In today's Gospel, Jesus asks us to take His yoke when we are feeling burdened in life, and He will give us rest. What is a yoke? A yoke is a heavy wooden beam that takes some effort to properly set up on animals and to carry. So, in that case how can a yoke be light? The idea is how it is set up. A yoke is fastened over the necks of two animals and is attached to a plow that the two animals both pull. By connecting the two animals with a yoke, both animals work together, they walk the same path and direction. Usually, the stronger animal is a great help for the weaker animal. So, both

animals aid one another as they carry the burden. Life's challenges are a given. These are here to stay. However, we do not need to carry life's burdens by ourselves. Jesus is here with us to help us carry the load if we let Him. If we did it by ourselves, the burden would be much heavier. With Jesus helping us carry the load, the burden becomes lighter. Only with His grace will we be able to get through our life's burdens. Let's take Christ's invitation to bring to Him whatever burdens we have now in our life, so He can give us the grace we need to carry the yoke with Him. Jesus may not necessarily spare us challenges in life, but He promises us that with His grace, we will make through these life's burdens and experience the glory of His resurrection at the end of our life's journey.

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Do you ever feel restless? I certainly do. Daily tasks and challenges, but also the more basic demand of simply existing — sooner or later, this can all feel crushing and tire us out.

Which is why Jesus' words are such stunningly good news: "Come to me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). How vastly weird that this man speaks as though he is capable of giving us the deep repose we desire. Is his claim the height of absurd grandiosity? No, because next he immediately proclaims that he is "meek and humble of heart." We here touch a mystery: Jesus is capable of giving us rest because he is the one who forever reposes in the heart of God the Father. He is "yoked" to the Father in his divinity. But he is humbly "yoked" to us, sharing in our humanity.

The good news, my fellow tired-out friends: we don't have to despair in our burdens and exhaustion, no matter how heavy they feel. This week, join me in opening our hearts to hear him say to us, "Come! I will give you rest." We come to him in the Church, Eucharist, the Scriptures, prayer, in the poor. There he will give us rest.
