

### Christ the King

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, we acknowledge Jesus as our savior and our king and work together to build his kingdom here on earth. This feast was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI who wanted to counter the rising trend of secularization that was sweeping the world at that time. Today's Psalm helps us to remember who the true Lord and King of our lives should be. Today also marks the last Sunday of another liturgical year. Unlike the calendar year that begins on January 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on December 31<sup>st</sup>, or a business fiscal year that begins every July 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on June 30<sup>th</sup>, the church's liturgical year begins with the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent and ends with the Saturday before the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent. The season of Advent is a time of anticipation and waiting for the great celebration of Christmas, the Birth of the Lord Jesus. Let us allow the growing light of His birth warm our hearts and enlighten our souls to His Holy presence in our lives and our parish.

### Little Blue Book

To help us prepare spiritually throughout Advent there are Little Blue books available at the doors of the churches. I have found these little books very helpful and insightful because they not only provide daily meditations to help us prepare for Christmas, they also offer wonderful explanations of the various customs, traditions, and symbols that are important parts of the Advent and Christmas seasons.

### Thanksgiving Mass

A reminder that this year our parish will celebrate four Thanksgiving Masses on Thanksgiving day. See the schedule in this bulletin. This year we will be giving each family that attends the Mass a small loaf of bread to take to share at your table this Thanksgiving.

What better way to return "Thanks to the Lord" for the gifts we have than by sharing some of what we have with those who are in need. The Feast of Christ the King is a relatively new feast in the liturgical calendar. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 in response to the growth of secularism in the world. ## CHRIST THE KING

This weekend, which is the last Sunday of our Liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or more commonly known as **Christ the King**. This feast day was instituted by Pope Pius XI almost a hundred years ago in response to a world that was rejecting Christ and turning more and more toward secularism. Sound familiar? The solemnity of Christ the King is to help remind us that while earthly things may come and go, Christ's reign over all the earth is eternal.

Jesus was born in a stable. He served the people around Him and lived humbly. He preached of the Kingdom of God, but His teachings weren't accepted by many at that time because they were looking for a king who would set up his kingdom on earth; a kingdom where they would share the wealth and power. He did not live in a palace, wear a gold crown or have servants waiting on Him. Jesus did finally wear a crown, but it was made of thorns. The sign on the cross where He hung and died read, "This is the king of the Jews." They were mocking Jesus. **Ask the Liturgist:** *I have seen the Infant of Prague statue everywhere, in homes, in churches and chapels. Can you tell me the story behind it?*



The original Infant of Prague statue in the middle of the picture, is enshrined in Our Lady of Victories Church, Prague, Czech Republic. Thousands of replicas of this statue have been made throughout the world, and are displayed with many different colors of robes, including the original. The clothes' colors are changed according to the liturgical colors of the season or on a special feast or solemnity.

The history of the statue begins in the 17th century, when a statue of the Infant Jesus was brought into Bohemia (now Czech Republic) and eventually was given to the Discalced Carmelites in Prague. Since then the statue has remained in Prague.

The exact origin of this Infant Jesus statue is not known, but historical sources point to a small 28cm high sculpture of the Holy Child (11 inches) with a bird in his right hand, carved about the year 1340. It is believed that it came from a monastery in Bohemia and from there it was obtained by Dona Isabella Manrique who gave it as a wedding gift to her daughter Marie Manrique, who married a noble of the Czech kingdom. Later, the statue was again given to Marie's daughter Polyxena, as a wedding gift in 1587. In 1628, Lady Polyxena presented the statue to the Carmelites at the Church of the Virgin Mary the Victorious in Mala Strana, Prague. Shortly after 1628, the Saxons and the Swedes took turns invading Prague and the Carmelites had to flee the region, and veneration of the Holy Infant ceased.

The statue was found some ten years later by a young priest named Fr. P. Cyril. When he returned to Prague he found the Holy Infant statue buried in the ruins of the Lady of Victory Church. Fr. Cyril cleaned the statue and placed it in the oratory, but the hands on the statue were badly damaged. Through prayer, Fr. Cyril asked the Blessed Virgin Mary on several occasions to provide the necessary funds for fixing it.

As the legend goes, during Fr. Cyril's prayer, the Divine Infant spoke to him saying, "Place Me near the entrance of the sacristy and you will receive aid". Fr. Cyril did just that, and within a few days the statue was repaired by a man



who came to the sacristy to offer help. Word got out about a number of miracles attributed to those who prayed before the refurbished statue. In the years to come, Prague went through more wars, destruction and devastation, but the Church and the Infant Jesus chapel were miraculously spared any damage.

In 1776, the altar was rebuilt, using marble as a fitting shrine for the Infant statue. Two huge sculptures of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph were placed to the left and right sides of the altar. The statue was placed in a glass case, standing on a pedestal, engraved with crystals, and surrounding the Infant were twenty angels in gold.

Today, thousands of pilgrims each year visit Our Lady of Victories Church and pray before the Infant of Prague statue, of which, this writer was given the opportunity, and did also!
