

That They may be One

"Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me."

I wish you all could see what I see from the altar! Every time this cycle of readings come up and this particular gospel passage is read at Mass, I become overwhelmed with memories and thoughts as I think about the awesomeness of what the Holy Spirit has done and is doing in our parish. Since first becoming a pastor in 2009, God has blessed me with the opportunity to be a part of three unique parish mergers. As I reflect on those experiences, I realized just how Blessed I have been to witness the power of what true love for the Lord and a love for one another, can bring about. I have experienced three incredible transformations of Christian communities, Corpus Christi Parish, Holy Apostles Parish and now Blessed Trinity Parish. All three parish mergers have been a true witness to the life and love of what working together as one Body of Christ can accomplish. When I sit in the chair on the altar at our weekend Masses, I look out into the church and see so many familiar faces but now in many different places. I no longer see parishioners of separate parishes in their own churches. I see members of a connected and bonded parish family worshipping together in their parish churches.

I see a living example of a community that St. Paul was hoping for when he wrote to encourage the Ephesians to allow the Holy Spirit to fashion them into a single harmonious religious community. I see a community living in a manner worthy of the call they have received, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another through love, striving to preserve the unity of the spirit through the bond of peace: one body and one Spirit, as they were also called to the one hope of their call; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all. Our three parishes have grown stronger as ONE community. Just think! It is an answer to a prayer, Jesus' prayer!

In today's Gospel, Jesus prays for his disciples and for those who will follow them. His prayer applies to us today as well. He prays for His disciples, "that they may be one." His prayer for us today is still the same, that we may be one. Some may say we had no choice or that it was divine intervention that brought us together but however we look at it, our response to the circumstances that brought us together is what makes the difference and our parish family continues to make a difference by **"Letting Go and Letting God."**

MISSIONARY COOPERATION SUNDAY

One of the ways the Roman Catholic Church is deeply inspirational is through her missionary work. For millennia, the Church has sent forth innumerable Catholic missionaries to bring relief to the poor. We serve women, children, and men of all races and religions. The Church pursues the poor and serves them because poverty is painful. There is no other litmus test.

This year, Missionary Cooperation Sunday is the weekend of June 4th and 5th. As with the past couple of years, because of restrictions we will not host a missionary but instead will apply **any contributions of cash or checks added to the collection baskets during the regular collections at all of our masses that weekend**. Our parish this year is supporting the Diocese of Beau in Cameroon, Africa. Per Rev. Edwin Seh, a priest of their diocese, they are grappling with a series of challenges because of the war in their region. They now carry out services like caring for the internally displaced persons, educating the young and underprivileged, sheltering homeless people, feeding those who are hungry, providing psycho-social care and reuniting families.

Realizing that it has been a difficult few years for all of us, we can only imagine how difficult it has been for people who live in a country with few safety nets during a war. Please be as generous as possible through prayer and financial support in helping to offer the safety net that the Diocese of Beau is providing for the people of Cameroon.

#1446 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church says "Christ instituted the sacrament of Penance for all sinful members of his Church." Since Jesus gave this Sacrament to us, it is very important that we use this gift from Him. Here are some quotes from popular saints on the subject of the Sacrament of Confession: "The confession of evil works is the first beginning of good works." - St. Augustine

"In the life of the body a man is sometimes sick, and unless he takes medicine, he will die. Even so in the spiritual life a man is sick on account of sin. For that reason, he needs medicine so that he may be restored to health; and this grace is bestowed in the Sacrament of Penance." - St. Thomas Aquinas

"Confession is an act of honesty and courage - an act of entrusting ourselves, beyond sin, to the mercy of a loving and forgiving God." - St. John Paul II

These are all powerful quotes on the importance of the Sacrament of Confession, but the most important comes from Jesus, when He spoke to St. Faustina and told her that the Sacrament of Confession is where "The misery of the soul meets the God of Mercy. The torrents of grace inundate humble souls. The proud remain always in poverty and misery, because My grace turns away from them to humble souls" (#1602) God's Mercy awaits all of us in the Sacrament of Confession. The evil one does not want us to go to receive this Mercy. It is our choice who will win this battle for our soul!

Live Jesus in our hearts... Forever!



A Look at the Closing hymn for today on Memorial Day weekend

“The Battle Hymn of the Republic”



Most of us know the lyrics to “Mine Eyes Have Seen the glory...” or at least to its refrain, “Glory, glory Hallelujah...”. Ask someone, “where does this song come from?” And you may get several different answers. Today and in days past for over 150 years we consider it a patriotic song, mixing church and state, calling on God’s justice and right over injustice and war. The lyrics to this march were adapted to a popular song during the early days of the Civil War (1861-1865) by Julia Ward Howe. She visited DC in 1861 with her husband and was inspired by the valor and bravery of those from the Union Army engaged in bitter conflict with the Southern Confederates.

The fighting raged for four brutal years. More Americans died during the Civil War than in any war before or since: 620,000 dead and tens of thousands more wounded. Both sides fought fiercely for their beliefs.

In the end, the North’s larger population and manufacturing power overwhelmed the resources of the South. Compared to Confederate forces, the Union Army seemed to have a bottomless supply of soldiers and guns. Southern slave owners even had to battle their former slaves, now

fighting in the blue uniforms of Union soldiers.

The main Confederate army surrendered in April 1865, and the Union was restored. Much of the South, though, was left in smoking ruins. Defeat, destruction, and the end of their way of life—namely slavery—left southerners with a bitter taste in their mouths. And when they heard “Battle Hymn of the Republic,” it left a bitter sound in their ears.

The song was beautiful music to former slaves—black children, women, and men who now tasted freedom.

About the poet: Julia Ward Howe (1819-1910)

Howe is best remembered for her new words to the “Battle Hymn of the Republic.” Julia Ward Howe was quite socially active in circles that included other authors such as Charles Margaret Fuller, Charles Sumner, Ralph Waldo Emerson, and Charles Dickens. A lyrical poet and prolific author in her own right, she was active in prison reform, the fight to end slavery, and the fight to win equal rights for women. Julia Ward Howe’s efforts for social justice continued after the war. In 1870, she campaigned for a Mother’s Day for Peace, a precursor of Mother’s Day. She also pushed for women’s suffrage—the right for women to vote.


