

"We, the community of St. Gregory Barbarigo, are called forth in Baptism to follow the mission of Jesus to teach, to love, and to serve."

During Lent we will have some liturgical changes which are pretty much routine. On Sundays the celebrant will come down the aisle and kneel and do the penitential rite on his knees. We will use the *Kyrie eleison* (instead of Lord Have Mercy). We will use Latin responses for the *Sanctus* (instead of Holy, Holy, Holy) and the *Agnus Dei* (instead of Lamb of God). Once again, I want to say that this is not an attempt to begin to use Latin all the time, but an opportunity to keep our congregation acquainted with the Latin that one might encounter in a significant number of other Catholic churches, both in our diocese and outside of it. We will also say the Apostle's Creed instead of the longer Nicene Creed during Lent and Easter seasons.

According to our staff very few people watch the Masses when they are streamed. So we have decided that March 4/5 will be the last day for streaming of Masses or anything else. This is not an irreversible decision, but unless we hear from you that you want Masses to be streamed then the computer and the camera and wires will be taken down after next weekend. What we have up now is a makeshift solution set up during COVID. If we want streaming capabilities, we need to have a more permanent, less obtrusive setup. so let us know what you want.

Chris Stefanick is scheduled to come to speak here at our parish. The topic will be "REBOOT." Please set aside the evening of September 13, 2023, to be present. More details will be forthcoming. If you don't recognize the name, he is the presenter for the series "The Search" on FORMED.ORG, as well as our Lenten video, "FEARLESS." I want to thank Jill Gockel for taking the initiative to make this happen. It promises to be a wonderful event in our parish. There is still work to be done in planning and promoting the event, so if you would like to help, please call the office. Isn't it nice not to have the COVID restrictions anymore?

Joshua and Kim Lefeber are stepping down as leaders of the high school youth group. I want to thank them for their work, while at the same time congratulate them on the arrival of their first baby, Emerie. Taking over, at least for the time being, is Jacob Struemph. Jacob is from St. Elizabeth, MO, graduated from NWMSU in 2021 with a major in Psychology, and is already working part time in the parish as a custodian cleaning the church and parish hall. Please welcome Jacob.

This past Friday I was in Oklahoma City for the dedication of the shrine in honor of Blessed Fr. Stanley Rother. It was a wonderful celebration in a glorious setting. Fr. Rother's body is at rest in the chapel in the back, and the main church seats 2,000 people. The shrine is just off I-35 in OKC. It was good to see those with whom I worked on the Cause for Canonization, including his family, and to view with satisfaction the fruits of our labors. It can easily take decades or centuries to see progress of a Canonization Cause, so I consider myself to be fortunate.

I look forward to seeing you in the church Monday night at 7 PM for "Healing in Christ". May this be a memorable and blessed Lent!



#### We Are Set Apart Together

Growing up in the Catholic Church, I did not look forward to Lent. It seemed like a time of more silly rules than the rest of the year. I didn't understand why I had to give up something I enjoyed, why we couldn't eat meat on Fridays, why we had to go to stations of the cross. As a teen I thought, surely eating meat on Friday during Lent isn't going to keep me out of heaven.

Honestly, my thoughts on all of this didn't change a lot until recently. While at some point in adulthood I started to understand that exercising self control and discipline makes us physically and spiritually healthier, I still didn't understand the meaning of sacrifice. Then I learned more. For those of you who have watched Bishop Robert Barron's "The Mass - Preparing for Sacrifice", you heard him



express that we don't offer sacrifice because God needs it, we offer sacrifice because we need it. We offer prayer, fasting, and almsgiving not because God needs those sacrifices, we offer them up out of praise for Jesus because he made the ultimate sacrifice for us on the cross.

What really changed my perspective on Lent is when Father Albert explained in a Homily that we have these rules so that we as Catholics are set apart. It is meant to be part of our identity. It isn't that eating meat on a Friday is bad, it's that abstaining from meat on Fridays makes us Catholic. Most Christians recognize Lent as a time of deepening spirituality in preparation for Easter. Catholics have a very prescribed way of doing this preparation, others might too, I am not versed in other faith traditions. The Catholic Church gives us a guideline to follow, it tells us when and how to prepare. But it is like a recipe. You can find a recipe and contemplate gathering the necessary ingredients, and making it for your family or friends. It's a pleasant thought. However, actually gathering the ingredients and taking the time to prepare and serve the meal is how we gain the experience and give of ourselves. We can talk about praising Jesus, but actually making a sacrifice for him is different, it brings us to a deeper level of understanding through the experience.

So now I look forward to Lent. I no longer give up chewing gum like when I was a kid. Now I want to show God, and myself, that I can make sacrifices in appreciation for all he has given me. I try to spend more time in prayer, indulge less in sweets, and get intentional with giving. Actually, I try to do these things all year long. What makes Lent special is that because the Church has told us all what to do, we are all sacrificing together. I think this brings us closer as a parish, faith community, diocese, as a worldwide church. For these few weeks, many of us are on the same page, giving up a little in appreciation of all we are blessed with. Right now, we are set apart together.




The study will be held in the Parish Hall from 7-8pm on Monday February 27th, March 6th, and March 13th.




