

I remember when I was a seminarian, one evening coming from a ministry, I shared with my ministry partner that I dreaded the experience of ministering to the youth. I felt disrespected when I was trying to share my faith experience with them. He picked up what I said and threw out the words, "You know what, Mike? When you're in ministry, it's not about you. It's about them, their salvation, so get over it!" I initially took offense about what he said, for I was not asking for his advice. As I reflected that evening about

what he said, however, I realized that he was right. I needed to die to my fear of being rejected if I were to be successful in my ministry. Jesus exhorts us in today's Gospel that bearing witness to Him is not an option but a necessity to one's salvation. He says, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father." This is not easy at all. The hard reality of bearing witness to the Gospel is that one can even lose one's job or business for bearing witness to what Christ teaches. These are serious consequences. But Christ exhorts us to die to our fear. God will take care of us. He has a plan figured out for our salvation. We're covered. We can lean on Him and build on the strength of the Lord who is always at my side, for we are worth more than any sparrows, so to speak. What we should really fear is falling out of that plan of salvation because we choose to deny God before people whom we fear will reject us. Is that choice really worth it?

Venerable Pierre Toussaint was born into slavery but became an elite hairstylist in New York City and a free man. He used the money he earned to transform the lives of impoverished New Yorkers, former slaves, and immigrants alongside his wife, Servant of God Juliette.

Lord God, source of love and compassion, we praise and honor You for the virtuous and charitable life of our brother in Christ, Venerable Pierre Toussaint.

Inspired by the example of our Lord Jesus, Pierre worshipped You with love and served Your people with generosity. He attended Mass daily and responded to the practical and spiritual needs of friends and strangers, of the rich and the poor, the sick and the homeless of the 19th century, New York.

If it is your will, let the name of Venerable Pierre Toussaint be officially raised to the rank of Saint, so that the world may know this Haitian New Yorker who refused to hate or be selfish, but instead lived to the full commandments of heaven and the divine law of love — love for God and for neighbor.

By following his example and asking for his prayer, may we, too, be counted among the blessed in heaven.

We ask for this through Christ our Lord. Amen.



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I was in middle school, there were times I didn't want my fellow students to see my parents drop me off or pick me up in the school parking lot. I was embarrassed of my parents. Why? I have no idea. Maybe it was our station wagon. Or I didn't want to look like a little kid. But in retrospect that was a silly thing to do. I was a kid. And I had two parents who loved me and had built a wonderful family. I was afraid of the other kids' judgment. How silly! I should have been afraid of forgetting or downplaying my family, which is where my identity had its deep roots.

This is a way to understand Jesus' words to his disciples this Sunday, when he says, "Don't be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna." Fear, in this sense, refers to where we find our deepest identity and our highest love. That's why Jesus says next that when we acknowledge him before others, he will acknowledge us before the Father. It doesn't mean we're brash or boastful. But rather we unhesitatingly and humbly embrace our identity as followers of Jesus and children of God the Father. After all, if we love who we are and where we come from, who cares what the other kids think about us?
