Is there anything that strikes you in today's Gospel? Mary was given a daunting task to be the mother of God. Mary was believed to be just 14 years old. She was barely more than a just a child herself when she heard from the angel Gabriel that she was to give birth to a son, and not just any son, but the Son of God! How could anybody as young as she was even comprehend that message? Fear must have filled her heart for being given a task that

great. I can imagine that perhaps Mary was a bit close to crying just imaging what this all would mean for her reputation, her family's and for Joseph's: becoming pregnant when she even had not had any relation with a man! Then, after taking a leap of faith, saying yes to God, suddenly, the angel departed her. Talk about support! Mary finds herself all alone. Doesn't this sound familiar? Were there not times when we said yes to God about doing a daunting task, and then we find that no help was at hand? But, were we really abandoned? Was Mary really left all by herself? The key is what the angel told her: "The Lord is with you...do not be afraid." Mary was already given that assurance before anything else. This the same message that God is giving us. If we say yes to His will, then even if the task at hand looks daunting, God is assuring us that He is with us, that we are not to be afraid. Like Mary, may we have the humility to let go of our control and believe that God has our back, that nothing is impossible for Him. All we just do, really, is to say yes to Him and He takes care of the rest.

This year is a bit different. The 4th Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve fall on the same Sunday. Hence, when you come to Mass on the 4th Sunday of Advent, you need to come back either on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to fulfill your holy day of obligation for Christmas. Masses for Christmas Eve are at 4:00 pm, 6:00 pm and 10:00 pm. Masses on Christmas Day are at 9:30 am and 11:00 am only.

Everyone is invited to come to the Christmas Carol Service on Sunday, December 24th, from 9:30 pm through 10pm. Immediately following that is the Christmas Eve Mass at 10pm.

Come and let us celebrate as a community on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day the fulfillment of God's promise that He would send His only begotten Son to save us!

Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Life is troubling. Who among us has not struggled with anxiety and difficulties, sometimes massive ones? I certainly have, as have many of my loved ones. If we do, does this mean that we don't trust the Lord or just need to toughen up?

I don't think so. How encouraging for us anxious and troubled souls to hear Luke describe the Blessed Mother Mary in these words, "But she was greatly troubled at what was said." An archangel has visited her. An inconceivable promise has been made to her. Her life has become wildly unpredictable, perhaps more so than any person before or since. The first point for us: the Lord is with her precisely when she is troubled. Her anxiousness and God's presence are not mutually exclusive. Christianity is not about a trance-like robotic indifference. It's about the presence of divine love. Even in — especially in — troubled circumstances.

Our troubled soul can become our greatest treasure. What seems so troubling at first to Mary becomes the best possible thing, Jesus, the Savior and Lord, is now her son. All the difficulties and troubles remain, and yet her movement into the fullness of God is accelerated. What is troubling you right now? This scripture invites us now, this week, to hear the Lord's messenger say to us what he said to Mary, "Do not be afraid! You have found favor with God."

What Is Your Fiat?

Are you an anxious people-pleaser prone to overcommitting yourself? Welcome to the club! We have slogans, and for your convenience I've listed them here:

"Sounds great!"

"No worries!"

"Absolutely, I can do that, not a problem!"

These are your go-to responses for when someone requests a favor that is a huge inconvenience, but you would rather die than disappoint. It's not exactly disingenuous — it's just a little neurotic. Again, welcome to the club.

You know who doesn't belong to this club? The Blessed Mother. For many reasons, I'm sure, but the biggest one is that she's always completely up-front. Take her response to the Angel Gabriel: "Let it be done."

If there are more powerful words than these, I can't think of them now. And yet, as responses go, this certainly isn't an enthusiastic one. There was never a human creature more willing to obey God than Mary, full of grace, so it makes it all of the more striking that her response to Gabriel is this reserved — and it makes it all the more certain that she means exactly what she says.

Let it be done.

Not: Yes, this is exactly that I asked for!

Not: Nope. This sounds awful. Count me out.

But precisely this: If God is asking, my answer is yes.

The Angel Gabriel visits us all, in a way, at some point or another, bearing news we did not expect. When we can say, in the face of that uncertainty, "Let it be done," we are embracing our calling as disciples. We are becoming like Mary.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

Why do Catholics light candles in church?

Answer:

Candles have been part of the Church's worship from the earliest times. In the days before electricity, candles and oil lamps were the ways that people lighted buildings. Even today, we often still depend on candles during power outages, relying on their flickering flames to bring light into the dark.

Like our ancestors, we also light candles on special occasions. Think about a festive family meal or a romantic dinner for two — there will often be candles on the table, special objects for a special event. We light candles on birthday cakes and carry them in processions. We also place candles at makeshift memorials that appear when there has been an accident or act of violence. In these moments, their light casts aside a different kind of darkness — the darkness of grief, fear, and death.

The custom of the early Christians lighting candles and lamps at the tombs of the martyrs gave way to the practice of having candles at Mass, honoring the sacredness of the celebration.

As Christians decorated their worship spaces with statues and icons, they would burn candles in front of sacred images and the relics of the saints, basically "shining a light" on what they held to be sacred. When pilgrims would visit these shrines, they would often bring candles to light before the image or relic. These candles came to be a symbol of the person, and their prayer and the burning these candles came to be understood as an extension and continuation of the prayer that was offered. What began as a practical way to provide light has come to be a symbol of the hopes, desires, loves, losses, fears, and faith of everyday Christians offering their prayers to God and his saints.

And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God."





Financial Report

FINANCIAL REPORT FISCAL YEAR JULY 2022 – JUNE, 2023

The balance sheet of St. Joseph of Cupertino as of June 30, 2023, has a total current asset of \$3,002,493.37. The parish's total fixed assets are \$401,035.88. The total (current and fixed) assets of the parish are \$3,403,529.25; this is 4.32% less than the previous year. The parish's total current liability was \$29,309.53 which is 26.25% less than the previous year. The total liabilities and equity of the parish are \$3,403,529.25 which is 4.32% less than the previous year.

A few major key highlights from St. Joseph of Cupertino Church Profit and Loss Statement 2023 include:

- **Income**: The church had a total income of \$1,108,707.63, which was 10.35% higher than the budgeted amount of \$1,004,704.04. The actual total income was 110.35% of the budget, the actual income far exceeded the budget.
- Expenses: The church had a total expense of \$1,295,258.86, which was 19.84% higher than the budgeted amount of \$1,080,853.66. The major planned expense for this fiscal year was the replacement sound system. The weekly collections and the small grant received from the Catholic Community Foundation, and the ADA rebate helped pay for the sound system replacement. Going into the next year, the biggest anticipated expense will be the replacement of the Air Conditioning systems of the rectory. All three of the AC units are in need of replacement. Each AC unit has an estimated replacement cost of \$20,000, and therefore the total replacement costs for all three units is approximately \$60,000.

Net Income: The net operating loss for this year was \$186,551.23, and the budgeted loss amount was \$76,149.62. The net operating loss was 244.98% higher than the budget. Therefore, the parish spent far more than the parish earned from donations and all other fundraising activities. The losses were further increased when the other income and expenses were factored in. These expenses included unrealized income/losses from investments, the various exchange accounts, and subsidies to the school. After these other income and expenses were factored in, the total net loss was \$188,595.32.


