MISSION STATEMENT

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

This is the 30th week in Year A in the Sunday cycle of the Liturgy. Since there are only 34 weeks in Ordinary Time, there are only four more weeks and we begin a new Liturgical Year. What is this all about?

There are three Liturgical Years in the Sunday cycle: A, B, and C. Each year has seasons: Ordinary Time, Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter. In year A, the current year, we read the Gospel of Matthew each Sunday, covering the majority of the text during the year. Year B covers the Gospel of Mark, with the addition of Chapter 6 from the Gospel of John (since Mark's gospel is so short). Year C covers the Gospel of Luke. The Gospel of John is inserted into Christmas, Lent, and Easter times so that in the course of three years, we Catholics will hear or read nearly all of the four gospels, but they will be put in a liturgical context rather than their Biblical order. In fact, with the first two Sunday readings, we Catholics will hear/read almost all the New Testament and much of the Old Testament. Never let anyone tell you that Catholics do not read the Bible!

It is a wonderful system which was set up by intentionally asking scriptural and liturgical scholars to rate which passages of the Bible were most important, which were important, which were less important, and which could be omitted. The result is a systematic exposure to most of the Bible, with the passages put together so as to compliment one another in the first and third (Gospel) readings. Independently, a systematic exposure to the letters of the New Testament (Paul, James, John, Peter) is accomplished in the second or middle reading. Sometimes the message coincides with the theme of the first and third readings, and sometimes it does not, but the readings are not chosen to reinforce the theme of the first and third readings.

In this cycle of preaching, I have been trying to show the connection between the first or Old Testament reading and the Gospel, since those readings were chosen to complement one another. Sometimes we fall into the fallacy of thinking that the Old Testament is about a judgmental or vengeful God, whereas the New Testament is characterized by the God of love. With some careful reading of the texts, we can see that the Old Testament set the stage and prepared for the New Testament, and that the seeds of what Christ taught are there in the Old Testament. It is the story of a gradual revelation of God to His people. Scripture is one, describing the ongoing relationship between God and His People, culminating with the Incarnation (Christmas), Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. Everything in Scripture can and should be understood with Christ in mind. Failure to reference Christ is to become lost among seemingly contradictory stories and lessons in the Bible. This is the value of reading the Bible in the context of the Liturgy, where Christ as the second person of the Trinity is placed at the center of our worship, helping us to interpret and understand the scriptures presented to us. Little by little, we can gain a profound appreciation of the mystery of salvation celebrated in the Liturgy and recounted in the Bible as God reveals Himself to his people.

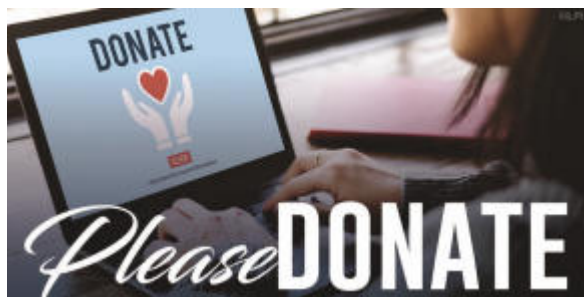

I wanted to share a little about myself and my thoughts about being the Stewardship Coordinator for our parish. My personal faith journey has been far from a straight line. It's more like a jigsaw puzzle. Along the way I gather the pieces, and at times, I sit still and reflect, and put the pieces together. My puzzle is far from complete. Through this process I realized that many times happenings that seem minor in the moment, end up being monumental in hind sight. For example, a friend suggesting that I come with her to an alpha group ends up being an important connection to a group of faithful, Holy Spirit seeking friends.

Participation does not come easily to me, but I am learning to get out of my own way. One obstacle I had to overcome was my misconception about the leaders in our community. I assumed that these people had always been steadfast in faith, never doubted and never strayed. I was so wrong. I have discovered that the people who are most dedicated, generous and spiritual have struggled as much as the rest of us. The difference is that they have found out that being of service to others and sharing the pieces of their puzzle, helps them deepen their own faith.

Feeling connection to our parish is not like flipping a switch. It is a process. It is getting out of our own way, showing up, communicating, having positive experiences and not being so resistant to the next. I have found our leaders to be so welcoming, authentic and understanding. I have so much to learn. Fortunately, I am surrounded by amazing teachers like Father Albert, Father Stephen, Michele Starke and Kathy Defenbaugh, just to name a few.

I would like to share what I am learning with you. As I get answers to my questions and have more thoughts to share about faith, I will publish them in the bulletin, and maybe online. I'll start with my own, but I welcome your input. I have placed a box in the gathering space where you can submit your questions or insights, anonymously if you wish. The first question I had is...What is stewardship? I found so many definitions. Entire books are written on the subject. Here is a theological definition that I found in "Best Practices in Parish Stewardship" by Charles E. Zech: "All creation is a gift. Each of us has been entrusted with gifts, in the form of our time, talent, and treasure. Someday we will be called to give an accounting of how we used those gifts to advance the kingdom of God."

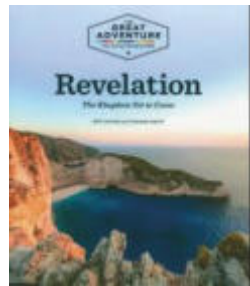

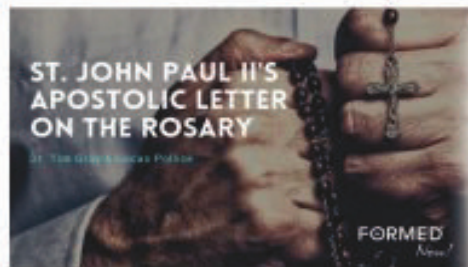
