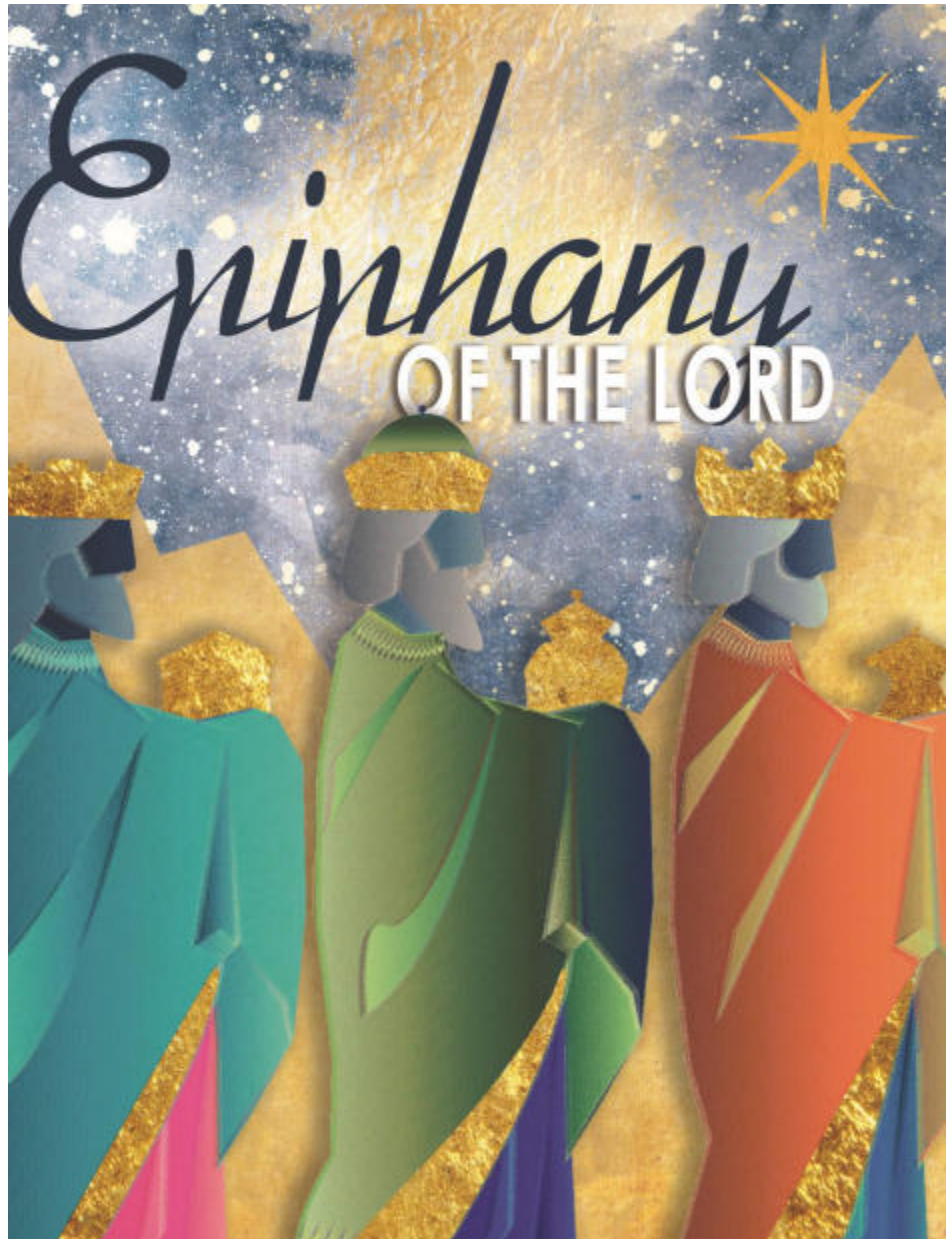

MISSION STATEMENT

*"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in
Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."*

Over 2000 years ago God burst into the world in the remote setting in Bethlehem. God became a part of the universe that He created! It is the most significant moment in the history of humanity, indeed of the cosmos. The question it poses, however, is: Where do we go from here? The feast of Epiphany answers that question, fulfilling hints from the Old Testament prophecies. What does it tell us? It tells us that Christ came for Gentiles as well as Jews, for all of us.

