Audition Information

Auditions for Dare to Dream Jr. will be on Thursday January 15th from 3:00pm-4:30pm in the cafeteria. Auditions will be fun, supportive, and low-stress! Auditions are held to get a chance to see each student perform and show their creativity so that everyone can be matched with a role that is just right for them!

Each student will be asked to **sing 30-60 seconds of any Disney song**. Students may do so with a karaoke track of their choice or a capella (without a karaoke track). Then students will be asked to read a short scene.

There is no right or wrong in an audition! It is all about showing your personality, creativity, and having fun! Think about what your song is about, what the character is feeling, and how you can show that during your song!

Please select one of the following scenes to read. Scenes do not need to be memorized.

Scene 1: Okay everyone. Today your training to become a Disney Imagineer begins! Imagineers are responsible for bringing to life things that people can only imagine. We create, design, and build. We make magic and turn people's wildest dreams into a reality! In order to become an Imagineer, you first need to harness the power of your dreams!

Scene 2: It was the biggest burp I had ever done. It was the biggest burp I had ever heard, the biggest burp I had ever heard about. Stage Crew

Stage crew plays a vital role in bringing shows to life behind the scenes.

Students on stage crew will use their creativity to work on sets, props, costumes, and more throughout the course of the show. Students will work together as a team to problem-solve and come up with creative solutions to help in creating the magic on stage!

Some roles on stage crew are:

Stage Manager: The person who leads the cast and stage crew, helping to keep rehearsals and performances running smoothly by organizing cues and backstage elements for the cast and crew.

Assistant Stage Manager: Supports the stage manager in organizing all of the action backstage!

Stage Crew: Helps create ideas for the set, props, and costumes for the show, coming up for creative solutions to achieve different moments on stage.

Sound Crew: Helps manage music and sound effects during performances and rehearsals.

Light Crew: Runs spotlights to ensure our audience can see the show!

All students interested in stage crew are asked to attend the first rehearsal on Tuesday, January 22th to learn more about the show and to assign crew roles!
