

On Friday October 21 there will be an evening Mass at 7:00 PM in St Wendelin Church to mark the occasion.

There is no heat at all in the building so it may be cold depending on the weather.

There is no running water in the building which means no bathrooms will be available for use. We will arrange for a Port-O-John outside of the building.

Because of mold and mildew, the air quality is not the greatest so if you suffer from breathing issues, you may want to wear a mask.

### About St. Wendelin:

Wendelin was born in 554 as the son of the King of Scotland. He was educated by a bishop and decided to refuse his life as a prince and instead devote his life to God. After a pilgrimage to Rome, he lived as a hermit in Germany for a while. Then, he started tending sheep for a wealthy man, who built a chapel in his honor. Wendelin established the Tholey Abbey of which he became abbot. Wendelin died in 617 in Tholey. St. Wendelin is patron saint of country folk, shepherds, farmers, of cattle, and for prosperous weather and good harvest.

It is a bitter sweet and special occasion for our parish family as we share you and your ministry with our neighboring parish. As brother ministers to the Lord, let us always keep in mind what St. Paul wrote to the Philippians: "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. On this special occasion, may God's love and blessing be upon you, and may He give you continued grace, peace and wisdom as you begin this new and exciting ministry.



**IN NEXT WEEKS GOSPEL...BEWARE THE HUMILITY TRAP:** This parable is full of traps. Many of us want to identify with the tax collector and usually take a place at the back of the congregation. In school we kept our hands down and avoided eye contact hoping not to be singled out or called on. In hearing the gospel we assume that Jesus showed favor to the "outcast" especially when he praised his prayer and noted that he was justified. He was not praised because of his sins but because of his honesty before God. In reality we are more like the Pharisee and overlook our sins in order to take credit for our successes in life. Unfortunately we take God's gifts for granted and assume we are entitled to them. We may feel sorry for others but do not show true compassion. We are quick to judge others and use ourselves as the measure. The truth is that Jesus is the measure for all of us and is the standard by which to see ourselves.

God enriches all of His children not for their own sakes but to encourage us to use His gifts for others. We are all dependent on God and must use our gifts and talents for the sake of others. All grace is God's gift and when we use this gift for others we promote true justice. The gift we should seek above all others is God's mercy. That is the truth of the parable, not self-justification or self-depreciation.

Both characters offer a prayer in the parable. The Pharisee makes his prayer loudly and tries to justify himself before God and others. The tax collector offers a prayer of self-awareness and dependence on the mercy of God. Ironically, God knows the heart of each one before they utter a word. A right relationship with God in the Old Testament meant faithfulness to the Covenant and in the New Testament faithful to Christ. The parable is used to illustrate true humility.

Humility is not prized today because we confuse it with humiliation. Humility comes from the word *humus* (earthly) showing that a truly humble person is down to earth. He/she recognizes that God is God and I am not. We must never usurp the place of God by judging others. True humility is part of a continuing process of conversion. Humility reveals my place in the universe and becomes the foundation of community, family, friendship and love.

### THREE RIVERS SAVINGS CARDS


Blessed Trinity Parish is now selling Three Rivers Savings Cards (\$ discount off dining).

### FROM THE MUSIC AND WORSHIP DEPARTMENT

***Gregorian Chant and the pope whose name it took. The other side of the story.***



Pope Saint Gregory I, also known as the Great, was the pope of the Catholic Church between 590 and 604 AD. He is traditionally credited with "cantus planus," known in English as plainchant. Most of us know this style of singing as Gregorian Chant. This melodious, monophonic music is known throughout the Roman Rite Church and closely associated with medieval monasteries. Gregorian chant gives us the music we still have in its original form, some dating to the centuries just after the death of Gregory. Some music historians argue that such credit for its origin is one that rightly belongs to his less famous successor of a century later, Gregory II.

Pope Gregory was more well known in his time for his alms to the poor, and he gave quite generously of the riches donated to the Church by the wealthy people of Rome. Everything from money to land was given to the poor in some fashion. He made clear to his subordinates that their duty was to relieve the distress faced by the poor.

He ordered his clergy to go out into the streets to find and care for the poor in person. Any clergy who were unwilling to go into the streets and help the poor were replaced. Assets of the Church were liquidated to provide income for alms. Clergy doing this work were paid four times a year and given a gold coin as a sort of bonus.

When a famine struck Rome in the 590s, Pope Gregory ordered the Church to use its assets to feed the poor. At that time, the Church controlled nearly two thousand square miles of land, overseen by the clergy, and used to generate income. Now, instead of selling the produce of the land, Pope Gregory ordered it shipped to Rome and given away for free. In this way, he saved thousands. Pope Gregory himself refused to eat until his monks returned from their work of handing out food. He is thought to also have dined with a dozen poor people at each meal. He is considered to be the first medieval pope, and he was a prolific writer, thus the title "Great". **He is the patron saint of musicians, singers, students, and teachers.**