Epiphany refers to the manifestation of Jesus as the Christ (Messiah). There is a series of events in which this is done. One is today's gospel, the manifestation to the magi who represent the Gentiles. Another is the manifestation of Christ in the miracle he performed at the wedding feast of Cana, changing water into wine. The third is the baptism of John where the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus and God the Father spoke. In the readings today, it is the manifestation of Jesus Christ the Messiah to the Gentile magi.

The history of Judaism focuses on how the Jews are God's chosen people from whom the Messiah will come one day. But there are also hints, especially in Isaiah that this Messiah will be for all peoples, not just the Jews. Jews often interpreted those prophecies as implying that Judaism would conquer other civilizations with the Messiah as their leader, just as the Assyrians, Babylonians, and now Romans had conquered them. In their concrete and practical expectations, they missed the fact that the Kingdom of the Messiah would primarily be a spiritual kingdom – as Jesus said, "My Kingdom is not of this world." Today's feast of Epiphany tells us that the Messiah is here not only for the Jews, but also for the Gentiles (the non-Jews): for everyone. The magi represent the Gentiles, as they are foreigners to Israel. They come humbly and in good faith, seeking the Truth which has entered the universe. As many Jews rejected Christ's message, it was then preached to the Gentiles. In Christ's time, we saw Gentiles in the parable of the Good Samaritan, the Samaritan woman at the well, the royal official who asks Jesus to heal his son, the woman who said, "even dogs eat the droppings from the table," and the centurion who testified upon Jesus' death, "Truly this man was the Son of God." In the early Church, we saw of the ministry of St. Paul who became the Apostle to the Gentiles. All these people are represented in today's feast by the magi. Christ's message is for all humanity.

This Christmas is my fourth as your pastor. This past year has been the most challenging of the three and a half years here, primarily because of the Coronavirus. Ironically, this will be the first Christmas in which I am not losing my voice from whatever virus is going around at the time. I am thankful for your zeal, support, and faithfulness during this very strange and stressful time. May we appreciate the blessings of our bond of community which is being tested by these times. May we emerge stronger for having gone through this together, thankful for each other. It continues to be a great blessing and joy to be your pastor!

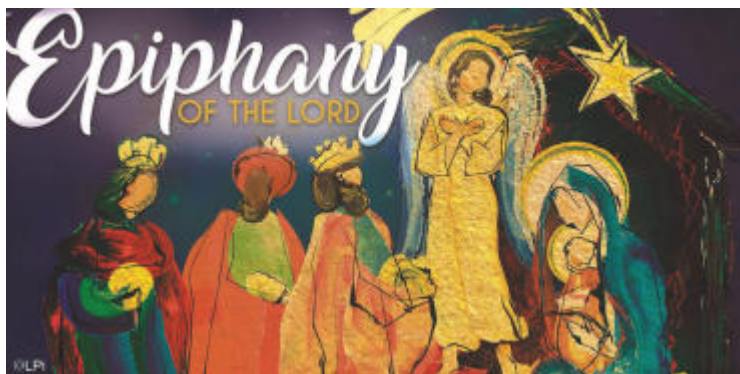

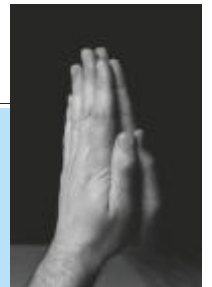

Happy New Year! We hear a lot about new year’s resolutions in January. I’ve never been successful at resolutions. I find that deciding to make a radical change in January usually does not stick by the time February rolls around. 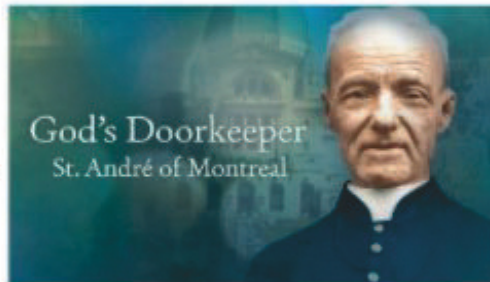
