket, symbol of the risen Christ and our hope of eternal life.
