

From the Pastor's Desk

This week we enter into the heart of the Bread of Life Discourse in Jn 6:41-51. It emphasizes the role of faith – truly believing that Jesus is both divine and human. For his hearers, it is the divine part that is the problem. Because we know that Jesus is both divine and human, what he has to say is less shocking than it was to those hearing it for the first time – until and unless you ponder what the Incarnation means deeply. The section ends by introducing the next section, which we will not hear next week because of the Solemnity of the Assumption. So I am going to write a few reflections on that section.

- On the 20th Sunday in Jn 6:51-58, Jesus asserts:
- 1) He is the living bread come down from heaven,
- 2) whoever eats this bread will live forever,
- 3) the bread that He will give is His (real) flesh for the life of the world,
- 4) unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you,
- 5) those who eat His flesh and drink his blood remain in Him and He in them (there is a mystical presence), and
- 6) He will raise up those who eat His flesh and drink His blood on the last day.

At the end of today's gospel Jesus asserts that he is divine when he says: "I myself am the living bread come down from heaven." So next week Jesus proceeds from the point that he is divine, the true bread **from heaven**, to explain that he will be present to us sacramentally, as bread and wine which becomes his body and blood. By eating his flesh and blood, we become what we eat – we are divinized, we become part of the Body of Christ. In the Old Testament, Jews (as opposed to pagan religions) were prohibited from drinking the blood of an animal. But animals are not eternal – they are temporal beings, so the life that is in animal blood does not have the same effect as drinking the blood of Jesus Christ, who is eternal. He is the true Lamb of God. This is a special case in Jesus. It behooves us to drink His blood and eat His flesh for our eternal well-being. Once again, Jesus speaks on the spiritual plane, and his audience is stuck on the physical plane, so they will object. We say that Jesus is present body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist. It is a special presence by which he comes to be with us in his person, not just in his power as healer or forgiver. For a more in depth explanation, look at the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, pp. 334-356, especially #1373 & 1374, p. 346. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, and John 6 would be hard to understand without our experience of the Eucharist. Let us do all we can to celebrate Eucharist, and honor/worship the Lord in it.

It is always a joy to celebrate the Eucharist with you!


