The Communion Rail is used for the Latin Mass.

Please kneel (if physically able) at the Communion Rail to receive Holy Communion. Holy Communion is given only on the tongue at a Latin Mass.



And let my cry come unto Thee. V. The Lord be with you. R. And with thy spirit. Let us pray. We beseech Thee, O Almighty God, through the intercession of Holy Mary, the Mother of God, of the holy angels, patriarchs, prophets, apostles, martyrs, confessors, virgins, widows, and of all Thy saints, that Thou show us Thy continuing protection, permit tranquil winds, and also pour out to us, Thy unworthy servants, Thy safety from heaven above against lightning strikes and violent storms, and that Thou remain always protective of the human race and crush down the aerial powers by the right hand of Thy power. 

Prayer for the Pope

Whenever possible, the priests of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest add a second prayer—called a 'collect'—to the collect of the day's Mass. This is a prayer for the Holy Father. These 'Pro Papa' prayers (Collect, Secret, and Postcommunion) are from the "Mass on the Anniversary of the Election or Consecration of a Pope." They are prayed after the Collect, Secret, and Postcommunion for the day and after any additional Collect, Secret, and Postcommunion that may be prayed for a commemoration on that day. They can be found in any traditional Missal.
