REGARDING MASS INTENTIONS

1. The mass with combined intentions missed during the months of March, April, and May will be/was celebrated outside the church on Monday, June 15 at 11 A.M.
2. Mass intentions *rescheduled* from March, April, and May will be transferred to individual masses to be celebrated a.s.a.p., either publicly or privately. A private mass is a mass that one of our priests celebrates without a congregation.
3. As of June 15, mass intention requests previously scheduled for weekday masses (Monday through Saturday mornings) will be fulfilled individually at the regular public masses on the days previously scheduled. If the public mass does not take place, the mass will be celebrated privately.
4. As of Sunday, June 21, *some* Saturday evening and Sunday mass intention requests will be fulfilled on the previously scheduled weekend but not necessarily at the previously scheduled time. Those which cannot be fulfilled on the previously scheduled weekend will be fulfilled a.s.a.p., either in public or private masses.
5. Sunday and weekday mass intention requests from June 1 to June 14 will be fulfilled at individual masses celebrated a.s.a.p., either publicly or privately.
6. Refunds of mass offerings for masses not celebrated at the previously scheduled time will be given to anyone who requests them and agrees to have those intentions canceled.
7. Mass intentions will continue to be published in the parish bulletin, which will be available for viewing on our parish website, www.stjoscup.org. (As of June 15, the distribution of printed bulletins is temporarily suspended for health reasons by diocesan policy.)
8. No new mass intention requests will be accepted while we are trying to take care of past requests and we are uncertain of when we can resume our regular mass schedule. However, if you have some special urgent need, please contact Fr. Greg and the priests will try to accommodate you.

The priests apologize for not being able to fulfill mass intention requests as they were originally scheduled. No one anticipated that our church would be closed for such a long period of time. We thank you for your patience and understanding. We all look forward to the time when we can return to celebrating mass on a regular basis in our church.

A note about next school year

At this time, it is not clear what format of school will open on August 19. At SJC we are preparing for three scenarios. It is very likely that we might not know which scenario to implement until August. One option is that we return to school with minor modifications to include social distancing protocols that don't interrupt with the flow of the school day. That is, pick up time and drop off times would remain the same and we would not be limited to the number of students in the classroom from the Santa Clara County Public Health Department (SCCPHD). This scenario is unlikely, but we hope it's a possibility as we return to normal. The second option is to continue the distance learning protocol that we started on March 13. In reviewing our current distance learning protocol, we have identified opportunities to further enhance distance learning for the fall and plan to make those changes this summer. Our final option is a modified school structure to meet the requirements of the SCCPHD. This might include staggered start times, staggered days, class size limitations, hybrid in-person and distance learning curriculum. We are also planning for this scenario, not only as a school, but as a diocese. We realize that there is a lot of uncertainty, but as we get more information, we will share that information. For the families with preschool students, please note that we also have the additional requirements from the Community Care Licensing that we will comply with which might supersede some of the requirements for the elementary school. With any option, SJC remains committed to providing a safe and positive learning environment for our students!

ENTHUSIASM AND GRAMMAR

There is a good reason that the writings of St. Paul don't show up as examples in grammar textbooks. Today's reading is a case in point. It begins with one of those long Pauline run on sentences that leave lectors gasping for breath. So what? Take a closer look at how Paul's fervor for his subject matter derails the grammar. There is something admirable about being so caught up in his convictions that the words cannot come fast enough to express them, much less in an orderly fashion. Scripture scholars usually take this grammatical ineptness as a sign of a passage's early importance in the Christian community, something they were so ardent about that their language never got refined.

What leaves us in this condition? Re-telling the plot line of an action movie or the play-by-play of a sporting event? When was the last time any of us was so excited by our faith in Christ that we were left grasping for words, stumbling over our own errors in speech? SAINT JOHN FISHER (1469-1535) AND SAINT THOMAS MORE (1477-1535)-June 22

From Robert Bolt's classic *A Man for All Seasons* to *Showtime's* edgy *The Tudors*, Thomas More endears himself still: lawyer-statesman of impeccable integrity, remarried widower and affectionate father delighting in a lively household—four children, a pet monkey, even a paid jester! And challenges still: humanist-reformer, yet champion of Catholic faith and papal primacy. John Paul II named him Patron of Statesmen and Politicians, citing More's generous work, both as a lawyer and in government service, on behalf of the poorest and most marginalized people of his time, as well as his promotion of education for all sectors of society. More's decision for principle over politics, conscience over convenience prompted his final words: "I die the king's good servant, but God's first." Alone among England's bishops, John Fisher dared challenge Henry VIII's divorce and repudiation of the papacy. When the Pope named the imprisoned Fisher a cardinal, Henry thundered: "Don't bother sending Fisher's red hat here; I'll send Fisher's head to Rome!" Whose "good servants" are we first? Isn't a right conscience worth the pain of standing alone?
